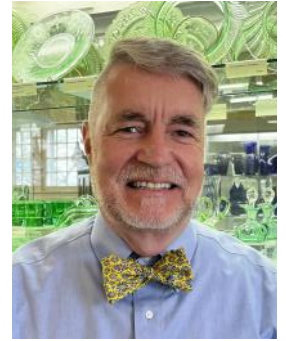

# Treasurer's Report by Andy Baldus



Our financial position through October is good. The table on the following page shows expenses and revenues through October compared with the 2022 budget.

Revenues have increased due to sales of pumpkins, acorns and real Heisey. Revenues from the fall auctions are also better than expected. Membership revenue is close to the expected level at this point in the year. Net revenues for the Percy and Vivian Moore event are expected to be about \$2,200 once all expenses are paid.

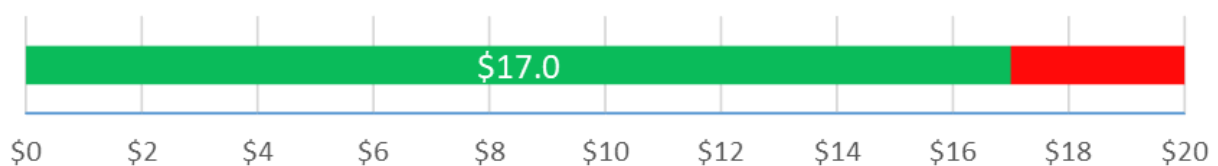
Overall expenses are above budget levels driven mostly by Legal Fees/Retainers (see the Oct. issue of *Heisey News*), Museum Expense, utilities and Major Non-Recurring Items.

Museum Expense includes non-recurring expenses for installation of the front door transom, a new computer and monitor for newsletter work and new emergency exit signage and door locks for the lower level. Expenditures for Utilities are reflecting the overall increase in the cost of energy. Expenditures for Major Non-Recurring Items include \$27,000 for exterior painting of the King House, \$2,012 for trimming and care of the trees, and \$11,979 for resetting the brick in the courtyard and along the sidewalks.

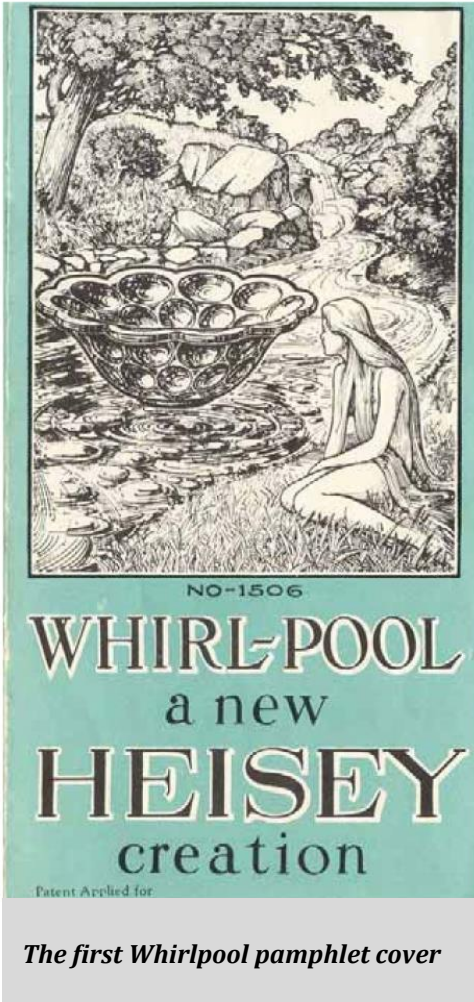

# A LOOK BACK AT HEISEY HISTORY

## 1506 Whirlpool Pamphlets

This month, instead of a single pamphlet on our cover, we have two. Both are for 1506 Whirlpool. This pattern originated in 1938 and was heavily promoted at the time. The first pamphlet dates from the introduction of the pattern and says on the cover “No. 1506 Whirlpool [sic] a new Heisey creation.” This pamphlet was a dual fold so there are three panels on each side. The interior of the pamphlet pictures 43 different items with reference to three other pieces. This display is surmounted with the words, “Quality that only Heisey can produce.” The panel which folds over the interior states, “Whirlpool. As surely as the clear, cool rippling mountain streams, eddies and whirlpools draw us to them irresistibly – so Heisey’s new sparkling WHIRLPOOL pattern calls enticingly.

“WHIRLPOOL design has caught the spirit of yesteryear and offers special appeal to those who do not only love to surround themselves with the atmosphere of the early pioneers, but who insist on that touch of practicability so essential in this modern world of ours.

“Pieces in the WHIRLPOOL line are offered at prices as attractive as the design itself; serving to make this new creation in glass available to every home in which genuine beauty is appreciated.”

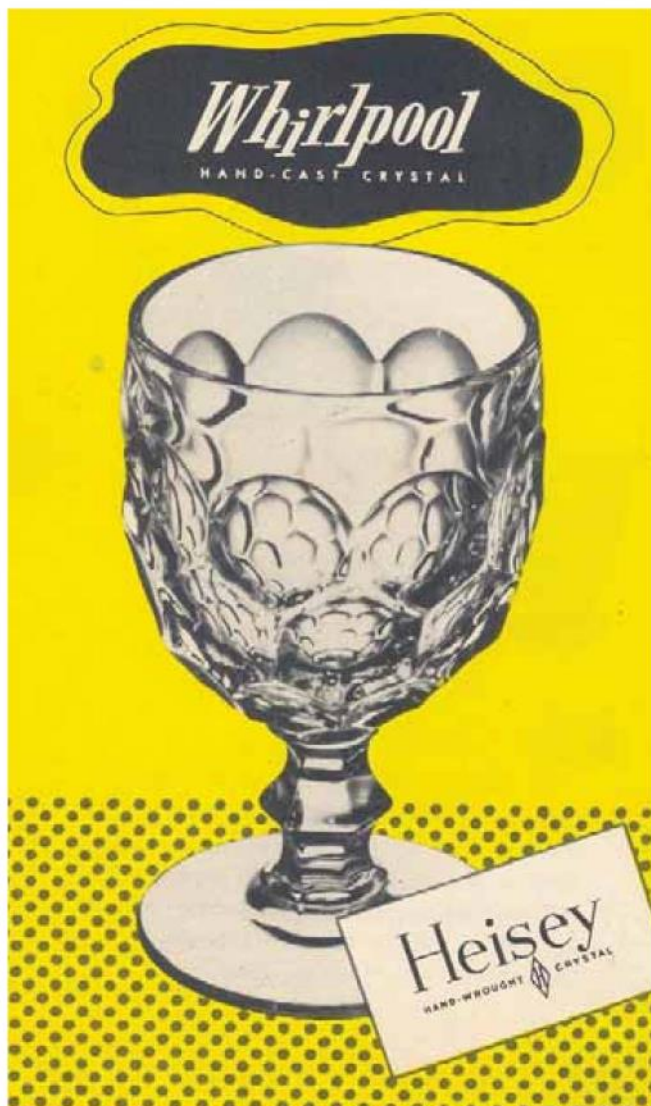
This copywriter was not going to miss a trick: beauty of design, practicality, modernism, traditionalism, economy, snob appeal – this was a pattern that had it all. This pamphlet is accented with a mint green background on both sides. The front cover pictures a nymph sitting by a mountain stream with a Whirlpool bowl hovering over the

water with its patterns reflected in the eddy below. The back cover features a floral arrangement made with the help of a Heisey floral frog sitting in a Whirlpool floral bowl and accompanied by a three-light candlestick.

The second pamphlet was produced later, after the war had ended. This pamphlet used a bright yellow as its background color. It is only a single sheet front and back. The front pictures a goblet with the slogan "Whirlpool hand-cast crystal" over it. "Heisey hand wrought crystal" is in a box covering part of the foot of the goblet. The back pictures a torte plate, goblet, sherbet, and 8-inch salad plate, as well as the footed iced tea and footed tumbler. The ad copy reads, "Whirlpool was especially styled for you whose heart is warmed by the comfortable practicality of Early American atmosphere. The rhythmic eddy of WHIRLPOOL'S diminishing circles makes this one of Heisey's most beautiful and most popular hand-cast patterns . . . created in stemware, plates, bowls, and candlesticks to add a cheery welcome to your table."

In the early 1950s, Whirlpool was renamed Provincial to further emphasize its appeal as a traditional pattern. Some people say that the fact that T. Clarence Heisey, president of the company, referred to the pattern as "cesspool" also was a contributing factor in its renaming. When Zircon was brought back in 1956 the Provincial pattern was one of the patterns made in that color. Given the water allusions of the earlier name, Whirlpool, it only seems fitting.



# A LOOK BACK AT HEISEY HISTORY

## 343 AND 343½ SUNBURST

The Sunburst pattern was introduced by A. H. Heisey & Company in late 1904. Heisey Catalog No. 50, circa 1905, showed many items in both 343 and 343½ Sunburst. Price Lists No. 120 (1906) and No. 142 (1908) listed 85 items under pattern 343 and 33 items under pattern 343½. The Sunburst pattern is no longer offered in Heisey Price List No. 155 (1910). So, the production life of the pattern is about five years.

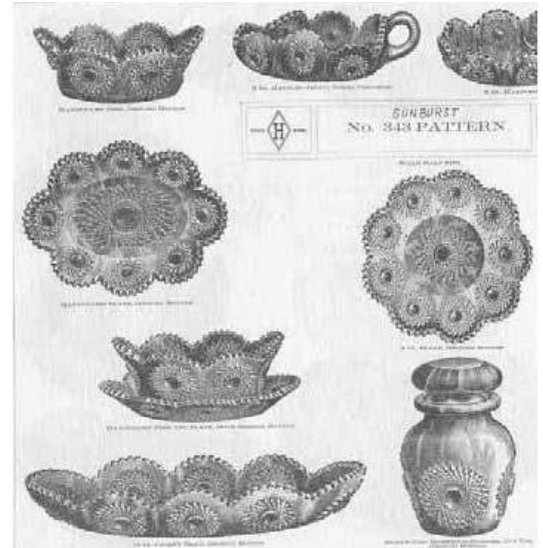
You may ask why the company felt the need for using both the 343 and 343½ numbers for the Sunburst pattern. The answer lies in differentiating between two items which would bear the same name but differ in design. In the case of the Sunburst pattern, Heisey offered two styles of tumblers, punch cups (custards), jugs, hotel creams and sugars, nappies, and punch bowl bases. By varying the pattern number, the salesman could readily identify which of the two styles the customer desired. The use of the half number was common at this time at Heisey. The 341 Puritan pattern also has many pieces identified as 343½. It is less commonly used in other patterns, but you will find pieces in 300½ Peerless, 333½ Waldorf Astoria, 351½ Priscilla, 379½ Urn, 400½ Colonial Cupped Scallop, and 433½ Greek Key. The idea was even brought back in the 1930s in 1469 Ridgeleigh and 1503 Crystolite.

A break down of the 85 items in 343 Sunburst is:

- 4 a table set
- 16 nappies, various sizes and forms
- 12 bowls, various sizes and forms
- 7 punch bowls, various sizes and forms
- 6 jellies
- 4 playing card suit-shaped bonbon
- 2 salt and pepper
- 3 oils, various sizes and stoppers
- 5 jugs, various sizes
- 2 salvers
- 24 individual items
- 85 total**

The 34 items in 343½ break down as:

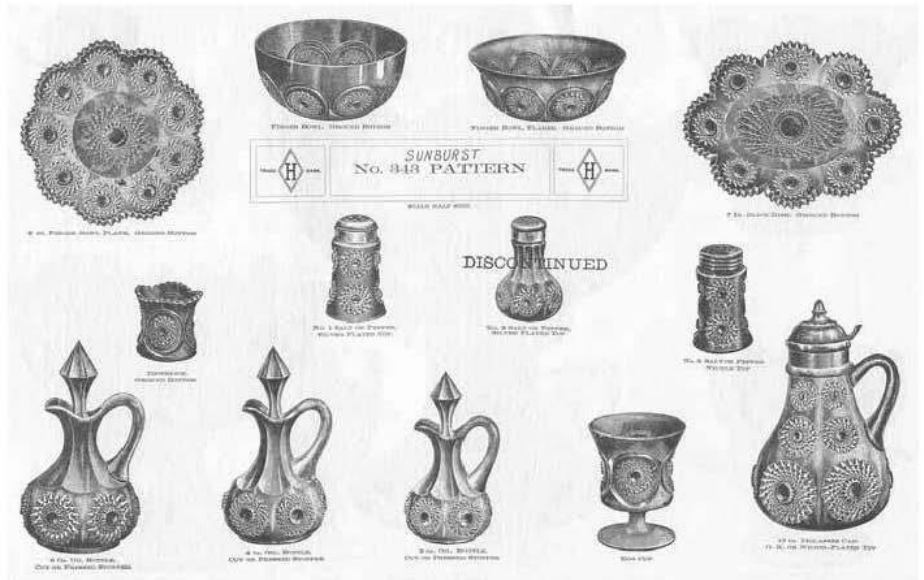

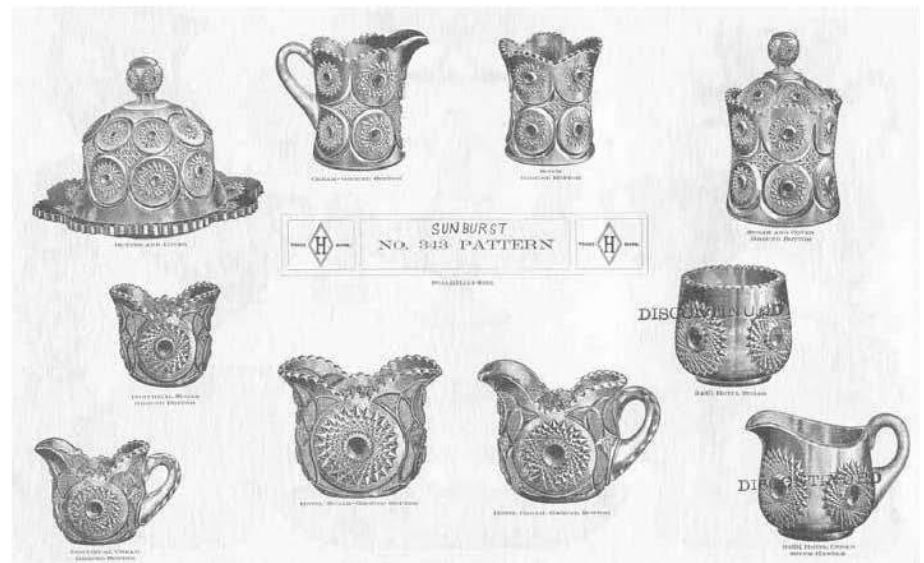

The five individual items made in 343½ are a tumbler, low punch bowl base, custard (punch cup), and hotel cream and sugar. The sunburst design in the 343 pattern is similar but not identical to the sunburst design in Heisey's earlier pattern, 1235 Beaded Panel and Sunburst. The centers of the sunbursts are different. Both patterns have a raised circle in the center of the sunbursts. In the 1235 Beaded Panel and Sunburst pattern this section is filled in with a smaller pressed star, while in the 343 Sunburst pattern this section is not filled in.

The 343 sunbursts are made large with a few on the piece or small contained in horizontal rows. The sunbursts come one after the other or are separated by areas of fine cut design. The sunburst may be surrounded by a plain surface or enclosed in a pressed circle. The big jugs have a row of punts around the top. The overall design is like a cut glass pattern. The sunbursts sometimes have also been referred to as chrysanthemums.

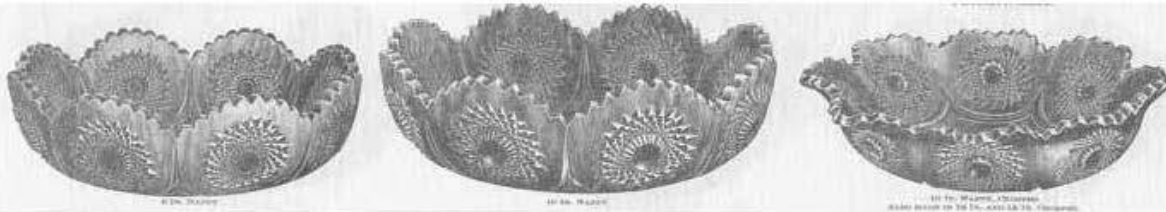
The 343 pattern was offered with three decorations. The No. 6 decoration was gold on the plain portions above and between the sunbursts or on plain portions surrounding the sunburst. There may be more, or fewer, variations. Most of the pattern items were offered with the No. 6 decoration. Decoration No. 75 was ruby color on the sunbursts, and decoration No. 76 was amber color on the sunbursts. The company price list for decoration No. 6 referred to the sunbursts as chrysanthemums.



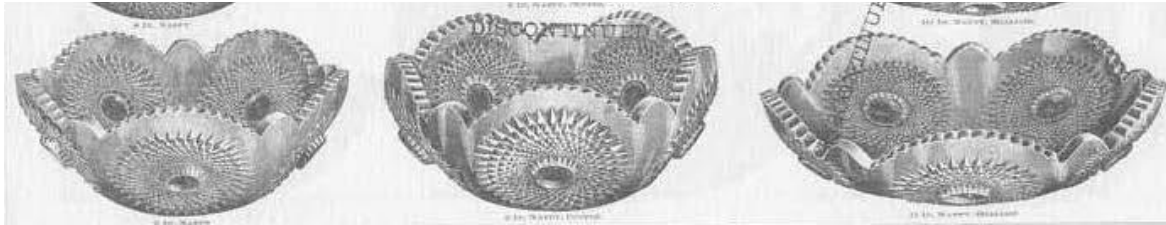
