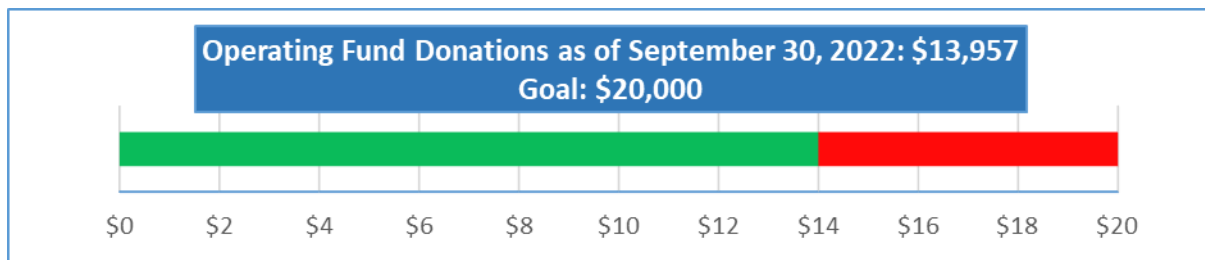
# Treasurer's Report by Andy Baldus



Our financial position through September is fair to good. The financial outlook is beginning to improve with increased sales through the gift shop of real Heisey, pumpkins, and the special production acorns.

For the treasurer's report at the October membership meeting, I reported the following September 30, 2022, account balances. The Endowment Fund balance has changed significantly since last spring. The balance as of March 31, was \$5,960,394 compared with the \$5,041,187 balance at the end of September. Most of the change, \$822,000, is due to unrealized losses, the change in the value of stocks within the portfolio. We also took our first draw for the year from the Endowment Fund of \$60,000 to support the operating fund.

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## Endowment Level Membership Dues to Increase – *adjustment needed to maintain contribution level*

The fee for HCA endowment level memberships will increase beginning January 1, 2023, but there will be **no increase** in the basic Associate Member dues of \$40 per year or the additional household member dues of \$10 per year.

The HCA Board of Directors voted to increase dues for the various endowment level memberships in order to restore the \$20 contribution to the Endowment Fund associated with the Individual Contributing, Joint Contributing and Family Contributing membership levels. This corrects the \$10 reduction in dollars going into the Endowment Fund that occurred when basic dues increased last January but endowment level dues did not. The board also approved increases for the Patron, Sponsor and Benefactor endowment membership levels shown in the table below.

The amount of money going to the Endowment Fund from each endowment level membership is that which remains after the basic associate level fee is deducted. For example, when a member purchased a \$50 Individual Contributing Membership this year, only \$10 went to the Endowment Fund because the first \$40 covered the new higher cost of basic dues. Last year, prior to the increase in basic dues, \$20 went into the Endowment Fund from each \$50 Individual Contributing Membership. With the new increase, the amount going into the endowment from each Individual Contributing Membership will return to \$20 starting in January.

### HCA MEMBER NEWS: HCA Board seeks members' opinions

HCA members have the opportunity to help shape the future of the museum and the organization through participation in an online survey similar to one conducted in 2018. Survey results will provide information on members' priorities for the board to use in making decisions.

It also seeks ideas for improving the museum and attracting younger generations. It ends with a question asking members to share anything else they would like the board to know.

Responses from paper surveys will be entered into the survey database and tabulated along with responses from members who took the survey electronically.

Your answers to all survey questions will be completely anonymous. As with the 2018 survey, all responses will be compiled automatically and results will be shared with members through a series of articles in *Heisey News*.

## 2022 Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction Wrap-up

We held our annual Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction on Oct. 15 at the GMP Local 244 Union Hall on Hudson Avenue in Newark, Ohio. Again we conducted a hybrid auction where we not only had in person bidding but online bidding as well.

Our volunteers boxed up the auction glass on Friday. We met at the Union Hall at 8:00 AM on Saturday to unpack the 310 lots of glass from our 18 consignors/donors. We finished in plenty of time for the Preview, which started at 11:00 AM and lasted till 12:00 Noon. We had another wonderful selection of glass this year!

The always entertaining Craig Connelly and cohort, Jeff Baird, were our auctioneers.

Our auction began promptly at 12:00 Noon. The turnout for the auction was good. We had a crowd of approximately 75 with 49 individuals picking up bid cards, one absentee bidder and 76 online bidders. Bidding was robust with heavy competition for many of the special pieces in the auction. Some interesting online stats: the lots were viewed over 8,000 times and there were over 1,500 bids!

We had total revenues of \$55,122.80 with glass sales of \$53,150.00 for the 310 lots. Our payments to consignors and other expenses are approximately \$46,000 so we have an estimated net profit for the museum of \$9,000. We will exceed our 2022 budget projection of \$7,000 which is tremendous.

We hope you will consider donating glass in the future since 100% of the proceeds goes to support the museum.

Putting on an auction is a team effort and HCA has some great volunteers! I want to thank the volunteers who helped to make this a successful venture. They are listed in this newsletter- sorry if we missed anyone. I also want to give special thanks to several individuals. First, thanks to Walter Ludwig who volunteered his time to help catalog and properly list the glass and to write a wonderful article highlighting the glass. Second, a big thank you to Mary Ann Spahr for assisting in every aspect of the auction process. Third, a huge thank you to Karen Taylo for making the HiBid platform work, and making sure the consignors get paid promptly. Lastly, to the online computer team: Caleb-Michael Files, and Doug Olson. Caleb and Doug did another great job!

This was truly a team effort and could not have been done otherwise. When this team comes together, things happen. It is my profound pleasure to work with everyone on the Auction Committee.

Thanks again to all of you who consigned and donated glass for the auction and to those of you who purchased this wonderful Heisey glass. Hope to see you all at the 2023 Spring Benefit Auction on Apr. 14 – 15, 2023. Please continue to support our museum.

### 2022 HEISEY HERITAGE AUCTION WRAP-UP

Our second Heisey Heritage Auction (HHA) was a success! We held the online only auction on Saturday, Oct. 8, 2022. The auction was “well attended” with 75 online registrants. We had 361 lots of glass from 3 consignors. The auction lots garnered over 11,000 views and over 2,000 bids!

We grossed \$11,002.50 (glass sales and buyer’s premium) and after consignors and expenses are paid, we hope to net approximately \$3,500. Since this auction was not included in the 2022 budget, the net will be reflected in the fall auction line item adding more revenue to an already successful Fall Select Auction.

The cataloging of the HHA glass coincided with that of the Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction. Many thanks to all the volunteers from the August session, and to the October volunteers who arrived in Newark early to help pack the winning bidders’ glass. You are the key to the success of our auctions!

Thanks also to the consignors who consigned to the HHA and to all online bidders who helped make this event a successful fundraiser for HCA.

**Consignments:**

All items consigned for sale or donated are made by A. H. Heisey and Company, no reproductions by Imperial or others will be accepted, except as commissioned by HCA. The owner, agrees to accept all responsibility for providing merchantable title for all glass sold.

The owner may consign no more than 40 lots (excluding donated lots) to be sold. The owner's list of glass (plus donated lots) is attached and is an integral part of this contract. There is no limit on the number of items in each lot, but HCA retains the right to increase / decrease size / make up of each lot. Each owner may donate an unlimited number of lots to HCA for sale at the auction. HCA, however, at its discretion, will consign donated items for auction, add donated items to the museum collection, and/or sell donated items in the museum shop.

The HCA Auction Committee will reject any glass, once received, deemed not acceptable for this auction, or glass not made by A. H. Heisey and Company except as commissioned by HCA. These items may be returned to the owner if they desire, at their expense. Otherwise, these items become the property of HCA. Every owner must be a current dues paying member of HCA.

**Commission:**

The Owner of glassware in this auction will be charged on the following sliding scale commission per lot: \$5.00-\$50.00 = 40%; \$50.01-\$200.00 = 30%; \$200.01-\$400.00 = 20%; \$400.01-\$750.00 = 15%; \$750.01 and over = 10%.

**Settlement:**

Payment (settlement) to the owner for glass sold will be made in full not later than fifteen days after the completed auction from the HCA Auction Trust Account. Said account is set up and operated consistent with ORC 4707.024. The owner and HCA agree that no other payments will be required to be made in less than fifteen days. HCA will pay expenses including auction site rental, advertising fees related to this auction from its commission from this account. Collection of funds, bad checks, debts, and unpaid auction lots is the responsibility of HCA.

**Responsibility:**

It is the responsibility of the owner to deliver the glassware to the National Heisey Glass Museum by December 30, 2022. HCA accepts responsibility for the glass after it is received at the Museum and until it is sold. Any glass damaged in shipment to the Museum will be referred to the shipper and owner. All glass damaged or lost while in the possession of

HCA prior to sale will be valued by a qualified appraiser or appraisers and the owner will be paid on this basis, less commission.

**Auction and Bidding:**

This auction shall be a reserve auction unless explicitly stated otherwise in the contract for the auction and in the terms and conditions governing the auction. For the purposes of a reserve auction, there need not be an announcement or indication that the reserve is attained. (ORC 4707.022) A reserve auction means an auction in which the owner or agent of the owner reserves the right to establish a minimum opening bid, the right to accept or reject any or all bids, or the right to withdraw the real or personal property (lot) at any time prior to the completion of the auction by the auctioneer.

HCA and the owner agree that:

- 1) A signed copy of this contract **MUST** accompany all glass consignments;
- 2) The items will be sold to the highest bidder without reserve;
- 3) HCA and/or its auctioneer, has the right to accept or reject any or all bids;
- 4) HCA has the right to establish a minimum opening bid;
- 5) The owner may not withdraw the lot(s) at any time prior to the completion of the auction;
- 6) In the event no bids are received on a lot, the lot becomes a donation to HCA;
- 7) The auction will take place in person, on-line or both;
- 8) The minimum opening bid per lot is \$5.00.

The owner and HCA both agree that absentee bids will be accepted by HCA. The minimum absentee bid on a lot will be \$15.00 with a minimum opening bid of \$15.00. Absentee bids are bids left by buyers prior to the auction and are executed in a competitive manner. Per HCA policy, HCA does not use the full bid amount as a starting bid. Bidding is initiated in the audience and then offered on behalf of the absentee bidder at the next increment continuously until bidding has stopped. 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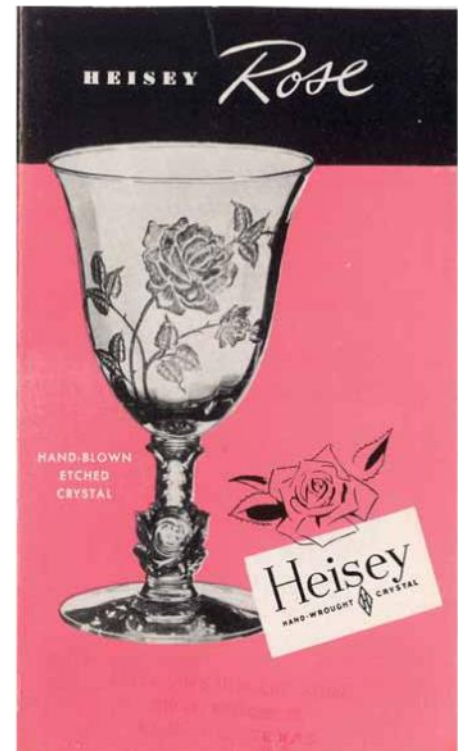
# A LOOK BACK AT HEISEY HISTORY

## Designing Women By Tom Felt

Like so many major industries, glass manufacture has always been dominated by men. If you think about women in a glass factory, you think of them working in the etching department or maybe having a job in the packing department. But women playing a major role? Traditionally, this simply has never been the case. It was not until the formation of the studio glass movements this century that you begin to find women having total control over the design of their pieces or the actual manufacturing processes.

But having said this, it almost immediately becomes necessary to backtrack a little. Women did, in fact, begin to play an increasingly important role in the years just preceding the closing of the Heisey factory, beginning in the late 1940s and continuing on into the 1950s. I suspect there is some significance to the fact that these are the post-World War II years. During the war women had been called upon to assume many jobs previously held by men and this was true in the glass industry, as elsewhere. Rosie the riveter must have had her counterpart in the glass factory, and this new independence made it possible for women to begin considering careers that had been closed to them before.

One of these young women was Jane Wilson Scott. She was an art major at Denison University (Granville, Ohio) who graduated in 1949. She had been a student of Horace King who was the chairman of the Art Department at Denison and also employed as a designer with Heisey. When Clarence Heisey suggested that Mr. King hire an assistant, he thought of Jane. Her first job was to make scale drawings of every piece produced by Heisey for the new catalog that came out in 1950, spending nearly a year for this task. These same drawings were also used in catalog 32 in 1953 and catalog 33 in 1956, both of which have been reproduced. **These were, of course, the final catalogs put out by Heisey.**

Although her employment with Heisey was relatively brief, lasting only three years, from 1949 to 1952, she also found time to design several new pieces. Many of these were never made, though at least a few were added to lines originally designed by Horace King. For instance, she created the center-handled sandwich plate and hurricane lamp in the Cabochon pattern and the covered marmalade in the Plantation pattern.

One of her last designs was the No. 1952 campaign beer mug, or Dumbo mug, as it is better known today. It was not actually a production item, but was made in amber only for a Republican dinner in Newark (Ohio), where it was given out as a campaign souvenir. E. Ward Russell had these mugs made in seven different colors by Imperial in the 1960s and early 1970s.

It is sometimes a little confusing, because while Jane Scott was employed by Heisey, another woman named Jane Phillips was also designing for them. She began working for Heisey in 1946, but unlike the other Jane, was already a successful career woman at that time. She had spent a year in Paris and then worked for a while as a designer for Fostoria before coming to Heisey. She probably did a number of designs or additions to lines originally created by Horace King, including the one-light

candlestick in the Waverly pattern. Her most significant contribution was the Heisey Rose etching. It was made from 1949 until 1957 and can be found on at least 114 different pieces. The same year that she had her triumph with Heisey Rose, however, Jane Phillips also had what she considered as an even greater success—a line of modern dinnerware called Gray-lure that she designed for the Crooksville China Company. She had done this in her spare time, and it was such a sensation at the Gift Show that she decided to resign her position with Heisey so that she could freelance full time. I don't want to suggest that Jane made a mistake, but I wonder how many Gray-lure collectors there are today compared to Heisey Rose collectors?

Unlike Jane Scott and Jane Phillips, the next lady to be mentioned, Anne Lee Dillon, was never actually an employee of Heisey, or for that matter a career woman, at all. Mrs. Dillon was a matron from Raleigh, North Carolina. I have chosen to use that old-fashioned terminology deliberately; as it calls upon image of a society woman involved in garden clubs and charity work, the description is just right. But Mrs. Dillon also had a very inventive mind and was even known to her friends as Gadget Dillon. Among many other things, she created a "Fence-Me-In" bed-guard for converting a regular bed into one that babies and small children could use without danger of falling out.

She also invented and patented the epergnettes. The idea came to her late one night when she was lying in bed wishing that she had an epergne to use for a party the next day, but not wanting to put as much money as she would have to into buying something she would only use only occasionally. Then it occurred to her that maybe she could convert a candelabra into an epergne, so she set to work, while the rest of her family were sleeping, using various sized saucers and glue. The result wasn't perfect, but her friends were very enthusiastic when they saw it. She later did a demonstration of the idea for her local garden club, and they wrote to Heisey urging that it be put into production.

Actually, several companies showed interest in the epergnettes, including Fostoria, who sent a salesman to visit Mrs. Dillon. But it was Heisey who put the idea into production first in 1945. It was a success and epergnettes continued to sell well for Heisey until 1957 and then remained in Imperial's catalogs until at least 1980, and probably longer. Displays put on by Mrs. Dillon around the country for Heisey showed the invention's versatility, since epergnettes could be used in metal candlesticks or vases. If need be, an epergnette could even be placed in a common tumbler. She also stressed that you didn't need to be confined to using flowers; leaves or vines, nuts or fruit could also be part of a floral display.

Heisey eventually made epergnettes in three different patterns, Old Williamsburg, Waverly (in three sizes) and Block Five. The latter is very plain and if it weren't marked with the Diamond H would easily be confused with the epergnettes used as part of the well-known Cambridge Arms line.

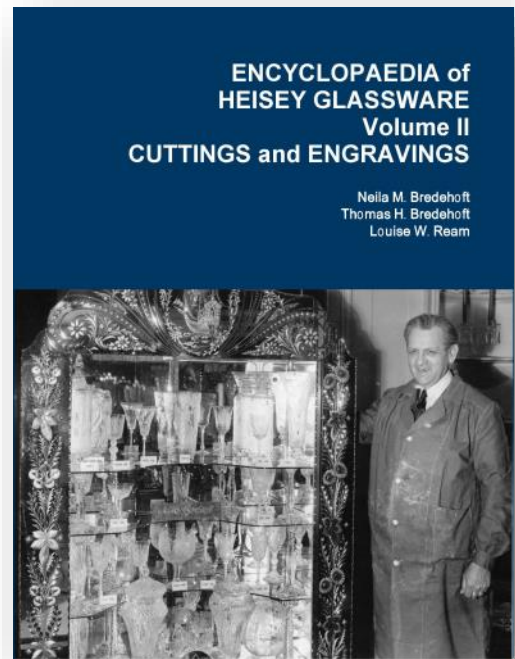
