Looking forward to reviewing your survey input and enjoying Convention and show time with you !

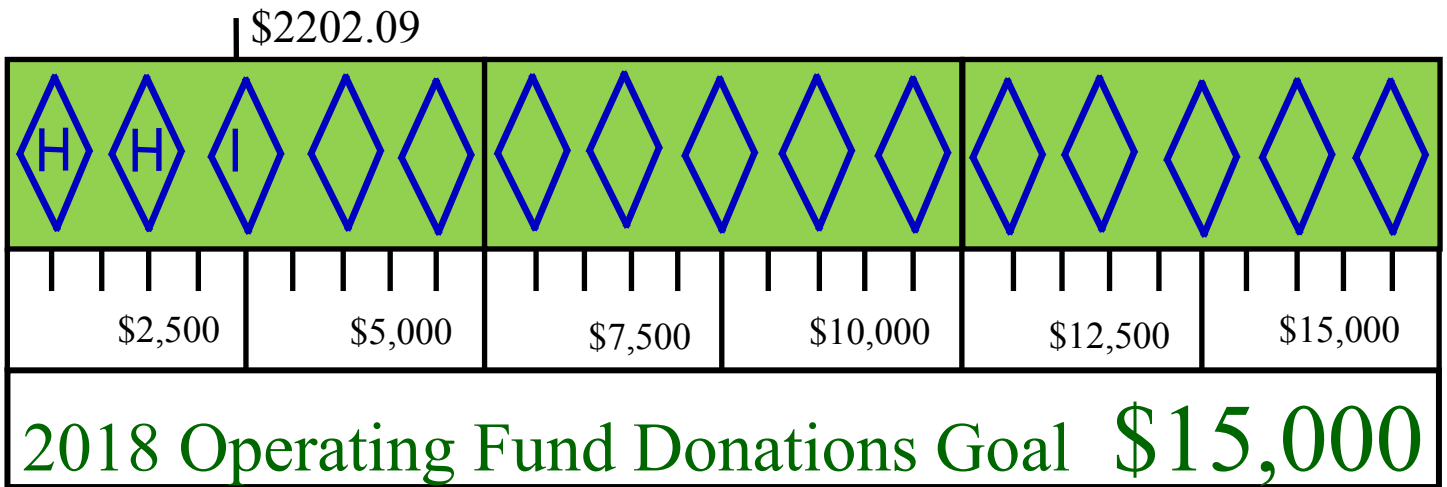

2018 Spring Auction Wrap Up

The 45th Annual Spring All Heisey Benefit Auction was a wonderful HCA Event! Our two-day auction was held again at the GMP Local #244 Union Hall on 350 Hudson Ave in Newark on Friday-Saturday, April 13 - 14, 2018. Our auction was well attended with over 95 guests and members each day and we had 15 absentee bidders. We had 1,398 lots of glass from 41 consignors. We had the preview on Friday from 9:30 AM to 10:30 AM with the auction starting at 10:30 AM for the first 649 lots. On Saturday, doors opened at 8:30 AM, we had our HCA Membership Meeting chaired by President Roy Eggert at 9:00 AM, and we started our auction at 9:30 AM for lots 650-1,394.

How did we do financially? We grossed \$80,361.88 (glass sales and buyer's premium) and after consignors and expenses are paid, we will net around \$19,000. We had a 2018 budgeted amount of \$15,300. Our average price per lot this year was \$57.44, an improvement over last year's average of \$41.30. We had 32 lots of donated glass which brought \$2,690, while last year we had 17 lots generating \$725 – resulting in \$1,965 more than last year.

On behalf of the HCA Board of Directors and Staff, I would like to thank all the volunteers who worked, starting in January, unpacking, identifying, cataloging, and repacking the glass and then working for three straight days until the auction was concluded. You make this event a success and HCA's largest fundraiser.

Special thanks to Walter Ludwig who graciously lent his time and Heisey expertise whenever asked; Dan Kilgore and his crew who ran the holdback area – a most difficult job; and to Roy Eggert, who helps with clerking duties; and lastly to the Dayton and Buckeye Study Club members who worked tirelessly from January to April to make the auction a success.

A big thank you goes to Craig Connelly, Auctioneer and his cohorts. They not only sell the glass, they keep us in stitches while doing so! Plus, without Kevin Burchett stepping up to the plate as our Auction Firm Manager, we might not have had our auction at all. GMP Local #244's own Jimmy Gill worked to assure the hall was in tip-top shape all three days.

Also, thank you to all the consignors who consigned and donated glass to HCA and to all the auction attendees and absentee bidders who purchased that wonderful Heisey Glass.

Finally, we all felt Dave Spahr's absence but we know he was there in spirit and would have been so pleased with our auction results.... a fitting tribute to his years of hard (and loving) work for HCA.

Hope to see all of you at the Convention in June.

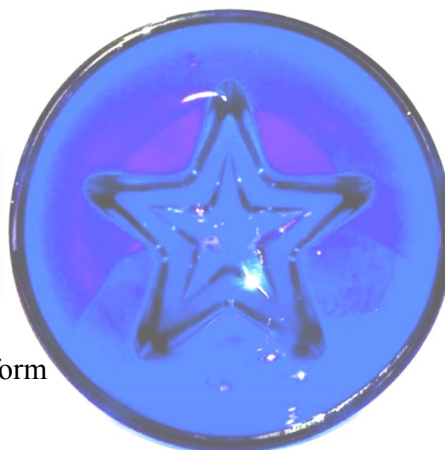

TREASURER'S REPORT

Karen Taylo

The first quarter is in the books. I've included the Budget VS Actual report, as of March 31, 2018, for your review (pg. 21). What we would really like to see are positive variances under Revenues and negative variances under Expenditures. Or, an easier way, look at the % YTD vs Total Budget column. We'd like to see 25% or more as the Total Income percentage and 25% or less as the Total Expenditures percentage.

Revenues did not meet budget mainly due to slow sales in the first quarter. You might question why the Cash Donations total is different from the amount reported in the Monthly Money Watch. The total includes donations earmarked for a specific project so I am deducting those funds from the total I report each month.

We hit the mark on Expenditures, coming in about \$2600 under budget for the first quarter. And, this was even with our choosing to pay the Museum insurance in a lump sum in January in order to take advantage of a "Pay in Full" discount.

We had a very successful Spring Benefit Auction on April 13th and 14th and brisk sales at the Museum over the weekend, thanks to members and visitors (there was a car club in town and many of their members took the opportunity to visit us). I'm hoping to report more positive numbers next month!!!

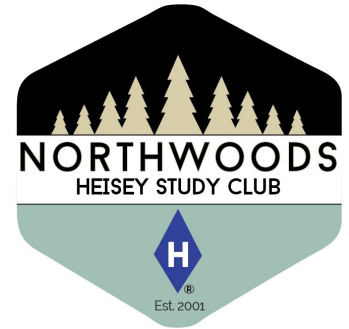

Percy and Vivian Moore Weekend will highlight stories of our love affair with Heisey glass



Up North in Minnesota and Wisconsin we have developed storytelling to a fine art. We sit around campfires in the great north woods or our own backyards. And when the snow falls and the wind blows, we sit around our fireplaces and recall exciting events in glorious detail. Sometimes we embellish the details a bit, but there is always a kernel of truth in them.

For those of us who are lovers of Heisey glass, those stories often center on Heisey glass....how we discovered it, the great piece we found at a bargain price in a dusty thrift shop, the rare piece found in Great Aunt Grace's attic.

The program was Heisey 101 Colors. Members brought a representative sample of items in all the colors produced by Heisey from crystal to limelight. Several things stood out in the display/presentation. There were different shades of Moongleam and Hawthorne shown that could not be attributed to the thickness of the glass. The difference in rose and flamingo appears to be very slight. There was a rose colored Colonial goblet. We had a canary Phyllis sugar and a Yeoman item. A piece of emerald thought to be a Fancy Loop variant turned out not to be Heisey. A Twist marigold goblet that fluoresced red and one that fluoresced yellow.

Heisey 101 will continue in May 12th with a program entitled "Hide and Seek – Is It Marked - Finding the Heisey Mark".

The mystery gift was won by Chris, a pair of Narrow Flute relishes with an amber stain done by Royal Decorating Co. and sold by them as the Cathedral line.
