# Message From the President



October already! Heisey glass collectors will be in Newark attending the Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction during the Percy Vivian Moore Weekend annual event as you read this newsletter. And as Roy Eggert, Auction Committee chair, always reminds us “to bid high and bid often!” online or in person.



The gift shop has been transformed into an autumn wonderland highlighting the Projects Committee’s newest seasonal items. Pumpkins in two sizes and realistic acorns are a must for your “made with Heisey Glass” collections. A total of 250 pumpkins in two sizes made in the Old Sandwich shot glass mold will each be numbered and sold. With this limited number of each size being produced, be sure to call and reserve your items. The crystal acorns are each handmade so definitely one-of-a-kind. A reminder, last year the pumpkins sold out at PVM so do not procrastinate on placing your order.

Community outreach in promoting the museum continues. Out N About, an event, entertaining and travel TV series, filmed a segment at the museum this past month. The Columbus ABC Channel 6 show airs at 7a.m. Saturday and 10 a.m. Sunday mornings. Rentals of the multipurpose room continue this fall with the Newark/Heath Rotary requesting meeting space to include a tour of the museum.

Holiday Open House will be Saturday, November 26<sup>th</sup> in conjunction with the Licking County Historical Society event. 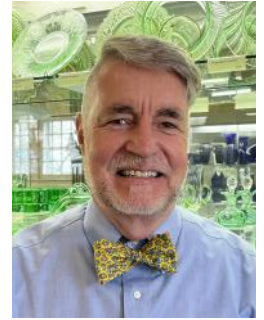

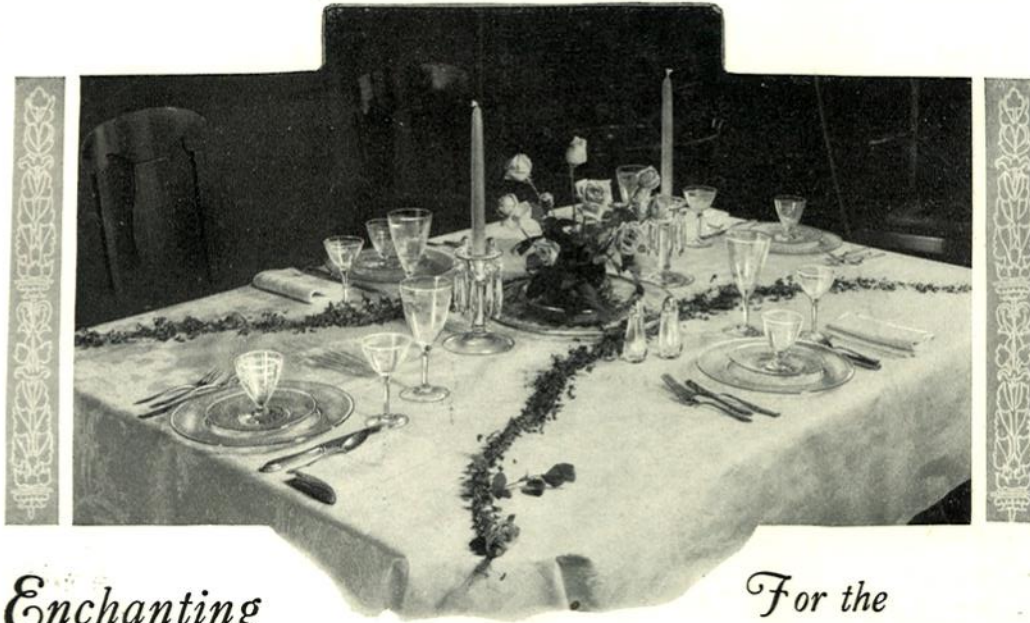

# Treasurer's Report by Andy Baldus

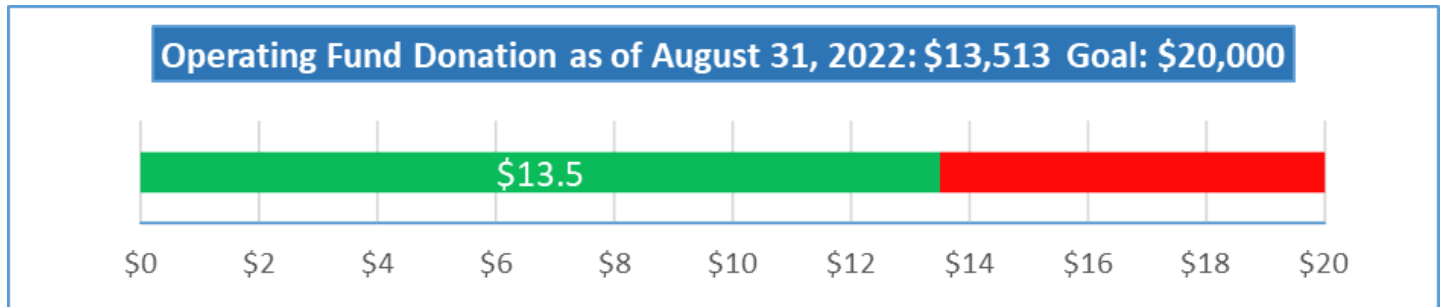


Our financial position through August is fair to good. I anticipate our financial position to improve when sales of pumpkins, ornaments, and the special production acorns begins.

This summer we had some unplanned contractual work associated with the June election of the Board of Directors, as stated in the Message from the President in the August and September issues of *Heisey News*.

Because of threatened legal action from an HCA member, and to avoid the much greater expense of litigation, we hired an attorney licensed to practice in Ohio to ensure our response was consistent with Ohio state law. The cost of those services (\$6,419) exceeded the \$2,500 budgeted for legal fees by \$3,900. We will be looking at our budget closely to see how to manage this unexpected additional expense.

We arranged with our accounting firm, Wells and Priest, to conduct a recount of the election ballots and certify the results. The good news is, Wells and Priest provided the recount at no additional cost.

# Percy & Vivian Moore Weekend: Origins and History

*This article is updated and reprinted from an article in the August 2015 edition of the Heisey News by Kelly Haist, paraphrased from a previous article written by Greg (Percy's grandson) and Gloria Moore in 2003.*

In honor of the upcoming Percy and Vivian Moore Weekend and considering there have been many new members added to the ranks of Heisey Collectors of America (HCA), we thought it important to revisit the history surrounding the Percy and Vivian Moore Weekend and their importance as HCA pioneers.

In 1991, the HCA board voted unanimously to rename the Annual Souvenir Dinner to honor Percy Moore, who was a longtime HCA member and supporter. In 1996 the board recognized Vivian posthumously. The Moores were avid collectors and they, along with other HCA Club Pioneers, began the National Heisey Museum. The event itself is hosted annually by HCA Study Club volunteers and occasionally individual members, as a fundraiser for HCA and a draw to their communities. As you will note, the Northwest Heisey Collectors will be hosting this year's event in Seattle, Washington. Next year the event will be held in Texas. Past PVM hosts have been Seattle, WA, in 2015, Grapevine, TX in 2016, Newark, Ohio in 2017, Minneapolis/St. Paul, Minnesota in 2018, Louisville, Kentucky in 2019, Newark, Ohio in 2021 and 2022. It is the perfect opportunity to visit and share your love of Heisey with others from around the nation. This year's event marks the 23rd Annual Percy and Vivian Moore Weekend.

The Moores were avid collectors and museum enthusiasts. Percy, along with his brother Glenn, restored old cars and from that they started an Auto Museum in the early 1950s, where they showcased their auto treasures, including a full-sized train locomotive. Percy and Vivian were reported to drive their old roadsters around Newark and they participated in many parades held in the community. Rifles, pistols, antique music boxes, and of course Heisey, were some of the many things collected by Percy and Vivian.

Percy opened his Auto museum in the 1950s. When the Heisey factory closed, he purchased the remaining pallets of Heisey inventory. Vivian then sold Heisey from the gift shop located next to the museum. After Glenn's death in the late 1950s, Percy had to divide their car collection to help provide for Glenn's family, but Percy and Vivian maintained the gift shop until the early 1970s, continuing to sell their robust Heisey inventory. As friendships grew with other Heisey enthusiasts, the Heisey Collectors of America was born and founded in 1971.

When the Heisey Collectors of America started the Heisey Museum, opening its doors in 1974, the Moores were generous in their donations of Heisey pieces to display in the museum. In addition, they supplied the large grinding stones that serve as steps leading into the King House as well as being built into a retaining wall on the north side of the property. They also served as a lender to help make the King House purchase and relocation possible. Volunteering hours and donations, Percy and Vivian Moore joined the other founding pioneers in providing a home for the Heisey legacy and securing that legacy for future Heisey enthusiasts.



**Collecting more than glass:**  
*Industrious and insightful in the early 1950's, Percy and his brother Glenn bought and restored old cars at their Moore Brothers Garage on Church Street in Newark. In the mid-fifties, the boys decided to retire and started an auto museum to showcase their own cars while also including a full-size train locomotive.*

It is not hard to understand why the 1991 HCA Board of Directors made the unanimous decision to pay tribute to these founding members of HCA by renaming the Annual Souvenir Dinner in their honor. Their love of Heisey and willingness to dedicate their time and efforts, alongside other founding members, to HCA and the museum, are the reason we have the ability and pride to call ourselves Heisey collectors and HCA members.

We invite new and old members alike to attend this exciting event and share in the fun and joy of Heisey and take part in honoring the memories of these early Heisey heroes.

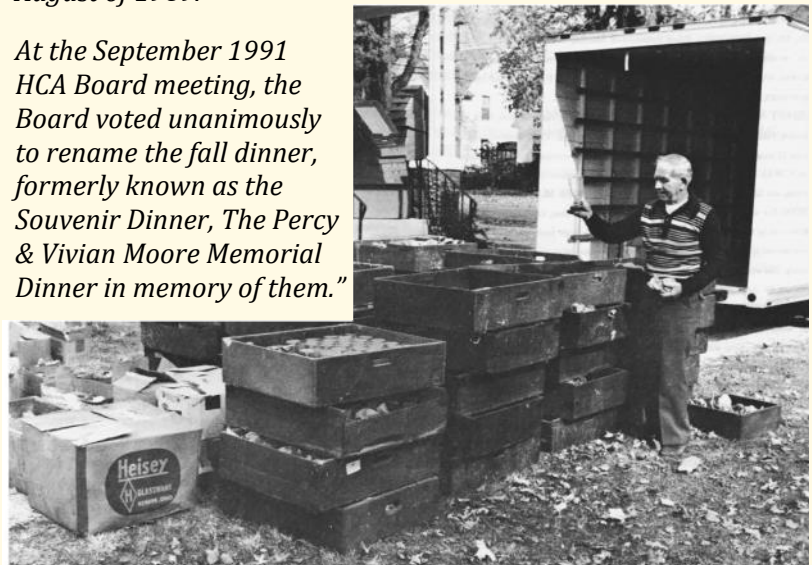

*"After the Heisey factory closed, Percy Moore and his wife, Vivian, purchased the remaining stock of glass. For several years they sold Heisey at an antique store on Rt. 40 near Reynoldsburg. In 1980, the Moores decided to sell much of their Heisey at auction. In the picture below, Heisey glassware, most in the original factory carton, is shown stacked in the yard of the Moore's home waiting to be loaded on to the truck. Percy is holding what appears to be an Oxford ice tea. Percy Moore passed away in August of 1989.*

*At the September 1991 HCA Board meeting, the Board voted unanimously to rename the fall dinner, formerly known as the Souvenir Dinner, The Percy & Vivian Moore Memorial Dinner in memory of them."*

There is no definition on what a "lot" is, but the auction committee during cataloging may adjust or reconfigure what glass is consigned to benefit the consigners.

**Auction Dates:** April 14-15, 2023 Glass delivery by December 30, 2022

**Auction Location:** GMP Local #244 Union Hall, 350 Hudson Ave., Newark OH 43055, in person, online or both.

**Consignments:**

All items consigned for sale or donated are made by A. H. Heisey and Company, no reproductions by Imperial or others will be accepted, except as commissioned by HCA. The owner, agrees to accept all responsibility for providing merchantable title for all glass sold.

The owner may consign no more than 40 lots (excluding donated lots) to be sold. The owner's list of glass (plus donated lots) is attached and is an integral part of this contract. There is no limit on the number of items in each lot, but HCA retains the right to increase / decrease size / make up of each lot. Each owner may donate an unlimited number of lots to HCA for sale at the auction. HCA, however, at its discretion, will consign donated items for auction, add donated items to the museum collection, and/or sell donated items in the museum shop.

The HCA Auction Committee will reject any glass, once received, deemed not acceptable for this auction, or glass not made by A. H. Heisey and Company except as commissioned by HCA. These items may be returned to the owner if they desire, at their expense. Otherwise, these items become the property of HCA. Every owner must be a current dues paying member of HCA.

**Commission:**

The Owner of glassware in this auction will be charged on the following sliding scale commission per lot: \$5.00-\$50.00 = 40%; \$50.01-\$200.00 = 30%; \$200.01-\$400.00 = 20%; \$400.01-\$750.00 = 15%; \$750.01 and over = 10%.

**Settlement:**

Payment (settlement) to the owner for glass sold will be made in full not later than fifteen days after the completed auction from the HCA Auction Trust Account. Said account is set up and operated consistent with ORC 4707.024. The owner and HCA agree that no other payments will be required to be made in less than fifteen days. HCA will pay expenses including auction site rental, advertising fees related to this auction from its commission from this account. Collection of funds, bad checks, debts, and unpaid auction lots is the responsibility of HCA.

**Responsibility:**

It is the responsibility of the owner to deliver the glassware to the National Heisey Glass Museum by December 30, 2022. HCA accepts responsibility for the glass after it is received at the Museum and until it is sold. Any glass damaged in shipment to the Museum will be referred to the shipper and owner. All glass damaged or lost while in the possession of

HCA prior to sale will be valued by a qualified appraiser or appraisers and the owner will be paid on this basis, less commission.

**Auction and Bidding:**

This auction shall be a reserve auction unless explicitly stated otherwise in the contract for the auction and in the terms and conditions governing the auction. For the purposes of a reserve auction, there need not be an announcement or indication that the reserve is attained. (ORC 4707.022) A reserve auction means an auction in which the owner or agent of the owner reserves the right to establish a minimum opening bid, the right to accept or reject any or all bids, or the right to withdraw the real or personal property (lot) at any time prior to the completion of the auction by the auctioneer.

HCA and the owner agree that:

- 1) A signed copy of this contract **MUST** accompany all glass consignments;
- 2) The items will be sold to the highest bidder without reserve;
- 3) HCA and/or its auctioneer, has the right to accept or reject any or all bids;
- 4) HCA has the right to establish a minimum opening bid;
- 5) The owner may not withdraw the lot(s) at any time prior to the completion of the auction;
- 6) In the event no bids are received on a lot, the lot becomes a donation to HCA;
- 7) The auction will take place in person, on-line or both;
- 8) The minimum opening bid per lot is \$5.00.

The owner and HCA both agree that absentee bids will be accepted by HCA. The minimum absentee bid on a lot will be \$15.00 with a minimum opening bid of \$15.00. Absentee bids are bids left by buyers prior to the auction and are executed in a competitive manner. Per HCA policy, HCA does not use the full bid amount as a starting bid. Bidding is initiated in the audience and then offered on behalf of the absentee bidder at the next increment continuously until bidding has stopped. (Example: Absentee bidder leaves a bid with a maximum amount of \$500.00. After item is sold through competitive bidding, the absentee bidder is successful for \$325.00.) HCA reserves the right to accept or reject any and all absentee bids. HCA is not responsible for misfiled bids that are not executed.

The owner or a person on behalf of the owner may make a bid on a lot the owner consigns or has donated if the auction is a reserve auction and the auctioneer provides full disclosure before bidding that the owner retains the right to bid. Absent this disclosure, owners cannot bid or have others bid on their behalf on their own consigned or donated items and said bidding would constitute bid rigging and be in violation of ORC 4707.023.

**General Auction Terms and Conditions:**

- 1) All lots sold in numerical cataloged order.
- 2) Payment: Cash, travelers check, certified check, personal check or money order with proper ID. Visa, MasterCard, and Discover Cards are accepted. 8% buyer's premium applies. Buyer's premium waived for cash or check payment. Cash only payment may be specified for individual bidders at HCA's request.
- 3) HCA has endeavored to describe all items to the best of their ability; however this is not a warranty.
- 4) All items are sold as is and where is. The HCA has the right to make any corrections at the time of sale and to provide additional information.
- 5) In the case of a disputed bid the auctioneers have the authority to settle disputes to the best of their ability and their decision(s) is/are final. Resale of items will be handled at the auctioneer's discretion.
- 6) The auctioneer has the right to set opening bids and reject any bid raise not in line with established bid increments. Items are sold without reserve, unless advertised otherwise.
- 7) All sales are final and all items must be paid for the day of sale. A moving and storage fee of \$5.00 per day may be assessed for items not picked up by designated date.
- 8) Buyer assumes full responsibility for items once they are sold unless otherwise specified by HCA or the auctioneer. Buyer must have receipt in hand to pick up items.
- 9) HCA (an auction firm) and all auctioneers used by HCA are licensed by the Ohio Department of Agriculture and bonded in favor of the state.

## NORTHWOODS Study Club News

### Northwoods club auction demonstrates great variety of Heisey glass

The mini auction of Northwoods Heisey Study Club's August meeting demonstrated the great variety of glass produced by A.H. Heisey & Company. The sturdy Wide Flat Panel vase and large Puritan punch bowl provided a nice contrast to the delicate Yeoman bouillon in Sahara with Empress etch and the striking Legionnaire goblet with Arcadia cutting.

In addition to eighteen lots of glass were a number of very interesting Heisey advertisements, including one in a May 1913 issue of *The Ladies Home Journal*. This particular ad, showing a Flat Panel cracker jar, a 440 nappy, and

several Medium Flat Panel items, told readers that Heisey's "beautiful and serviceable" glassware "is made to withstand the brunt of daily use." Interestingly, this ad was on the same page as one for Koh-i-noor dress fasteners "that all Europe uses." The dress fasteners preceded Heisey's Kohinoor pattern by nearly a quarter of a century.

The variety of auction items was an eye opener for two guests who didn't realize the breadth of Heisey glass products, but what really astounded them was the incredible glass collection of hosts Bob and Bev Heise.

The mini auction raised \$455 and all members and guests added one or more pieces to their collections. Many tickets were sold for the raffle of a mystery box of Heisey glass valued at \$100 or more. Chuck Bingham was the lucky winner of a Steele rose bowl in Moongleam. Proceeds of the auction, the raffle and member donations will enable the club to donate \$1,000 to HCA for the museum operating fund.

During the business portion of the meeting, the club discussed results of the HCA election, convention highlights, the upcoming Percy and Moore Dinner and HCA's fall auctions.

During Show and Tell, Bob Heise shared a Coronation cocktail with Moonglo cutting and a rare 370 Penny goblet with narrow optic, produced in 1907. He noted that this goblet is listed in the Heisey stemware book as "unseen." Bev Heise shared a 1405 Ipswich *schoeppen*. She explained that

*schoeppen* is a German word for a vessel to measure beverages.

Marv and Joann Christenson had donated their show and tell item to the auction. It was a Puritan punch bowl they had purchased at a thrift store for only \$3.99. Bev was the lucky winner with the high bid of \$50.

Doug and Mary Olson shared a 5057 Suez iced tea with Sultana foot, produced between 1950 and 1952, purchased at the convention glass show, and an 8-inch Pinwheel and Fan nappy in Canary, which nearly completes their collection of this item. Does anyone have it in Marigold?

When adjourning for refreshments, the group sang *Happy Birthday* to Virginia Johnson, a founding member of the club, in anticipation of her 102<sup>nd</sup> birthday.

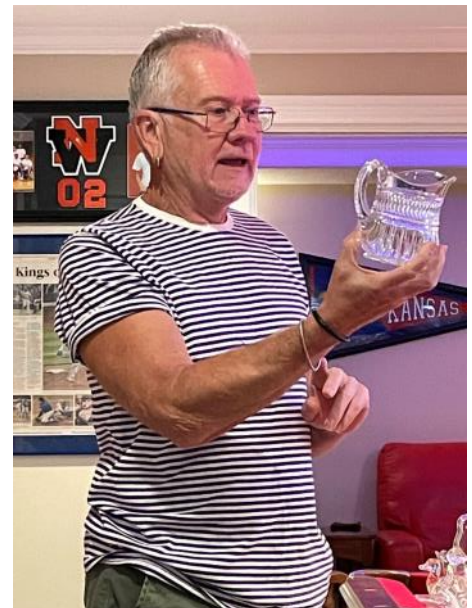
