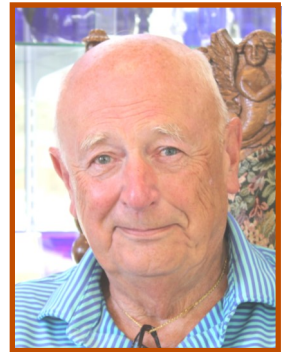
Getting Ready for the Fall Auction!

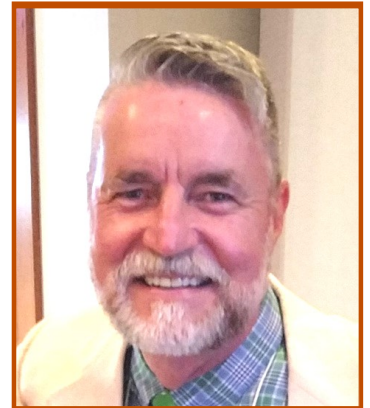

TREASURER'S REPORT

This month I am sharing with you information about the *AmazonSmile* program.

Did you know that shopping from Amazon can help support the HCA? The National Heisey Glass Museum is a registered charity with the *AmazonSmile Foundation*, and it will donate to HCA 0.5% of the purchase price from eligible items.

We have been enrolled in this program for many years, but in 2021 something exciting is happening. The quarterly amounts have more than doubled from any previous year. Through the third quarter of 2021, we have received \$161 through the *AmazonSmile* program. This upturn could be attributed to more people becoming aware of the program, those that have participated are buying more, or a combination of both. If you contributed to this growth, Thank You!

You don't need to be an HCA member to participate in this program. It is open to anyone with an Amazon account. Just think, if we could increase the number of people buying through the *AmazonSmile* portal by 500 and each one



purchased \$200 worth of eligible items, that would produce an additional \$500 donation from the *AmazonSmile* Foundation to the HCA. I think we can do this. If you are not currently buying through the *AmazonSmile* portal, I encourage you to join and talk with family and friends about this way of contributing to the HCA. This does not add any additional cost to your purchases.

Here is how it works.

It's simple and automatic. You use the same account on Amazon.com and *AmazonSmile*. You use the same username and password. Your Shopping Cart, Wish List, Wedding or Baby Registry, and other account settings are also the same.

Sign into Amazon from Smile.Amazon.com instead of the usual Amazon.com site. The first time you visit, select Heisey Collectors of America, Inc. to receive donations from your eligible purchases before you begin shopping. *AmazonSmile* will remember you support HCA and every eligible purchase you make through Smile.Amazon.com will result in a donation. It's another great way for us to support HCA. You can always change charities later if you want.

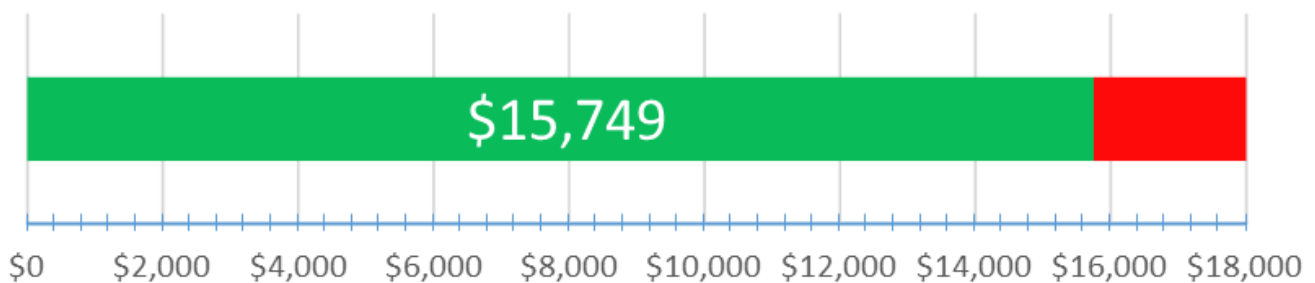

Auction highlights Northwoods return to in-person meetings

An Ipswich floral bowl, a charming Inside Scallop cucumber dish in Flamingo, a pair of Rose champagne saucers, Coronation sodas with the elegant Moonglo cutting, a Fancy Loop spoon tray, a Crystolite two-part relish, a spectacular Plantation punch bowl with underplate and many more. This sampling of items demonstrates the wide variety of glass that members of the Northwoods Heisey Study Club (Minnesota, Wisconsin) donated from their collections for the mini-auction and raffle held in August to support the National Heisey Glass Museum.

This event, always a highlight of the year, raised \$960. It brought added excitement to the club's first in-person meeting since the beginning of the pandemic. Everyone agreed that while video conferencing was a great tool for meetings, it was more fun to see each other in person and to be able to hold and examine the beautiful auction glass and Show and Tell items.

Another highlight of the meeting was celebrating the upcoming 101st birthday of Virginia Johnson, a founding member of the club. Hosts Bev and Bob Heisey served a beautifully decorated flourless chocolate torte in Virginia's honor.

And yet another highlight was meeting new club member Phyllis Warner, who became enthusiastic about Heisey glass after accompanying Doug and Mary Olson to Newark in April to help sort and pack glass from the Spring Benefit Auction.

As part of the business meeting, the club agreed to contribute an item for the auction that will be part of the Oct. 15 Percy and Vivian Moore Dinner fundraiser for HCA. The contribution will be a "basket" of Northwoods food items, including wine, wild rice, honey, maple syrup, and candy bars from the Pearson Candy Company – makers of Minnesota's ever-popular Nut Goodie for over 100 years. Bev and Bob agreed to donate a large Heisey bowl to serve as the basket.

If Covid permits, the club will meet in-person again in October and for a Christmas party in early December.

Following the business meeting, members shared recent acquisitions and favorite pieces:

Bob Heisey shared a #6060 Country Club double old fashion with #517 Winchester etching, made between 1950 and 1957. He believes the etching is named after the movie *Winchester '73*, a smash hit that revived Jimmy Stewart's career after World War II.

Bev Heisey showed her #4044 New Era rye bottle with #825 Sea Glade cutting that she added to her growing collection of items with Sea Glade.

The Olsons shared:

#3389 Duquesne wine with #913 cutting. This pattern was made between 1926 and 1942.

#150 Pointed Oval in Diamond Point half-gallon jug in Emerald, made as early as 1898.

#3380 Old Dominion soda in Marigold, made between 1925 and 1935, with #447 Empress etch.

Marv Christenson showed an attractive, small bowl he had purchased recently in Grand Rapids, MN, a small resort-area town on the Mississippi River. It bowl has a trademark that looks similar to Heisey's Diamond H, but the diamond is somewhat square and the H is quite large in relation to the diamond. He was surprised to open *Heisey Glass Volume I* by Clarence Vogel at random and find a photo of this very bowl. Vogel quotes from *Newscaster*, 1978, which describes this piece as a fake. This "drape pattern" is frequently found in the eastern half of the United States. An updated note in the book states that this piece is probably a sugar bowl of English origin.

EVENT SCHEDULE:

Thursday, October, 14 – Thursday's schedule includes a **Mini Show/Sale** with offerings from some of our familiar glass dealers in the lower level of the museum. **The schedule for the show is 1 to 2 p.m. for HCA members only, 2 to 4 p.m. open to the public, 6 to 8 p.m. open to only PVM registrants.** Enjoy heavy hors d'oeuvres, sweets, and a cash bar with cocktails crafted by our President, Charlie Wade. You will also have an opportunity to preview the auction glass in Gallery 3 so you can begin choosing the items you hope to add to your glass collection during Saturday's auction.

Friday, October, 15 – Friday includes an opportunity to visit the glass studio and shop of Aaron Buchholz, the glass artist who makes the Christmas ornaments and pumpkins that HCA sells each year. His small St. Louisville Glass studio turns out a wide variety of beautiful, colorful glass in addition to the items he makes for HCA. The studio and gallery will be open from 12 noon to 4 p.m. (Directions available at the Museum).

Join Friday's organized **"room hop"** from 2 to 4 p.m. at the Hampton Inn of Heath-Newark, the official PVMW hotel. Those wishing to sell Heisey glass may display their wares in their hotel room. Limited display space may be available for those not staying at the Hampton. The room hop will start in the Hampton meeting room at 1 p.m. where participants will enjoy light refreshments and learn which rooms are participating in the hop. **If you wish to sell glass as part of the Mini Show/Sale or the Room Hop, please contact HCA Secretary Mary Olson, marythereseolson555@gmail.com or 612-597-1284 by Oct. 11.**

Many of the items displayed are rarely seen: like 3 Limelight/Crystal Empress Lily stems, all with different bowl treatments. A lively Q&A session followed. Eric always dazzles us with his knowledge and creative programs.

There were some impressive Show & Tell pieces: Cobalt Madonna #2 made by Mosser for HCA, Ridgeleigh 9" salad bowl, Queen Ann candleholders, Revere individual cream and sugar and Yeoman stack set – both with Tuthill cutting, possibly Puritan full cut candleblocks, Fish match holders, Waverly candleblocks, Plain Band 4" square berry bowls, Lobe pickle and olive, Coventry claret/Zeuse cutting, Plantation single candlestick, an unusual Plantation piece appearing to be made from a Plantation salver but with a different base, plus others I've missed with apologies to the contributors.

Jean Will wasn't in attendance but she made sure Eric delivered her homemade jams and jellies to sell – they all sold out as usual – they're a hot item with our group.

John adjourned the meeting so we could partake of delicious homemade banana cake and apple crisp with ice cream desserts prepared by our co-hosts. Auction Location: GMP Local #244 Union Hall, 350 Hudson Ave., Newark OH 43055, in person, online or both.

Consignments:

All items consigned for sale or donated are made by A. H. Heisey and Company. No reproductions by Imperial or others will be accepted, **except as commissioned by HCA**. The owner agrees to accept all responsibility for providing merchantable title for all glass sold.

The owner may consign no more than 40 lots (excluding donated lots) to be sold. The owner's list of glass (plus donated lots) is attached and is an integral part of this contract. There is no limit on the number of items in each lot, but HCA retains the right to increase / decrease size / make up of each lot. Each owner may donate an unlimited number of lots to HCA for sale at the auction. HCA, however, at its discretion, will consign donated items for auction, add donated items to the museum collection, and/or sell donated items in the museum shop.

The HCA Auction Committee will reject any glass, once received, deemed not acceptable for this auction, or glass not made by A. H. Heisey and Company except as commissioned by HCA. These items may be returned to the owner if they desire, at their expense. Otherwise, these items become the property of HCA. Every owner must be a current dues paying member of HCA.

Commission:

The Owner of glassware in this auction will be charged on the following sliding scale commission per lot: \$5.00-\$50.00 = 40%; \$50.01-\$200.00 = 30%; \$200.01-\$400.00 = 20%; \$400.01-\$750.00 = 15%; \$750.01 and over = 10%.

Settlement:

Payment (settlement) to the owner for glass sold will be made in full not later than fifteen days after the completed auction from the HCA Auction Trust Account. Said account is set up and operated consistent with ORC 4707.024. The owner and HCA agree that no other payments will be required to be made in less than fifteen days. HCA will pay expenses including auction site rental, advertising fees related to this auction from its commission from this account. Collection of funds, bad checks, debts, and unpaid auction lots is the responsibility of HCA.

Responsibility:

It is the responsibility of the owner to deliver the glassware to the National Heisey Glass Museum by **December 30, 2021**. HCA accepts responsibility for the glass after it is received at the Museum and until it is sold. Any glass damaged in shipment to the Museum will be referred to the shipper and owner. All glass damaged or lost while in the possession of HCA prior to sale will be valued by a qualified appraiser or appraisers and the owner will be paid on this basis, less commission.

Auction and Bidding:

This auction shall be a reserve auction unless explicitly stated otherwise in the contract for the auction and in the terms and conditions governing the auction. For the purposes of a reserve auction, there need not be an announcement or indication that the reserve is attained. (ORC 4707.022) A reserve auction means an auction in which the owner or agent of the owner reserves the right to establish a minimum opening bid, the right to accept or reject any or all bids, or the right to withdraw the real or personal property (lot) at any time prior to the completion of the auction by the auctioneer.

HCA and the owner agree that:

- 1) A signed copy of this contract **MUST** accompany all glass consignments;
- 2) The items will be sold to the highest bidder without reserve;
- 3) HCA and/or its auctioneer, has the right to accept or reject any or all bids;
- 4) HCA has the right to establish a minimum opening bid;
- 5) The owner may not withdraw the lot(s) at any time prior to the completion of the auction;
- 6) In the event no bids are received on a lot, the lot becomes a donation to HCA;
- 7) The auction will take place in person, on-line or both;
- 8) The minimum opening bid per lot is \$5.00.

The owner and HCA both agree that absentee bids will be accepted by HCA. The minimum absentee bid on a lot will be \$15.00 with a minimum opening bid of \$15.00. Absentee bids are bids left by buyers prior to the auction and are executed in a competitive manner. Per HCA policy, HCA does not use the full bid amount as a starting bid. Bidding is initiated in the audience and then offered on behalf of the absentee bidder at the next increment continuously until bidding has stopped. (Example: Absentee bidder leaves a bid with a maximum amount of \$500.00. After item is sold through competitive bidding, the absentee bidder is successful for \$325.00.) HCA reserves the right to accept or reject any and all absentee bids. HCA is not responsible for misfiled bids that are not executed.

The owner or a person on behalf of the owner may make a bid on a lot the owner consigns or has donated if the auction is a reserve auction and the auctioneer provides full disclosure before bidding that the owner retains the right to bid. Absent this disclosure, owners cannot bid or have others bid on their behalf on their own consigned or donated items and said bidding would constitute bid rigging and be in violation of ORC 4707.023.

General Auction Terms and Conditions:

- 1) All lots sold in numerical cataloged order.
- 2) Payment: Cash, travelers check, certified check, personal check or money order with proper ID. Visa, MasterCard, and Discover Cards are accepted. 5% buyer’s premium applies. Buyer’s premium waived for cash or check payment. Cash only payment may be specified for individual bidders at HCA’s request.
- 3) HCA has endeavored to describe all items to the best of their ability; however, this is not a warranty.
- 4) All items are sold as is and where is. The HCA has the right to make any corrections at the time of sale and to provide additional information.
- 5) In the case of a disputed bid the auctioneers have the authority to settle disputes to the best of their ability and their decision(s) is/are final. Resale of items will be handled at the auctioneer’s discretion.
- 6) The auctioneer has the right to set opening bids and reject any bid raise not in line with established bid increments. Items are sold without reserve, unless advertised otherwise.
