Words From Your Curator – Director

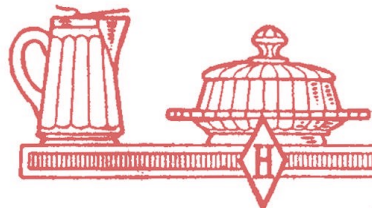
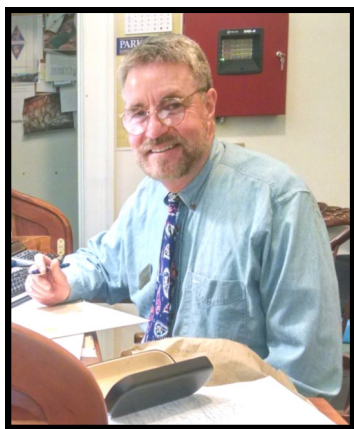



Heisey Museum Sales

Your HCA BOD has approved the 2016 operating Budget, which was submitted in the January Heisey News for your viewing. The budget was prepared by looking at many factors; the previous years budget, the previous years sales, and the current years sales (2015 YTD sales), as well as many other figures and factors. With each special project that we do, Jon (your HCA Treasurer) and I (special projects committee chair) work very closely to come up with figures and estimates on sales and what we can/will sell for the year. Sometimes its a guessing game and other times I can very accurately depict what we will generate. This last sales year for the Museum has been the BEST we have ever seen! Thanks to your support of our special projects at the Museum. Total sales in the Museum shop for 2015 were \$86,000.00, and the #1 seller was Heisey Glass beads, raising over \$43,825.00, all from damaged beyond repair Heisey Glass. Isn't that Great! Crazy and Great... So YES, the Heisey Bead Project has been a great success and thank you to those who have supported, and continue to support this project. (now, it needs to be noted that these are the bead sales #'s, this does not include the fees associated with labor, the silver cores, or any other materials needed for this project).

In the Museum Shop, our Real Heisey section (again all 100% donated from you our members) has sold 1,049 pieces. These pieces resulted in \$13,386.50; this equates to an average of \$12.76 per piece. Considering that the majority of items we sell are items that members donate as a result of downsizing collections, or housekeeping changes, as well as a lot of glass that is donated from extra winnings in auction box lots, that's a pretty reasonable amount. We share this with you so that you can see how important your donations are in helping to raise monies for the Museum as well as helping to inspire new Heisey collectors as they start their wonderful journey with Heisey glass. Total money raised from Heisey Donations (both damaged for beads (\$43,825.00) and real Heisey for the shop (\$13,386.50) is \$57,211.50!!!

In the Museum Shop, we separate the Real Heisey and the Heisey Reproductions that we sell, in order to compare sales. The reproductions are those that have been made in years past; some date back to the late 1970's and some we have made more recently. We sold \$3,958.47, in Heisey glass reproductions. Compared to sales of Real Heisey and Heisey beads, the reproductions seem rather un-comparable:



This article was prepared to show our members, and friends, how important your donations are to Your Museum. We are profiting and earning more money from donated Heisey items (damaged or undamaged) than we ever expected. Please continue to send us your donations of Heisey for the Museum Shop, and the damaged Heisey glass for beads and future projects. If you see Heisey in an antique store or at auction, buy it and donate it to your Museum. We all like to buy a deal, but sometimes don't need the item. Enjoy the deal, enjoy the purchase, and enjoy knowing that by donating you are providing a means to sustain your Museum's legacy.

We have many future projects in which we can use damaged beyond repair Heisey glass, I am most excited about the marbles, and I am enclosing our cocktail shaker graph to show where we are, on the 800 pounds needed to make a full run of marbles. We are also using the donated glass for the NEW front entry doors to the Museum, that member, and professional stained glass artist, Caroline Jenson, is creating. See the January edition of Heisey News, pg. 3, for her article. I made ornaments in December which were cut from broken Heisey stems, and President Roy Eggert made some necklace pendants with the Diamond H cutout, (call the Museum for availability of these items) these items have sold well and are one more way that we are creatively showing that all Heisey glass has importance, even if it has severe damage. Another income and educational benefit that we were able to add to Our Museum was thru selling donated Heisey, and other glass reference books. \$889.00?? was raised from selling donated books (after they were reviewed for additions to the HCA Louise Ream Library). If you have old



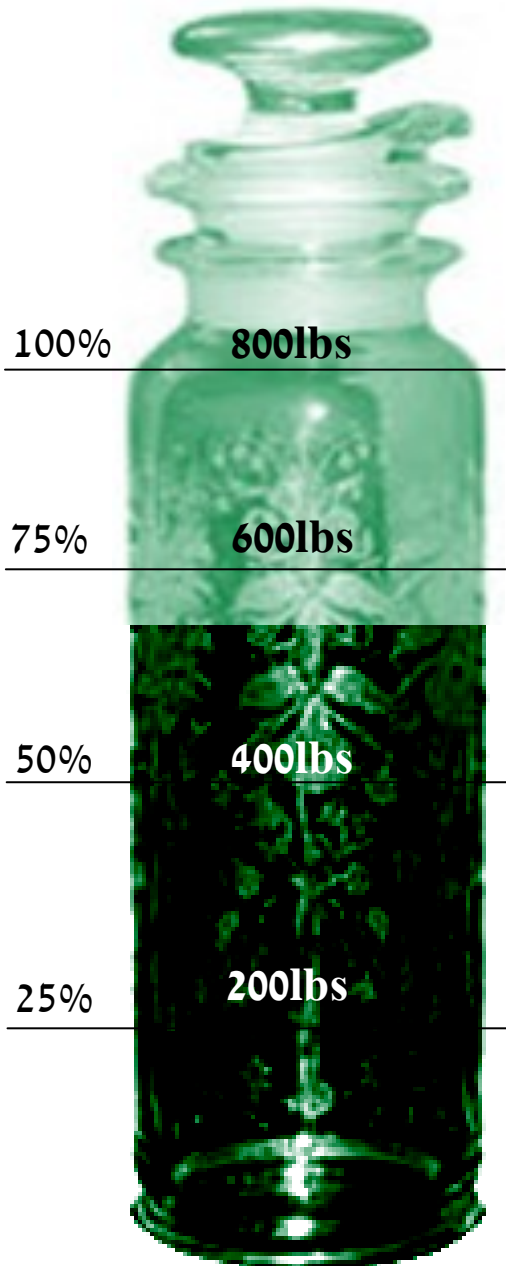
reference books that you no longer use, think of donating these as well.

Our 43th Annual Spring Benefit Auction will be held on **APRIL 15 & 16, 2016**, at the GMP Local #244 Union Hall, located on 350 Hudson Ave. in Newark. We have held it there the last several years and they are great hosts! Check the next page for listings where you can make motel reservations to stay while attending the auction.

The deadline for submitting an article for this newsletter is January 15th. This happens to be our last day for receiving consignments. While we expect some glass at the last minute, we have received quite a bit of glass so far so we have begun our cataloging! Hopefully we will reach the 1,200 to 1,300 lot level. Watch for our March Heisey News for a preview of some of the glass we will be offering!

We hope to finish cataloging in early February and finish entering and proofing the information for the catalog soon thereafter. We will be putting the catalog information on our website in mid-March (our target) since we like to have the catalog for your review in your hands a month ahead of the auction. Also on the website and the printed catalog will be our absentee bid forms and instructions, as well as shipping information. We will be preparing and sending out catalogs to members who consigned glass or purchased glass in the last two years. If you are a member and want a printed catalog but don't fall into either of the aforementioned categories, please contact the museum AFTER March 10th and one will be sent to you.

We will again have absentee bidders make their own arrangements to have their auction glass shipped. As mentioned above, we will provide on line and in the auction catalog a list of vendors (shippers) who will to pick up your glass, pack it, and send it to you. We simply do not have the volunteers, materials on hand, and staffing capability to do this task.

This auction is your association's largest fundraiser. Please plan on attending if you can. If you can't make it, consider bidding absentee for that piece you desire. If you come to the auction and want to help we can use you- we are always looking for volunteers to help at the auction. HCA 2016 BOARD of DIRECTORS ELECTIONS

Hello from your 2016 HCA Nominating Committee
Michael Maher - Chairman, Mary Cameron, Charlene Bowman

The Nominating Committee is a group of HCA members, whose purpose is to seek out new voting members from the Heisey Collectors of America, who are interested in joining the HCA Board of Directors (BOD).

Our BOD is made up of 12 members. Five of those twelve have served on our Executive Committee as President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Immediate Past President. The Executive Committee meets once per month to discuss and oversee the daily operations of the Museum. The HCA BOD meets 4 times per year in coordination with major HCA events: the Spring Benefit Auction; National Convention; Fall Auction OR the Percy and Vivian Moore Weekend; and the Holiday Open House. A term is 4 years. Directors can only serve for two consecutive 4-year terms.

We have three HCA Board Members whose terms end this year: Gordon Cochran of Redmond WA, who is currently completing his first 4 year term; Sid Edwards of Tallahassee AL., who is completing his second consecutive 4 year term; Mary Ann Spahr of Xenia OH., who is completing her first 4 year term.

As the Immediate Past President, I am required to serve as the Nominating Committee Chairman, but I don't do it because I am required to. I do it because I am proud to serve, both on this committee where I can help to find new directors, and also to serve as a director for our National Organization and Museum. Serving on the board over these last six years has taught me a great deal and I have gained tremendous respect for the history of Heisey and for our own Museum legacy.

I know that four years sounds like a large commitment, but ask any Board member, it goes by very fast! Another important thing to bring to your attention is that in our new technological age, board members do NOT have to travel for the meetings. We Skype, Facetime, and use GotoMeeting, so that members may have an opportunity to serve on the BOD without having to travel to Newark, Ohio. So if the idea of traveling to meetings was holding you back from participating on the BOD, you needn't have that worry.

We want to build a great Board comprised of passionate, diverse, and interested HCA members who will bring knowledge and skill in order to operate our Museum and preserve it for future generations. 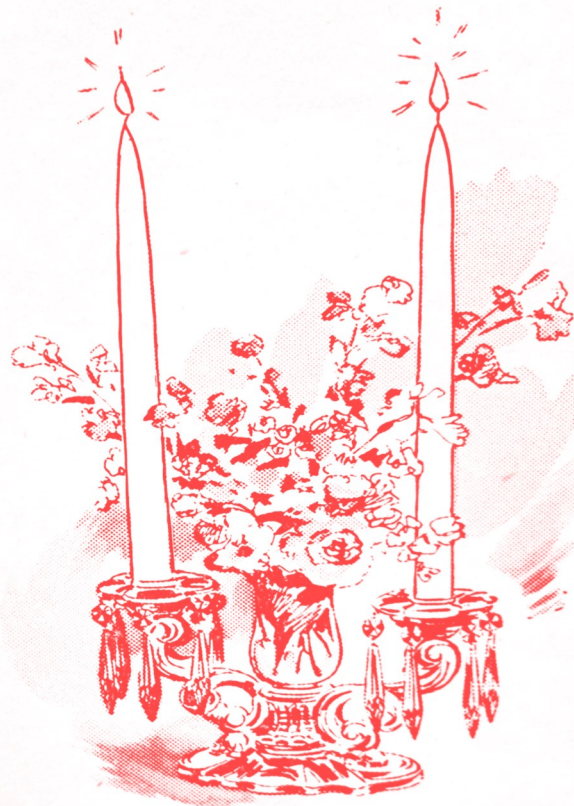

If you are planning an extended trip to Texas for the Moore Weekend this Fall, the Texas Gulf Coast offers a number of interesting possibilities. September is the Hummingbird Festival in Rockport Texas. Thousands of Hummingbirds congregate in the area before migrating south for the winter. The dates this year are September 15-18. Rockport is located North of Corpus Christi along Copano Bay, across from the Aransas Wildlife Refuge, winter home to the Whooping Cranes. Boat tours of the bays and Wildlife Refuge are available from Rockport. Goose Island State Park is also located near Rockport, home to the State Champion Coastal Live Oak, the largest Live Oak in Texas and one of the largest in the Nation.



To the South of Rockport is Padre Island National Seashore, the largest undeveloped barrier island in the world and home to Kemp's Ridley sea turtles and more the 380 species of birds.

You can also visit the famous King Ranch, all 825,000 acres, located approximately 50 miles Southwest of Corpus Christi. Tours are available daily, including the famous King Ranch Saddle Shop.

Finally, Goliad Texas, 80 miles North of Corpus Christi is home to the Presidio La Bahia National Historic Landmark. Built in 1749 to protect Spanish missions in South Texas, it is recognized for its cultural, religious and military significance. The officers' quarters at The Presidio are available for booking. You can spend the night in a restored 1749 Fort.

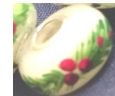
