We delivered it to our warehouse and used it that day to load a Heisey mold that we needed to take to Mosser for pricing of a future project. My back and others want to thank Dick for finding and making possible the use of this piece of safety equipment. We all need to be thankful and grateful for our volunteers!

Volunteers were in full force for the Buckeye Study Club's annual car show and please enjoy Linda Greenwood's article on pages 8 and 9. This year was proof that neither rain nor lack of early sunshine can keep the faithful car lovers away. Treasurer's Report by Andy Baldus



Our financial position through July is good. Revenues are slightly below the budget target level due to lower sales and convention revenues. Revenues for membership are close to anticipated levels for this time of the year. Expenditures for July are still close to or below the approved budget levels.

Our major maintenance projects this year are in various stages of completion. Two projects were completed in June, the King house painting (\$32,000) and the tree feeding and trimming (\$2,300). The upgrade of the fire and security system (\$11,500) is complete and just waiting for the fire marshal's final inspection. This project was funded by contributions from Robert Loch and Robert Harris. The project to level the bricks in the courtyard along the sidewalks and landscaping restoration (\$18,000) will be completed this fall.

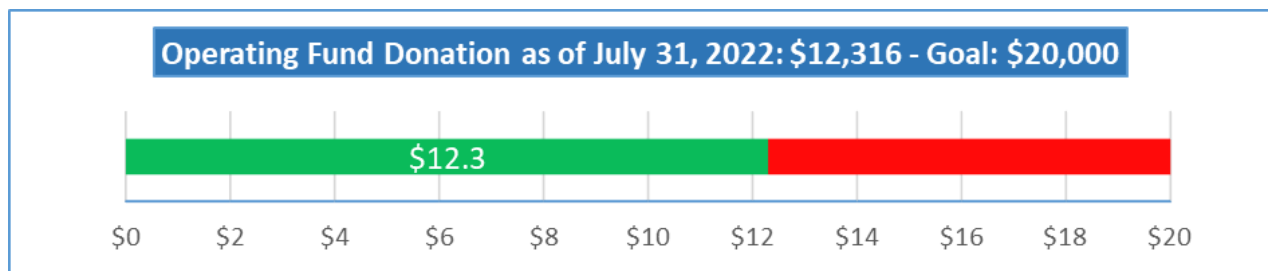
One of our fund-raising efforts, the Amazon Smiles program, dropped off slightly during the second quarter of 2022. The Heisey Collectors of America is a registered charity with the AmazonSmile Foundation, and it will donate to HCA 0.5% of the purchase price from eligible items. There is no additional cost to the buyer. To put this into perspective, for every \$1,000 in purchases through Amazon, the HCA will receive \$5.

On October 15, we will have the Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction which will be both in person and on-line (HiBid). These auctions represent the full range of production of the A. H. Heisey & Company from their beginnings until the doors closed in 1957.

There is something for everyone in these auctions from the standard production to true rarities that you seldom are given a chance to buy.

HEISEY HERITAGE AUCTION

This auction offers 361 lots with a wide selection of Heisey glass. There is a full range of Heisey patterns, colors, and items to satisfy any collector. There are plenty of lots of Dawn and Hawthorne as well as many lots of 1252 Twist in Flamingo (Lots 305-315, 326-331). Jim and Dubba's home had various glass cabinets and shelves displaying beautiful Heisey Glass.

Chris Gallagher gave a program on Peerless #300 stems. It is a common pattern. However, the stems being various heights and sizes, are at times difficult to determine what ounce capacity they are. The best way is to use a 1 tablespoon measuring spoon. It takes 2 tablespoons to equal an ounce. Fill the glass to the brim. Chris has tried this method on other Heisey glass and it works every time. Using a measuring cup will not work out due to the listed ounce capacity. Also, there could be rim repairs that can cause an error in the measurement. Chris presented a list of all the #300 Peerless stems and a picture of the various stems with descriptions. Chris discussed the differences in the stems.

The mystery gift was a two ounce Yeoman Optic Crystal cruet won by Carolyn Loar. Carolyn Crozier donated two boxes of Heisey glass for auctioning. Jaime Robinson won the auction and found various beautiful pieces of Orchid etch glass pieces in the boxes.

A Heisey Hunter's Worldly Discovery *By William McKelvey*

In 1896 the A.H. Heisey company made their mark on the glass world. Making crystal clear, pressed glass that looks like the much more expensive hand cut glass. They did such a great job producing the items that many people are fooled to this day. We collectors love to find one of these pieces in the wild (that's to say finding a special treasure yet to be identified out in the piles of this world's clutter). As Heisey hunters, when we do find that special piece, we take it home and wash it off and we display it in a cabinet or on a shelf like a trophy. I've heard many people say it's the hunt that keeps me going. It's the hunt that is the most fun. What if those cherished treasures could talk? Wouldn't you love to hear their story? Who made them? What was the process? Where did they go to be sold? Who bought them and did they enjoy their opportunity to serve? How many people did they meet? How did they get to where they are now? All these questions, and very few answers.

Back in 2017 I was hunting for Heisey on eBay. I typed blue cut glass in my search. Then I scrolled through a list of items from all kinds of glass companies not really knowing what I would find. Is that? Is that what I think it is? No! It can't be. Did they make Fandango in Blue? So, after giving it a little thought and investigating those photos closely I decided to purchase it. Wow, it's coming from India. It won't be here for almost a month. Waiting for that package to arrive was torture. I wanted to share my find with everyone but I wanted to wait to see if it actually made it to Ohio. I also wanted to see exactly what it is I just bought in person before I went and told anybody. The day it arrived I could not believe my eyes. The package that showed up! It was this beautiful, decorated fabric with ornamental metal facets. I spent quite a bit of time determining how I was going to open the package without damaging it. After investigating the package for quite a while, I decided to just get a knife and carefully cut at the threaded seam. Inside my tiny little piece was wrapped in brown paper. There it was, a tiny little bowl measuring just under three inches in Fandango with a blue stain.

All the way from India, the package revealed a unique Fandango salt with a blue stain.

After discussing it with a few friends who I consider experts, I believe what I have is a master salt. And I don't see where it appears in any of the trade catalogs. Yes, I did wash it off and then I did put it on display as one of my trophies in the cabinet. With additional research, I found in Joe Lokay's Fandango booklet a copy of an order for several pieces to be decorated blue or orange for the GA. Fox company. I wish this treasure could talk and tell us its story: How did you get to India? Did you enjoy your travels? Are you glad to be back in Ohio sitting amongst friends? I guess I'll never know its story but I'm glad it's become part of mine.

Currently I have eleven 3D items in the line-up. They are hand-made and can still have a few air bubbles, so a person should be careful if you choose to display them before consuming. Another way we make them special is to add edible gold dust.

I imagine wedding tables with the large swan in white chocolate and baby swans at each place setting. In the future I hope to carry a variety of other items as we become a full line chocolate company.

I hope people of all ages find the 3D figurines of my childhood as magical as I do. Be sure to check out the Website to see all the other figurines available.
