FROM HCA BOARD MINUTES:

June 19, 1982

Dick Marsh moved the Treasurer be charged with the responsibility of establishing a fund separate from current accounts with one of the depositories in Newark, a fund to which deposits can be made for the establishment of an Endowment Fund and Estate Planning when it does become a reality. If such funds become of a high dollar value, he be empowered to purchase Treasury notes that will give a higher interest yield. Seconded by Tom Bredehoft.

Chris Maskaleris reported that her club is giving \$500.00 to establish such a fund.

Frank Frye moved to amend the motion—if no action is taken in 12 months to establish the Endowment Fund, the monies shall be returned to sender. Passed. Main motion passed.

September 11, 1982

President Robert McClain called the meeting to order. Frank Frye, member of the Endowment and Trust Fund Committee, introduced Mr. Stu Parsons to discuss the Endowment Fund. Mr. Parsons is a representative of Park National Bank. He also answered questions with regard to use and operation of the Fund. Minimum Fund charge of \$350.00 per year.

We can structure the Fund so that no principal may be removed or otherwise, no restrictions on money source. Percy Moore motioned to proceed with the Endowment Fund. Tom Bredehoft seconded. Jack Metcalf moved to amend the motion so that proceeds for this fund be set up such that principal may not be removed. O'Dell Johnson seconded the amendment. Passed . Main Motion passed.

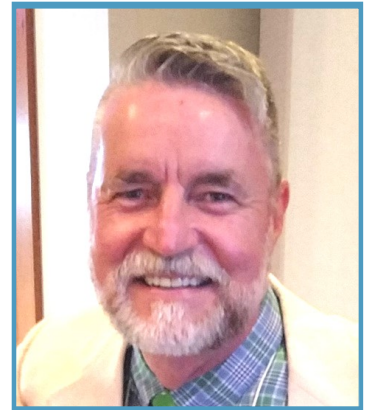

TREASURER'S REPORT

This month I am sharing with you the July Budget vs Actuals table. It can also be found under "Member Info" at the bottom of the Heisey Museum homepage.

Revenues are about what was budgeted through July, even with the loss of the \$10,000 due to no Convention. The two categories contributing the most to cover the Convention fund shortfall are Cash Donations and Sales. They are both over the budgeted amounts by \$4,810 and \$2,300 respectively.

Expenditures are \$3,730 over budget through July. The expense category contributing the most to this overage is Special Projects. It is over the budgeted amount for the month by \$6,656. This category reflects the production costs of Sparky, Christmas ornaments, Pumpkins, and other artisan projects for the gift shop.

Salary expenditures remain under the budgeted amount largely due to the reduced staffing during the first part of this year.

Our **cash position** remains good, and I would encourage everyone to continue supporting HCA through donations, purchases, and participation in the events coming up this fall.

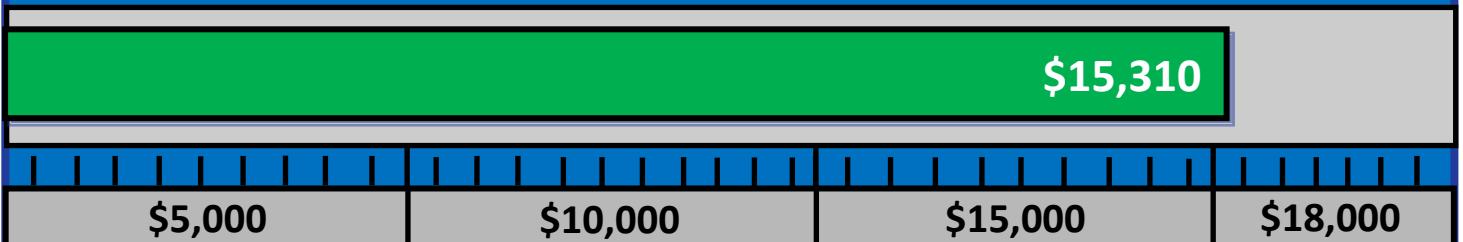

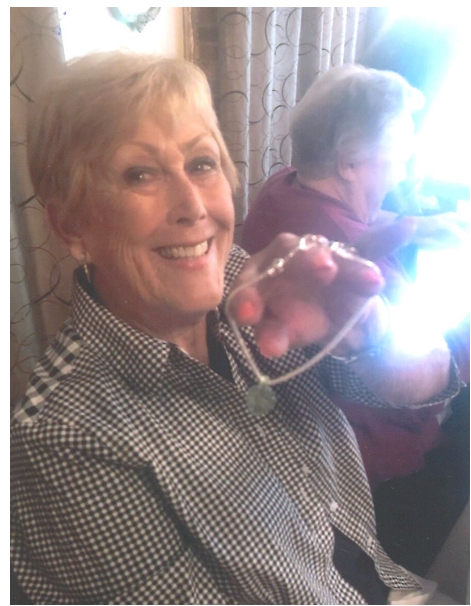

HIGHLIGHTS of the **All-HEISEY 2021** **Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction**

You should have received or will shortly receive your catalog of the 2021 Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction. The catalog is not included in this Heisey News as we have done before for the Fall Auction. Instead it is going out as a separate mailing in a way similar to the Spring Auction.

Because we did not have an auction last year, this one is jam-packed with rarities and seldom seen items. The auction represents the full range of production of the Heisey Glass Company from their beginnings until the doors closed in 1957. There is something for everyone in this auction from the standard production to true rarities that you are almost never given a chance to purchase.

Let us first look at some of the items from early patterns. In 1280 Wing Scroll there is a full table set in Custard with the best gold décor I have ever seen (Lot 24) as well as a Custard cologne (117). Lot 26 is an Emerald 1255 Pineapple and

Fan 5" rose bowl (great color). There are cake salvers in 305 Punty and Diamond Point (32), 365 Old Queen Anne (41) and 343 Sunburst (50), as well as a 1201 Fandango cake basket (40). Lots 46-48 offer several 433 Greek Key sodas and Lot 55 is the hard to find 804 cracker/candy jar. The 150 Banded Flute #2 bedroom set is Lot 54. There are rare oils in 1776 Kalonyal (77), 1200 Cut Block (78), and 379 Urn (79).

Probably the greatest strength in this auction is barware. Among the many bars we have 5044

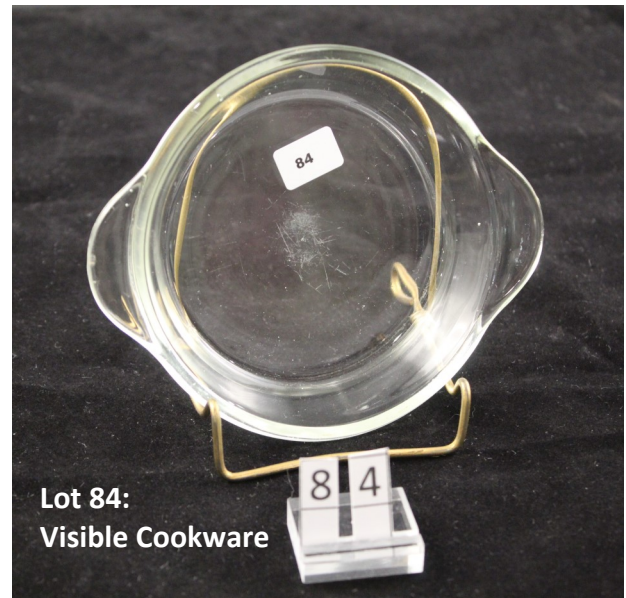

Constellation (58) and 5087 Comet (59). We have both sizes of 5058 Penguin decanters (173 and 174), a 5058 Goose decanter (177) and four wines (178). The deep plate etches are well represented with multiple lots of 462 Fox Chase including a Cobalt handled 4163 Whaley mug (265), 4163 Whaley pretzel jar (278), and 4033 Maloney bar bottle (282). Other deep plate etched pieces include 4163 Whaley tankard with 459 Fisherman (332) and 2401 Oakwood soda with 469 Mermaid (334).

In the candlestick category we have a pair of 110 Sandwich Dolphin in Cobalt (218), 1405 Ipswich candle vases in Cobalt (219), 1614 Plume (222), and 27 Daisy 7" (232). In addition there are a pair of 7143 shelf supports (square base and top) (226). Of special note are three sets of hurricanes: Lot 106 is a pair of 301 Old Williamsburg elaborately cut both on shades and bases, Lot 295 is a pair of 1503 Crystolite with 462 Fox Chase etch, and Lots 341 and 342 are 6 Domesticator hurricanes with wooden bases (I had never seen these before; they will be sold as two separate lots).

Animals and figurines are well represented with 1601 Sleeping Fox ashtray (92), 1 Mother Rabbit (96), 1 Airedale (100), 5 Show Horse (101), and 2 Madonna (103). Lots 135-141 are a nice group of demitasse sets in various patterns and Lots 145-152 present a great group of tumblers including 212 Chevron, 435 Juniper, 8003 Thistle, and 129 Diamond Cane. Other examples of nice pieces with cuttings include a set of three 6060 Country Club old fashions (89), with 926 George VI cutting there is a 5013 Shasta cordial (113) and 1511 Toujours floral bowl (321). Of special merit is Lot 201 with a pair of 22 Windsor candlestick and a 341 Puritan candy jar all with matching cuttings. Special pieces with 507 Orchid etching include a 1540 Lariat basket (287), 1519 Waverly epergnette (289), and a set of four 3304 Universal icers (294). Lots 185-196 include a variety of stemware including a 1306 Comet Leaf goblet in Sahara and 8026 Knob 'n Navel goblet.

Good color items include 4057 Schnaidt water bottle in Flamingo (12), 10 muddler in Cobalt (71), 312 Visible cookware shirred egg in Vaseline (84), 1231 Ribbed Octagon rum pot in Sahara (142), and 1420 Tulip vase in Cobalt (164). Interesting pieces in

Dawn include the 1503 Crystolite flared floral bowl (310) and 1486 Coleport soda with cutting (311). There is a nice selection in Zircon/Limelight including the 1519 Waverly footed pickle/olive (307). Two pieces of Turquoise Verlys include the V-8636 Thistle bowl (308) and V-960A Rose bowl with lid (309).

A LOOK BACK AT HEISEY HISTORY

HEISEY COCKTAIL SHAKER PAMPHLET

By Walter Ludwig (reprinted from the September 2010 Heisey News)

Perhaps you all remember the series of Heisey News cover stories I did featuring various promotional pamphlets that the company put out from the 1920s into the 1950s. These were meant to allow the shopper to see in printed form the items that the company produced. Each featured a different pattern or type of item and the shopper could take the pamphlet home to think about whether she wanted to purchase items in the pattern.

During the Convention of 2010 Lynn Welker asked me if the Museum would be interested in a little pamphlet that he had run across in his travels. When I saw what he was offering, I did not hesitate to say that the Museum absolutely wanted what he had found.

What he had was a small 3" by 3½" single fold pamphlet extolling the usefulness of the Heisey cocktail shaker. It was done in three colors of teal, gray, and pink featuring drawings probably from the late 40s or early 50s.

The front cover features the slogan, "They'll toast the thoughtful Host" in a black balloon on a diagonally striped pattern of grey, pink, grey, and teal. In the foreground is a close-up of a woman's hand toasting with a champagne glass, while in the background is the woman in an elegant gown mimicking the same gesture.

Inside there is a caricature of a host (or possibly barman) pouring cocktails from a Heisey cocktail shaker. The heading reads, "They'll vow eternal friendship..." The following text reads, "... to the host who can serve a cocktail that will always be a happy memory. A cocktail served from a Heisey glass cocktail shaker is a colorful, eye-filling experience. The shy blush of a Pink Lady, the enchanting promise of a Side Car, excites your guests with anticipation. And whether you're the wildest madcap mixer or whether you pride yourself on being a perfectionist that measures accurately, chills correctly, shakes properly (shake hard and long; the stopper won't leak), you'll treasure our Heisey Cocktail. For..." The text is then continued in a larger black balloon, "No cocktail can surpass the flavor of one you make in GLASS."

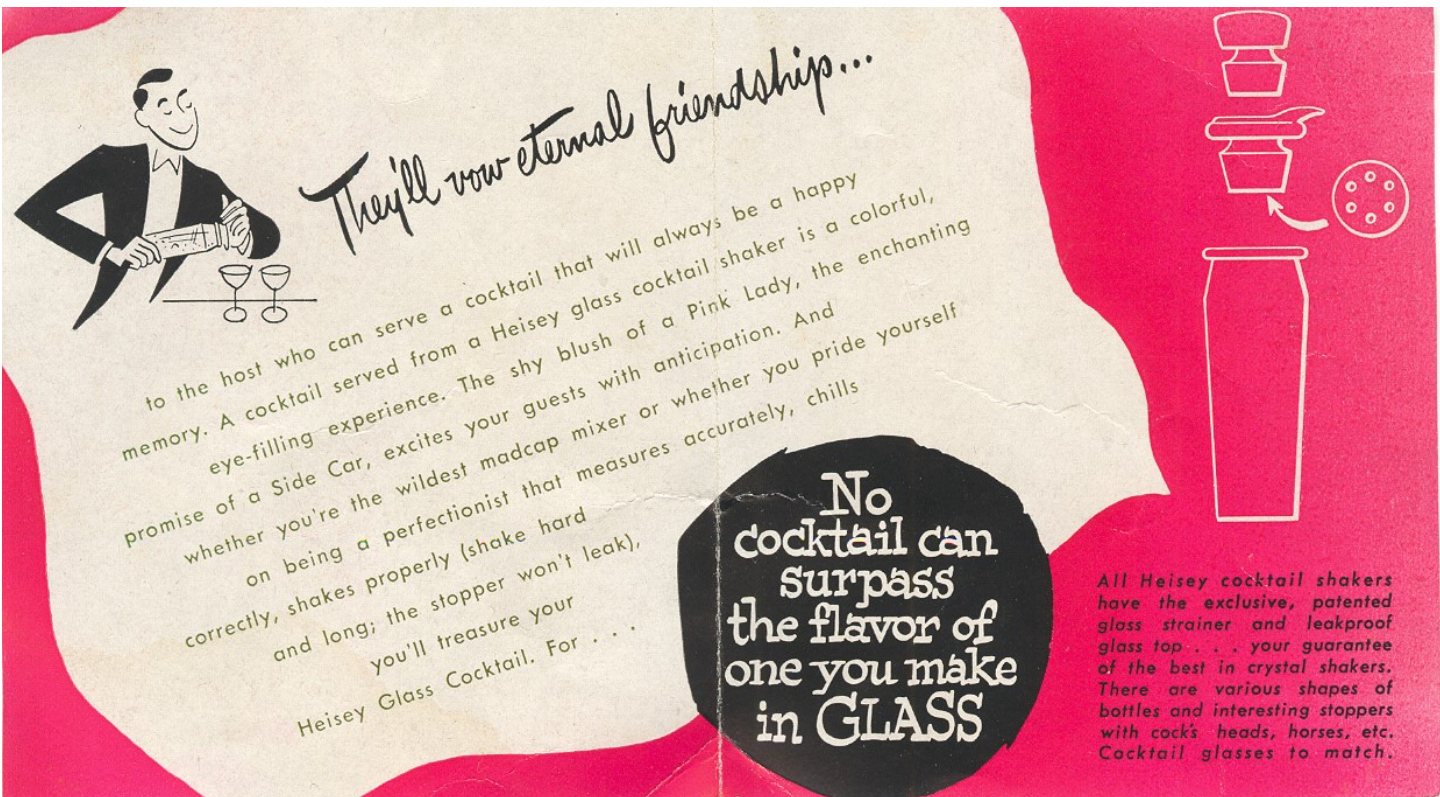
On the right side of the inside of the brochure is a detailed illustration of the Heisey one pint 4225 Cobel cocktail shaker. I say that it is the one pint because of the tapered sides of the shaker which are indicative of the smaller size. The one and two quart sizes have straight sides. The illustration shows the separate stopper and strainer as well as giving a view of the underside of the strainer. The accompanying text reads, "All Heisey cocktail shakers have the exclusive, patented glass strainer and leak-proof glass top ... your guarantee of the best in crystal shakers. There are various shapes of bottles and interesting stoppers with cock's heads, horses, etc. Cocktail glasses to match."

The back cover is rather unembellished with a single black oval saying, "The finest in glassware, made in America by hand." This is accompanied by a small Heisey label in red.

These pamphlets would have been used with either the 4225 Cobel shakers or the 4036 Marshall shakers, both of which used the three piece construction mentioned in the pamphlet.

These were big sellers for Heisey and Heisey featured them with many different etchings and cuttings throughout this period. These were a winner and Heisey wanted to get the word out and sell even more. They fit in well with the postwar sophistication that was being shown in movies of the era. Marilyn Monroe in *Gentlemen Prefer Blondes* can certainly be pictured drinking her cocktail poured from a Heisey cocktail shaker into a Heisey cocktail glass.

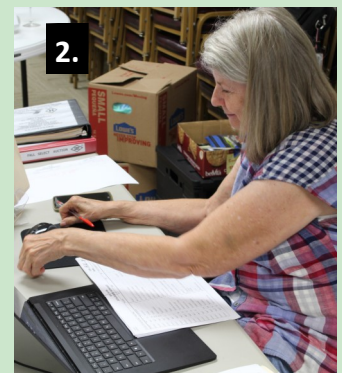
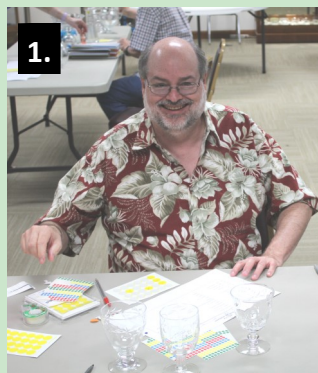
