Through the Glass Looking: Heisey's Adventures in Optics Wonderland, Part Seven

From their introduction in about 1906 up through 1941, optics continued to develop at A.H. Heisey & Co. For obvious reasons, innovation nearly ceased for the next several years. The war interrupted everything. With so much effort aimed toward defeating the Axis, there was little time, material, or desire to think about new lines of glassware.

After the war, one might think there was a lot of pent-up demand, all those new households springing up everywhere. But tastes had changed. Formal was out; casual was in. Heisey's business had been built on the fashionable table setting. The post-war family didn't see the need for all of that fuss. What was a glass company to do?

Rare post-war optics

One answer was to develop new looks in fewer, simpler pieces. Unfortunately for Heisey, many did not meet with commercial success. There are a number of patterns and decorations that were produced in such small numbers that we can't even be sure whether they were experiments or just failed attempts at grabbing the commercial market. The examples discussed in this installment range from rare to extremely rare. All the optics are blown ones; Heisey had nearly abandoned doing any new pressed optic designs.

In 1949, Heisey took a new approach to an old trick. We've already seen how, in the 1920's and 30's, they tried many spiral optics. How about twisting the stem, too? Twisted stems weren't a new idea, but putting the two together was. That is just what they did with #5071 Fort Hayes. Some examples have an internal spiral optic, just like what we've seen in earlier pieces (fig. 1). This gives the effect of the externally spiraled stem continuing up into the bowl, although it is an illusion. Other Fort Hayes examples have no optic. One Heisey price list mentions a Fort Hayes double martini in "S/O", which

normally means Saturn Optic. In this case, however, it probably meant Spiral Optic.

Strictly speaking, Fort Hayes doesn't represent a new optic, but they used an old one in a clever way.

Heisey did, however, create genuine new optics after the war. One timid attempt, probably dating from about 1950, was an 18-panel blown optic, what we might call **blown Narrow Optic** (not to be confused with the pressed Narrow Optic from 50 years earlier). This is the exception I mentioned way back in Part Two of this series. As you may recall from then, nearly all blown panel optics made by Heisey had either 10 panels (Wide) or 14

panels (Medium). The 18-panel blown optic was used on #5080 California goblets (fig. 2). The optic is so subtle that it can easily be missed. It certainly proved nearly impossible for me to photograph. But trust me, it's there, and if you squint just so you may be able to make out its faint outlines (fig. 3).

The California goblet is poorly documented and only one set has ever been discovered. All eight of them had a cutting which is undocumented but looks likely to be from the Heisey factory. Whether the goblet, the cutting, or the optic ever went into true production is hard to know. The 18-panel blown narrow optic may have been unique to this pattern. But it might be worth looking over contemporaries such as #5078 Park Avenue, #5079 Pan American, #5082 Mid-Century, #5083 El Rancho, or some of the cocktails and blown barware from the late 1940's and 1950's.

For a more striking optic, we turn to a stem which is well known, but not with this optic and not in this color. The museum owns a #5082 Mid-Century goblet with a Sultana bowl (fig. 4). That's not a color you are going to find every day, and certainly not on Mid-Century. The optic is blown and internal, so nothing unusual there. But the appearance is another matter, an odd Saturn-like optic. The rings are off-kilter and irregular, and even a little bit frayed at the edges. They are spaced more closely, so there are about twice as many as you would expect with regular Saturn optic. The spacing is uneven. Heisey was probably trying for another informal look. In comparison with the Saturn optic, this optic looks disheveled and disorganized. It certainly isn't Saturn—or even Neptune or Uranus. More like Asteroid Belt. Given the color and the pattern, this optic was probably made somewhere around 1951 or 1952.

Another stem which is uncommon in any form occurs either plain or with an optic so subtle as to go almost unnoticed. The stem is #5092 Empress Lily (fig. 5). For a while it was known only by its HCA number, 8028. A factory photograph and a list of items with a cutting document the original pattern number.

All crystal examples of Empress Lily I have seen have a plain bowl, no optic. Now recall that Heisey brought back their turquoise color in the 1950's, calling it Limelight. Using Empress Lily for yet more experiments, they made goblets not only with Limelight bowls and crystal stems, but in the reverse, with crystal bowls and Limelight stems. (We can say this is Limelight and not Zircon since the pattern number puts this goblet squarely in the 1950's.)

Some Empress Lily with Limelight bowls were made with Saturn Optic. That's just what you might expect, given that optic's affinity for the turquoise color. But other Empress Lily goblets (Limelight on either bowls or stems) have a subtle, four-sided internal blown optic. The same optic was used on an extremely rare example with a milk-glass stem.

The four lobes of the optic are probably intended to echo the four-sided floral motif of

the stem. The optic reminds me of four large petals cupped on the inside of the bowl. Since this optic has only been seen on Empress Lily, it makes some sense to call this the **Lily Optic** (fig. 6). But only some sense. Four petals aren't appropriate for lilies which are three-parted flowers, but that won't be the only time botanically challenged names have been used for Heisey. Don't get me started.

Empress Lily was made in at least six sizes, including two heights of goblet. The crystal one in the photograph is the low goblet. The Limelight examples I have seen have the same size bowls but are on taller, thinner stems, whether the color was in the bowl or in the stem. All-crystal tall goblets are possible, of course, but I haven't seen them.

Given that Heisey chemist Emmet Olson experimented with white glass formulas in late 1954, when Limelight was also in production, and that this goblet has been seen with a milk-glass stem, I date the Lily Optic to about the same time.

The 1950's saw rare optics on rare pieces. The factory closed in 1957. Can there have been any more optics before that fateful time? Of course, there can. Stay tuned for one final installment in the story of Heisey's half-century-long affair with optics.

Only one more installment to go in the optics series. Soon it will be time to write about other Heisey topics. This whole optic thing started because a reader asked about it. Have a topic you would like to see covered? I can't make guarantees, but you know where to send ideas, don't you? Let me see your name show up in the heiseyglass@gmail.com inbox.

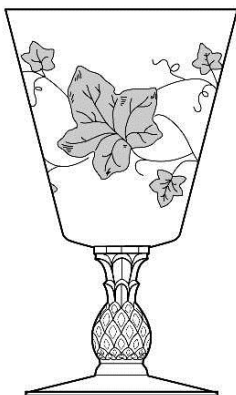

Great Plains Heisey Club News

A lovely May day in Omaha was the scene for our Great Plains Heisey Club meeting at the beautiful home of Marcie and Eric Bergquist. We started with a delicious meal after which President Mock called our meeting to order and thanked our hosts. There were 28 members and 4 guests present.

We thanked Mary and Gregg Cameron and Bev and Bob Heise for their work at the HCA Museum Library in April. Many of our GPHC members also volunteered at the HCA Spring Auction. Gregg Cameron gave a report on HCA Board activities and we thanked Gregg for his recent website work. Minutes of our previous meeting were approved and the Treasurer's report was given. We hope to make a nice donation at the HCA convention in June.

Our club will represent HCA at the National Depression Glass Convention in Wellington, KS in July so we will make that the venue for our next meeting. Ande and Greg Henne will serve as our hosts. Part of the meeting will include discussing our Heisey finds en route or at the NDGA show.

Trudy aka “Martha” presented a “moment” emphasizing the importance of carefully wrapping and carrying our Heisey purchases to prevent accidents. She told of making a great buy and then having the contents crash on the pavement when the plastic sack slipped from her grip as she exited the store. She demonstrated the sickening sound made when glass meets a solid surface. A sad story but a good reminder.



Tom Files presented a program on table size creams and sugars or the “big guys” as he called them. He started with all the various forms of creams or sugars produced by Heisey and then discussed many of the table size ones on display – patterns from the beginning of production to ones still around when they were phased out in the early 1930s. His handout also included a useful field reference by pattern.



Some members had made great purchases at the HCA Spring Auction and other sources so we had a table full of Heisey to show and tell. Some of the items: Empress oval footed comport with elaborate cutting, Empress ice bucket with Tally Ho etching, Yeoman puff box with insert, Plantation cordial, Marshall decanter with Orchid etching, Old Williamsburg footed comport, Half Circle cream & sugar/Moongleam, Navy soda/Cobalt base with two etchings—Short Sailboat & Motor Boat variant, Old Sandwich catsup with stopper, Carcassonne footed ice tea with Houston Post etching, Cut Block/Custard individual cream souvenir of Butte, MT, Puntty Band pickle dish, Fancy Loop cracker jar, Koors jug, and Queen Ann salad dressing bowl with Minuet etching.
