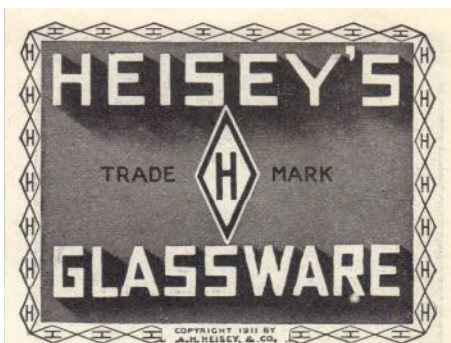

I hope you all will be "transplanted" to Newark June 15-17. Looking forward to our yearly visit.

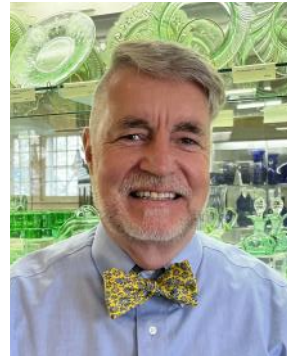

Proposed Change to the HCA Constitution and Bylaws

The HCA Board of Directors voted Dec. 19, 2022 to approve this proposed change to the HCA Constitution and Bylaws. It will be brought to a vote of the membership in June 2023. If a two-thirds majority vote in favor of it, HCA's voting membership requirement would be eliminated and all HCA members would be eligible to vote in HCA elections.

VOTING MEMBERSHIP PROPOSAL

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE III

Membership:

Section 1 There shall be ~~three kinds~~ **two categories** of membership, namely:

~~Voting~~

~~Associate Members~~

Honorary

Section 2 ~~3-Associate~~ Membership

Any person, upon payment of the prescribed dues, may become ~~an associate~~ a member of this organization. ~~Associate m Members are not permitted to vote or hold elective office, and they~~ shall have no interest in any funds or property of the organization.

Section 3 ~~4-Associate~~ Honorary Membership (unchanged)

Section 4 ~~2~~ Voting **Membership by Chartered Study Clubs**

~~Any adult, age 18 or over, upon payment of the prescribed initiation fee and yearly dues, is eligible to become a voting member of this organization. Other qualifications shall be as stated in the Bylaws . . .~~

ARTICLE VI

Board of Directors

Section 1 The Board of Directors shall consist of twelve (12) directors elected by the ~~voting~~ members of the organization.

Section 2 . . . The decisions of the Board in all organization matters shall be final, subject only to the appeal to the ~~voting~~ membership of the organization.



ARTICLE VIII

Surrender of Charter

Section 1 If this organization deems it desirable, by unanimous vote of the active **voting** membership, to terminate operation of this organization, all assets, records and monies shall be turned over to the Licking County Historical Society . . .

ARTICLE IX

Amendment of Constitution

Section 1 This Constitution may be amended only after recommendation by the Board of Directors and by a two-thirds vote cast of the **voting** members . . .

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I

Meetings

Section 4 Quorum

The majority of **voting** members present shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the membership.

ARTICLE VII

Election of Directors

Section 1

- b. At the second regular meeting of the calendar year, the President shall appoint a Nominating Committee of at least three members: the chairman shall be the immediate past President, then a **voting** member of the organization. If the immediate past President cannot serve, the chairman shall be another member of the Executive Committee, exclusive of the President.
- d. After the report of the Nominating Committee at the first regular meeting of the calendar year and upon motion of any **voting** member, any name or names of candidates for Director shall be placed upon the ballot to be voted upon by the organization.
- f. At the annual meeting there shall be furnished to the **voting** members a ballot containing the names of the nominees for Directors, upon which each **voting** member shall indicate his or her choices. If the number of nominees equals the number of Director vacancies, the ballot voting shall be deemed unnecessary if approved by the majority of the **voting**-members present.
- g. In lieu of obtaining a ballot at the annual meeting, a **voting** member may obtain a ballot by applying to the secretary in advance of the annual meeting and may cast said ballot by returning it immediately to the secretary.

Section 4

The Board of Directors shall consist of 12 members elected from the roll of the **voting** members . . .



ARTICLE VIII

Initiation Fees and Dues:

~~Section 1 The Initiation Fee for voting membership in the organization shall be \$ 25.00 and shall be paid before the candidate can qualify as a voting member. Membership dues shall be as determined by the Board of Directors.~~

Section 1 ~~2~~ Associate Membership Dues

Membership dues shall be determined by the Board of Directors which shall include subscription to the organization newsletter and all rights and privileges as provided in the Constitution. Each additional household member is eligible to become an ~~an associate~~ member upon payment of prescribed dues per year.

Section ~~3~~ 2 Study group (charter club)

The requirements to establish and maintain a Study group (charter club) are:

- a. All members must be ~~voting or associate~~ members of H.C.A. . . .

ARTICLE XI

Amendment of Bylaws and Constitution:

Section 1 The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the ~~voting~~ members present and voting at any regular meeting of the organization or as provided for absentee voting herein, after recommendation of the Board of Directors, or by any twelve ~~voting~~ members, provided written notice of such proposed amendments shall have been given to all ~~voting~~ members at least ten days prior to the meeting. The Bylaws may be amended by a majority vote of the ~~voting~~ members present and voting at any regular meeting of the organization, or as provided for absentee voting herein, after recommendation of the Board of Directors, or by any twelve ~~voting~~ members, provided written notice of such proposed amendments shall have been given to all ~~voting~~ members at least ten days prior to the meeting. With such written notice shall be sent a copy of proposed change or changes and a form to be returned to the Secretary, which form shall provide the opportunity to ~~voting~~ members to indicate approval or disapproval of each recommended change; which form, to be counted, must be received by the Secretary c/o the Museum at least three days prior to the scheduled meeting at which the vote on the recommended change or changes is to occur.

No amendments or additions to these Bylaws shall be made which are not in conformity with the organization Constitution.



Board Approves New and Revised Policies

Since June 2022, the HCA Board of Directors has approved several new and revised policies that apply to HCA and the museum. Those of most interest to members include the Nondiscrimination Policy, the Donations Policies, the Mileage Reimbursement Policy, and the New Arrivals Procedures.

Below is a brief description of each policy. The full policies are available on the museum website. If you do not have access to the website, contact HCA Secretary Mary Olson, 612-597-1284 or molson@heiseymuseum.onmicrosoft.com, and she will mail you a printed copy.

Approved June 14, 2022

Nondiscrimination Policy

This policy states that programs and activities of HCA shall be conducted without discrimination based on race, religion, national origin, sex, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, disability, or other non-merit criteria. It further states that we maintain a workplace free of discrimination, harassment, threats, intimidation and retaliation and that reported violations will be investigated. Consequences for violating the policy may include removal from office, termination of employment or termination of membership in HCA.

Approved Dec. 19, 2022

The policies below are all available in the new [Members Only](#) section of the website. (See page 9 for directions on accessing the Members Only section.)

Donations Policies

This is a series of four related policies. The first section applies to all donations and there are separate sections for:

- Donations of glassware and other Heisey-related items.
- Monetary donations.
- In-kind donations.

The policies cover such things as acknowledgement of donations, protection of donors' personal information, valuation of donated items, acceptance of items for the museum collection, communication about how contributions are being used, disposal of donated items when no longer useable or needed, and more.

Mileage Reimbursement Policy

This policy relates to mileage reimbursement for employees and volunteers. Employees are reimbursed at the current standard rate for business use as determined by the IRS. Volunteers are reimbursed at the current standard rate for charity miles as determined by the IRS; their travel must be approved in advance by the director/curator. Officers and directors are **not** eligible for reimbursement. Reimbursement forms for both staff and volunteers were approved with the policy.

New Arrivals Policy

This policy supersedes the New Arrivals Procedures approved in September 2012. It describes in detail how donations of new glassware made by A.H. Heisey & Company, or in Heisey molds, are handled. In addition, it provides directions for handling non-Heisey glassware; Heisey paper goods and ephemera such as original catalogs, advertising materials and company greeting cards; and books. It also includes procedures for items designated for the gift shop and monthly sales of items to members only for a limited amount of time. It specifies that museum staff, members of the Collections and Acquisitions Committee, and other persons involved in processing new donations are not eligible to purchase new arrivals until they are made available to members or the general public.

Members Only Section Available Now on Museum Website

After several months of planning, trial and error, testing and retesting, the HCA Members Only section of the website officially launched April 15. "We are pleased to be able to provide our members with easy access to minutes of our meetings, our financial documents, reports on our Endowment Fund and more," said President Suzanne Parker.

The site was made possible at no additional cost to HCA thanks to the technical skills of Board Member Caleb-Michael Files, who had assistance from Board Member Martha McGill and Secretary Mary Olson.

Members Only Section Available Now on Museum Website, continued:

The site currently includes:

Minutes of HCA Board of Directors meetings (2022 and 2023)	Minutes of HCA Executive Committee meetings (2022 and 2023)
Minutes of HCA General Membership meetings (2022)	Endowment documents (2017 through 2022)
Current year issues of Heisey News	Financial documents (year-end statements from HCA's accountants)

Meeting minutes for earlier years will be added with the ultimate goal of making all 50 years of minutes available.

To access the Members Only section, members must have an account on the museum website.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Q - I don't know if I have an account. How do I check?

A - You will have an account if you have already used the website to purchase an item or to register and pay for a convention or Percy and Vivian Moore Weekend event. If you aren't sure:

- Go to the website at www.heiseymuseum.org and scroll to the bottom of the homepage.
- Click on My Account, located at the top of the black rectangle.
- Under LOG IN on the left, enter your username or email address and your password and click the LOG IN button.
- If you can't remember your password, click on Lost your password? and follow the steps to create a new password.
- If your account is not found in the system, you will be notified. You must then create an account. Simply follow the steps below.

Q - How do I create an account?

A - Creating an account is quick and easy!

- Go to the website at www.heiseymuseum.org, scroll to the bottom of the homepage, and click on "My Account."
- Under Register on the right side of your screen, enter a username of your choosing, your email address, and a password that you have created.
- You will automatically be redirected to an account dashboard, this means your account creation was successful.
- Immediately you should receive an email that your web account has been created.
- Within 24 hours, you will receive a notice that your **membership has been confirmed** and you are able to access the Members Only section.

Q - I already have an account. How do I access the Members Only site?

A - Log into your account in the usual manner:

- Click on My Account at the bottom of the homepage.
- Enter your information to log in to your account and get to your account dashboard page.
- On your account dashboard page, click on the gray Access Members Only bar at the bottom left.
- If you have already logged in, you can go directly to the Members Only area by clicking on Members Only at the bottom of the homepage.

Q - Several members of my household are HCA members. Does each person need their own account?

A - All HCA members in your household are able to use the site, but at this time, only the primary member on your household's HCA account is eligible to create an account. All users in your household will need to log in with the same username/email address and password.

Q - Who can use information in the Members Only section?

A - This information is intended only for members, their agents and attorneys. Terms and conditions of use are posted at the bottom of the Members Only section. Please review them.

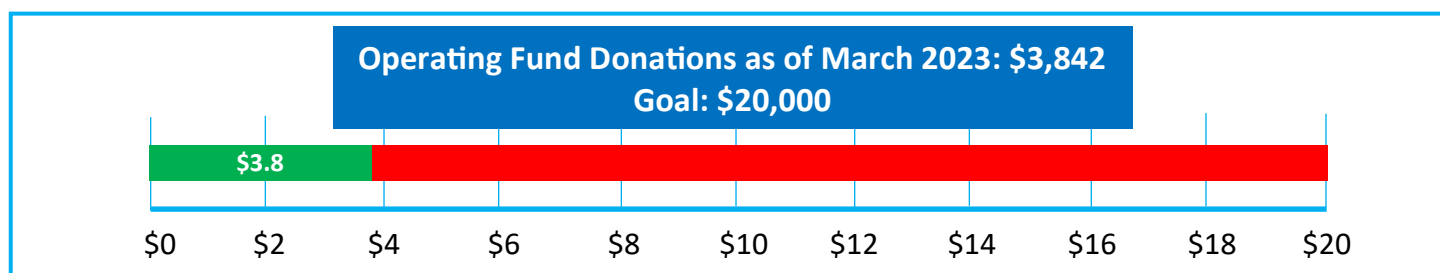
Treasurer's Report by Andy Baldus

HEISEY AUCTION NEWS



Thanks to everyone who made the Heisey Heritage Auction and the All-Heisey Spring Benefit Auction successful fundraising events again this year! The auction wrap-up articles and results will be posted on the website soon and published in the June *Heisey News*.

It's always interesting for the auction team to look at the auction "numbers." With the addition of online bidding, there are many more numbers available for review. Here are a few to share:

For the online only Heisey Heritage Auction, 101 people registered. Of the 101 registrants, 80 placed bids during the auction period (pre-bid or live bid). There were 56 winning bidders for the 372 lots sold in the auction. A total of 2,246 bids were placed, with over half of them occurring during the live portion of the bidding on April 8. By the end of the auction, there had been almost 19,000 views of the lots on HiBid and an additional 9,000+ views on AuctionZip.

The Spring Benefit Auction saw similar numbers with 102 online registrants, 80 of whom placed bids during the auction period. A total of 3061 bids were placed online with almost half placed during the live portion of the auction on April 14 and 15. There were 18,500 views of the lots on HiBid and another 13,000+ on AuctionZip.

By the end of the auction, 50 online bidders won approximately 38% of the 907 lots. At the Union Hall, about 60 live bidders won the remaining lots.

Heisey Rose Bowls and Ball Vases

An New, Original Article By Martha McGill

Throughout its history, A. H. Heisey and Company made a wide variety of floral containers. Many of them were simply called “vases” or “floral bowls.” Some, however, were designated for use with a specific flower, like roses or chrysanthemums or violets. Rose bowls are readily identifiable by their near-spherical shape, with openings of various sizes to accommodate the flowers.

Rose bowls were popular in Heisey’s early years, being included in at least 12 patterns introduced between 1896 and 1904. The most common sizes made were 4" and 7" (referring to the bowl’s diameter at its widest point). The No. 1255 Pineapple and Fan line offered the widest range of sizes, 2" (bud), 3", 4", 5", 6", and 7", in Crystal and Emerald. A tiny 2" rose bowl in Opal, probably made from the mold for the toothpick holder, was included in the No. 1295 Bead Swag pattern. The other rose bowls of the period were made in Crystal only. Most are not marked with the Diamond H. The Pineapple and Fan rose bowls are sometimes found with gold decoration on the fans; other bowls may also have gold or other decorations.

Unusual footed rose bowls, 3" in diameter, were offered in three early patterns: No. 325 Pillows, No. 335 Prince of Wales Plumes, and No. 343 Sunburst. They appear to have been made from the molds for the footed jellies in these patterns. All were made in Crystal only and are marked with the Diamond H.

One Colonial-style pattern, No. 351 Priscilla, included two styles of rose bowl, with and without a flared rim.

Production of most of these early rose bowls appears to have ended around 1910.

The rose bowl made a comeback of sorts in the mid-1920s, with the introduction of the No. 4157 Steele and No. 3359 Plateau rose bowls. Both have a rolled edge and a larger opening than the early rose bowls. They were made in the colors of the period, with a diamond optic. Rare examples of the Steele rose bowl are known in Tangerine with an opaque yellow rim and Tangerine slag, also with an opaque yellow rim. The Steele rose bowl can be found with Heisey's No. 9009 Arctic etching. These bowls are blown and are not marked with the Diamond H.

Two patterns introduced in the 1930s, No. 1425 Victorian and No. 1485 Saturn, also included rose bowls. Like the Steele and Plateau rose bowls, they have a larger opening than the early rose bowls but lack the rolled edge. The Victorian rose bowl, sometimes also called a "popcorn bowl," was made in Crystal and Sahara. The Saturn rose bowl (not to be confused with the No. 4085 ball vase with Saturn optic, discussed below) was made in Crystal and Zircon.

Sharing the spheroid shape of the rose bowls, but apparently intended for use with any type of flower, Heisey's ball vases made their first appearance in 1935 with the introduction of a ball vase in the No. 1469 Ridgeleigh line. A ball vase with a flared rim was added to the line in 1936. Heisey made these ball vases in Crystal only, but the version without a rim was reissued by Imperial in Crystal, Plum, Ultra Blue, and Sunshine Yellow.

In 1936, Heisey introduced the No. 1483 Stanhope pattern, designed by Walter Von Nessen. The line included a 7" ball vase, made only in Crystal.

The year 1936 also saw the introduction of the No. 4045 Heron ball vases in multiple sizes and colors. The following sizes were made: 3", 4", 6", 7", 9", and 12". The vases can be found in Crystal, Moongleam, Flamingo, Sahara, Cobalt, Alexandrite, and Tangerine with a wide optic. A few 2" vases were made, most of them in Cobalt. They were also made with a Saturn optic in Crystal and Zircon; those with Saturn optic were assigned the number 4085. Only Saturn optic was available after 1944. An entry in the company records indicates the 9" vase may have been made plain, without an optic.

Other companies made ball vases similar to Heisey's. One way to identify the Heisey products is by the number of wide optic panels. In sizes up to and including 7", the vases have 10 panels; the 9" and 12" vases have 12 panels.

The No. 4045 ball vases can be found with the following Heisey etchings and carvings: No. 469 Mermaids, No. 507 Orchid, No. 5013 Nymph & Satyr, No. 5015 Stripes, No. 5016 Stars & Stripes, and No. 9022 Jack Frost. The No. 825 Sea Glade cutting appears on the 4", 6", 7", 9", and 12" vases. Both the wide and Saturn optic versions were available with the following cuttings: No. 888 Madeira, No. 889 Sheffield, No. 890 Churchill, No. 891 Pembroke, and No. 892 Berkeley Square. The No. 900 Saratoga cutting was available on the 6" vase

with wide optic. Heisey ball vases are sometimes found with elaborate cuttings attributed to Emil Krall or Max Seidel. These examples of the cutter's art are prized by collectors.

Imperial reissued the 4" Heisey ball vase with a spiral optic in Crystal, Plum, Ultra Blue, and Sunshine Yellow. They also made the 9" vase with a "spike" optic (similar to wide optic but with 18 panels) in Crystal, Plum, Ultra Blue, Sunshine Yellow, and Emerald. The 9" vase was also made in Emerald and Blue Satin with no optic.

In 1941, Heisey introduced its No. 4004 "Polka Dot" line featuring a "spot optic" on stemware from the No. 4004 Jacobean line. The pattern was discontinued during World War II but brought back and re-named "Impromptu" in 1952. The 7" ball vase, made in Crystal only, is listed in Heisey's catalog no. 32, issued in January 1952.

Two additional items share the rounded shape of the rose bowls and ball vases but were called "violet vases" by Heisey. The small violet vase in the No. 1485 Saturn line is pressed, not blown, and has a slightly flattened shape. It was made in Crystal and Zircon and is marked with the Diamond H. A footed violet vase was offered in the No. 1519 Waverly pattern. Its shell-shaped feet reflect the pattern's "oceanic" motif. It is found with the No. 507 Orchid and No. 515 Heisey Rose etchings and the No. 942 Harvester cutting.

It Really Does Exist!

In *The Collector's Encyclopedia of Heisey Glass 1925-1938*, by Neila Bredehgoft, at the bottom of the #1252 Twist pattern she notes: "There is a cover known for the Oval Hotel Sugar, but this is rare." Since mentioning this, collectors have been searching in vain to find a lid for their sugar. Most collectors figured this lid was a myth, until mid-January 2023, when a Sahara set appeared on eBay with a starting price of \$20. Twenty dollars is a fair starting price for the cream and sugar without the lid, as they are common. Like a fool, I was hoping nobody would notice this auction. With five seconds to go and the current price at \$41, I pounced with my bid of \$137. Needless to say, I was outbid for the set, and it went for \$510. Evidently, a couple of people noticed this auction. That was one expensive lid!

It would be logical to believe the mold for the lid was designed at the same time as the cream and sugar that was first introduced in 1928. The colors of Twist at the time were Crystal, Flamingo, Moongleam and Marigold. Since the catalog pictures show the Twist Oval Hotel Cream and Sugar without a lid, it is also reasonable to believe that the public preferred the set without a lid.

Seeing the set in Sahara raises a few questions. Was the lid a special order for the cream and sugar? Would they have pulled out the mold to make just one? (Doubtful!) Was the mold for the set produced after 1930, when Sahara was introduced? Why haven't we seen more of these lids?

Looking at the lid, it is obvious that it was made specifically for the Oval Hotel Sugar. There is no other piece of Twist it could go on. It is squared off on both ends to accommodate the handles, and it bows down in the middle to match the curve at the top of the sugar bowl. When looking at the pictures, the lid does look a little "clunky," so that may be the reason why it could possibly not have been popular with the public.

Now that we know what to look for, the hunt is on!!! Hopefully, there are troves of these lids in all Heisey Twist colors sitting loose in boxes on the bottom shelf of your local antique or thrift store. One can only dream!

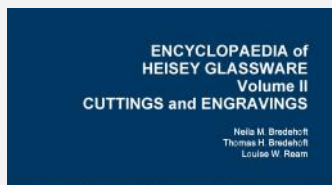

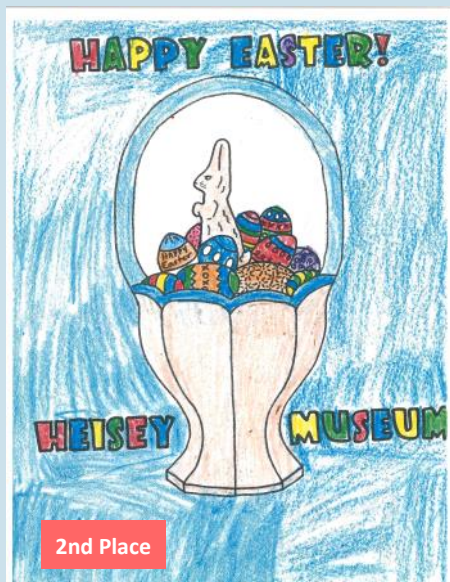
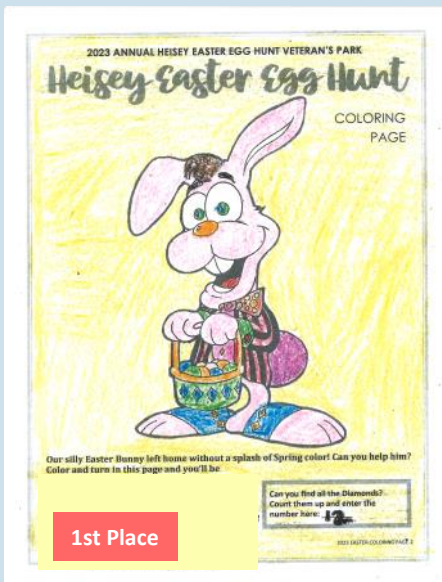
