On Sunday April 30 our Museum was one of five Historic sites to be included on the Licking County Historical Society's Historic Homes Tour. We worked with the Historical Society on this fun and very well attended event, because for the first time in a number of years A.H. Heisey's fantastic Colonial Revival home was open to the public and we felt, as did they, that the finest tableware made in America made the house possible and needed to be showcased as well! In preparing for the tour we looked into our archives and rediscovered many interesting items related to the construction of the house which started in 1909. Whit Tussing, a HCA member and local architectural

historian worked with the current owners, the Historical Society, and us to prepare an introduction lecture. In his research he was able to locate in Cleveland a collection of the original architect's works and there found a full set of the plans for the house. We are working on an exchange of information that will end with us having a very complete set of documentation on our founder's home that I am very excited about.

On pages three and four of this issue are lists that we are both very **Thankful** for and **Excited** about. The very much deserved practice of recognition of monetary donations to both our Museum Operations and the Endowment Fund in the newsletter has been neglected for several years. 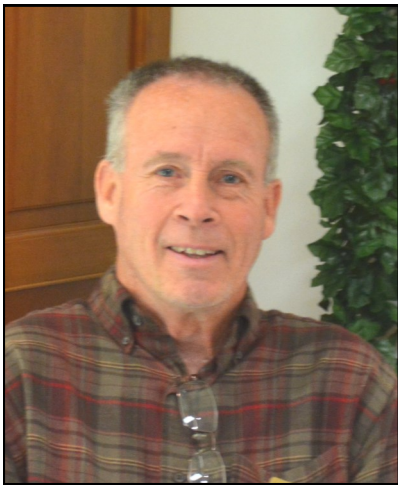
Where did the time go ? As of the 15th of May I will have been part of the Heisey family for four years. Thank-you for allowing me to be here and let's continue to work on a bright future!

# 2017 SPRING ALL HEISEY BENEFIT AUCTION WRAP-UP

## Dave Spahr, Auction Manager

The 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Spring All Heisey Benefit Auction was really a great HCA Event! Our two-day Auction was held again at the GMP Local #244 Union Hall on 350 Hudson Ave. in Newark on Friday-Saturday, March 31-April 1, 2017. Our Auction was well attended with over 80 guests and members each day, and we had 15 absentee bidders. We had 1,411 lots of glass available from 53 consignors. The preview was on Friday from 9:30 AM to 10:30 AM with the Auction starting at 10:30 AM for the first 649 lots. On Saturday, doors opened at 8:30 AM, had our HCA Membership Meeting chaired by President Roy Eggert at 9:00 AM, and we started our Auction at 9:30 AM for lots 650-1,411. We finished around 5:00 PM each day.

How did we do financially? We did well but not as good as last year. One never knows what to expect. We grossed \$57,540 and after consignors and expenses are paid, we will net \$14,604. We had a 2017 budget estimated amount of \$15,200. Last year we grossed \$75,905, netted \$20,455 with our 2016 budget estimate of \$14,500. Main difference between this year and last year was this year that, while we had more lots (1,411 vs 1315), we had more “high end” glass last year for Auction. Our average price per lot this year was \$41.30 while last year it was \$57.39. Because of this, our consignment fees –what goes to HCA - dropped from \$20,066 to 16,647. We had 17 lots of donated glass which brought in \$725 while last year we had 46 lots generating \$3,425-resulting in \$2,700 less than last year. So, although we had a larger Auction, we had not as good glass and less donations. As a result of these factors, our Auction net dropped \$5,851.

I want to publicly thank, on behalf of the HCA Board of Directors and Staff, the fifty five volunteers who worked with us starting in January unpacking, identifying, cataloging, and repacking the glass and then working for three straight days until the auction was concluded. You make this event a success and HCA’s largest fundraiser. I have attempted to list those who helped in a separate block. If you helped and are not listed, I apologize.

I would like to give special thanks: to Walter Ludwig who helped from start to finish lending his time and Heisey expertise whenever asked: Dan Kilgore and his crew who ran the holdback area-a most difficult job: and to long time clerk Karen Taylo who ran the office and Auction software program; and lastly to the Dayton and Buckeye Study Club members who worked tirelessly from January to April to make this a success. We would not have an Auction without their help.

A “THANK YOU” must also go to Craig Connelly, Auctioneer and his cohorts. They sold our glass and kept us in stitches! GMP Local #244’s own Jimmy Gill did everything he could to provide us great facilities.

Finally, I would like to thank all the consignors who consigned and donated glass to HCA and to all the Auction attendees and absentee bidders who purchased that wonderful Heisey Glass. Hope to see all of you at the Convention in June. Happy Heisey Hunting!!

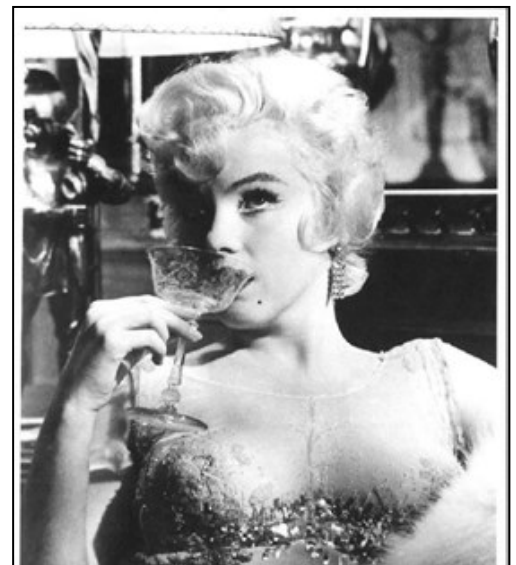

The minimum opening bid will be \$15.00. As mentioned earlier, **we will not select damaged glass**.

# What Goes With Plaid?

Plaid, the age-old conundrum. Put on a piece of it, and now what? The opportunities for unfortunate fashion choices abound. Plaid vases have stymied collectors in much the same way. You can find various numbers attached to the Plaid vases. Is it #2? How about #4 or #7? Maybe it's #14? No one seems to agree. What goes with Plaid?

The key to solving the Plaid riddle is to realize that Heisey used at least two different kinds of numbers. Not only were there pattern numbers, but sometimes a second number was assigned to a piece. In some cases, this number indicated shape. Think of the early salt shakers or bon bon trays, where a single pattern might have three or four different forms. In other cases, the second number told us something about the size. This was used mainly in the swung vases.

Swung vases varied in the diameter of the foot as well as height. The combination of the foot diameter and the height of the finished vase was assigned a size number, separate from the pattern number. Size numbers were not consistent among different patterns.

The Plaid pattern is one of those rare cases where Heisey didn't assign a pattern number at all. That's why there is no consistent number for Plaid. They used only the size number, ranging from 1 to 20. According to price lists, there were three base sizes, 5½", 6", and 6½", in heights from 12-60", although some have been seen even taller. Heights between 15 and 45" came in two or three base sizes, so you need to specify both height and base size to be sure of what you have.

Sometimes, one finds Plaid vases that have not been swung. They were called English

flower vases. These are the ones from which the swung chrysanthemum vases were made. They had no pattern number, either. In addition to the three base sizes already mentioned (heights of 6", 7", and 8" respectively and assigned numbers 1-3), there was an English flower vase with an 8" base, 9" tall, No. 4. Possibly the No. 4 English vase was used for swung vases, too, but they are not mentioned in the price lists.

As for pattern numbers, now you know what goes with Plaid. Nothing. Just a size number. Not unlike those plaid pants you're so proud of.

*What number did Heisey put on the Plaid vase you have? Sometime when there's more space, I'll discuss numbers for all the swung vase patterns. If you just can't wait, you can always write me at [heiseyglass@gmail.com](mailto:heiseyglass@gmail.com).*

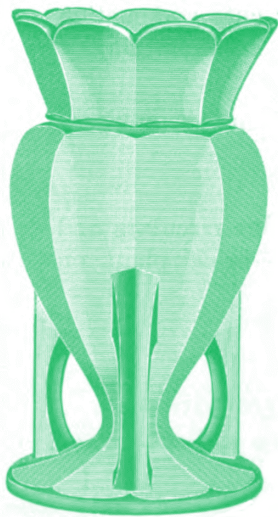
