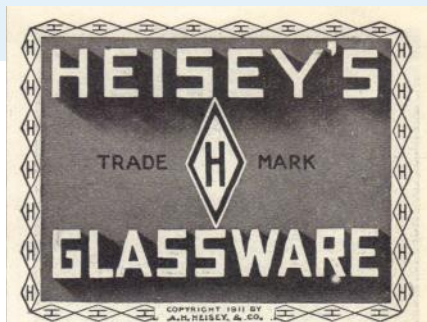

# Message From the President



Summer where have you gone? With September now upon us, the hot summer days are gradually giving way to cool autumn nights.

Reflecting on the past several months it was a busy time at the museum with convention, steady streams of visitors, car show, fall auction preparations, and participation at various local Newark events.

Our gift shop is becoming a shopping destination, not just for our members and visitors but also for the local community. Word has spread with outreach programs and local advertising that anyone is welcome to shop, not just those visiting the collection. July shop sales totaled \$10,979.43.

A limited number of the 2023 pumpkin, acorn, and petite Christmas ornament were produced and have been selling quickly. The “members only” one-of-a-kind acorn is just fabulous! I hope that you have ordered yours. All these items are limited and cannot be reordered.

New memberships are also on the increase with just over 1,000 paid memberships. A huge thank you to our staff who constantly promote our organization. Have you purchased a gift membership this year for a relative, a beginning collector or as a thank you for a current member?

The Dave Sphar Fall Select Auction glass on display at the museum is stunning and waiting to find a new homes with successful bidders. I hope you will have the opportunity to see it before the pieces are scattered throughout the country after the auction.

Recently I read that the spiritual meaning of September is linked to the refocusing of one’s energies. From the recent HCA committee reports submitted, impressive lists of energetic projects are being proposed. 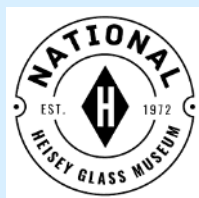

# Treasurer's Report



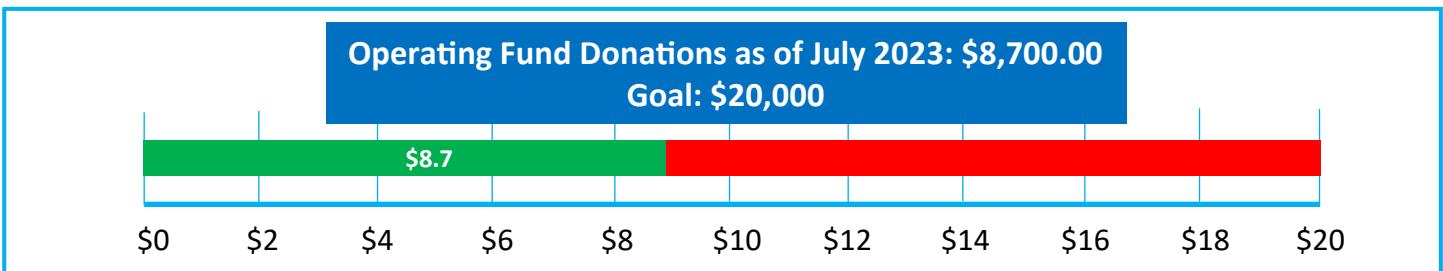
## September Report

## HEISEY AUCTION NEWS for SEPTEMBER

Hello Heisey volunteers!

The Fall Heisey Heritage Auction and the Dave Spahr Fall Select Auctions are just around the corner!

We are preparing for two great auctions, but we will need your help to make them happen.

I will arrive in Newark about noon Wednesday, October 11, and start setting up the tables in the multipurpose room in the museum. As soon as the tables are set and all the HHA glass has been brought down, we will start unfurling the glass. Once all the glass has been verified on the tables, we will start repacking the glass according to invoices provided by Karen Taylo.

Repacking will happen in three teams of two or three. One or two of each team gathers the glass, one prepares the boxes and labels and verifies all the correct glass for that bidder is present and one to start packing. Please remember, it is critical that the list is double-checked to ensure the proper glass is in each box. Once the glass is packed, the boxes will be staged for pickup. If there are any issues please see Karen, Mary Ann or myself and we will resolve them.

On Friday about 1 p.m., we will pack up the DSFSA glass in gallery three. This is a small area and can fit only three teams. Once the glass is packed, it will be loaded on the trailer with other auction items, and taken to the union hall, off loaded and, once the tables and hold back area are set, unfurl the glass. Again, if there are any issues, please see Karen, Mary Ann or myself.

We can have Saturday morning to finish unpacking glass, setting up chairs, the computers, video and audio, and other last-minute things.

Looking forward to a successful weekend for HCA with your help! Thank you!

# Highlights of the 2023 Fall Auctions

We have finished cataloging the items for the 2023 Fall HCA Auctions. You should have received your catalog by now. It was sent to all HCA members. Once again, we have two auctions. On Saturday, October 7, we will have our third Heisey Heritage Auction which will be an online only auction using the HiBid platform which has proven to be a very successful venue for our auctions. On October 14, we will have the Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction which will be both in person and online (HiBid). These auctions represent the full range of production of the Heisey Glass Company from their beginning until the doors closed in 1957. There is something for everyone in these auctions, from the standard production to true rarities that you seldom are given a chance to buy.

## HEISEY HERITAGE AUCTION

This auction offers 407 lots with a wide selection of Heisey glass. There is a full range of Heisey patterns, colors, and items to satisfy any collector. This auction has a great many No. 341 ½ Puritan jugs in a variety of sizes as well as a great selection of Heisey vases. Among the individual items available are a full 1425 Victorian punch set including Heisey ladle, as well as both sizes of 352 Flat Panel crushed fruits (Lots 33 and 34) and 429 Plain Panel Recess crushed fruits (27 and 28). Check your catalog for other items. It is surprisingly easy to register and bid on the HiBid platform so check it out and give it a try.

## DAVE SPAHR FALL SELECT AUCTION

With 322 lots this auction does offer a wide variety of different Heisey items, but it is the auction that you are more likely to find rarities that seldom come available. This year is no different in that we have many lots of special Heisey items ready for bidding. Early in the auction you will find a great selection of early water bottles (Lots 9-13) including No. 357 Prison Stripe (10) and the rarely seen 4063 Oval (11). This is followed by a group of items in Cobalt (14-20) including a No. 1404 Old Sandwich 18 oz. mug (19). Again, this year we have a great assortment of 325 Pillows (52-60).

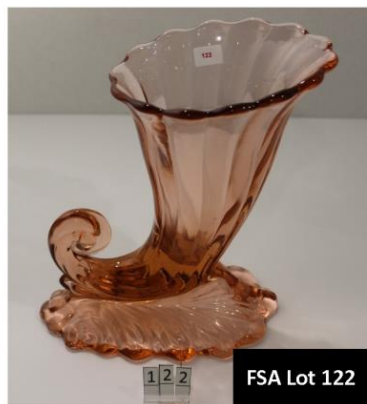

Tumblers are well represented in lots 101-106 and 157-166 with many rarities including a No. 3481 Glenford with Flamingo bowl and Moongleam foot (166). For the Greek Key collector, we have a great variety of items lots 182-189 including a Flamingo punch bowl set (190) and the shallow punch bowl (187) as well as the small puff box and hair receiver (184) and the larger puff (183).

There are four great cake salvers in this auction: No. 379 Urn (34), 325 Pillows (60), 1567 Plantation (306), and 1951 Cabochon (307). We have 9" No. 1428 Warwick vase in Cobalt (18), Flamingo (122), Moongleam (123), and crystal with frosted base (121). Outstanding candlestick offerings include a pair of No. 402 Gothic candelabra (192), full console set in 1405 Ipswich in Cobalt with crystal inserts (218), a pair of 72 Box Swirl (219), and probably the only set known of Alexandrite 4044 New Era candelabra with Alexandrite bobeches (217). There is a great selection of No. 517 Winchester '73 etch (Lots 252-257) including the cocktail shaker (257).



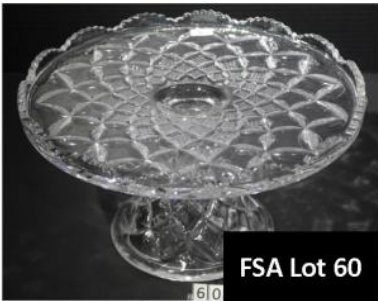

We have three nice pieces of No. 1483 Stanhope with red knobs: candy box (179) and vase (181) and with 490 Maytime etch the cigarette box (180). Three great Flamingo lots for the cologne collector are: 517 Circle pair cologne (130), 4035 No. 7 Octagon cologne with Duck stopper (131), and two 515 Taper colognes with 1186 Yeoman puff box (132). The animal collector will appreciate the 1 Mother Rabbit (112) and the 1519 Waverly lion trinket box (111). We have 1401 Empress 15" round trays in both Sahara (279) and Moongleam (280).

Other interesting items in the auction include: No. 1245 Star and Zipper 9" nappy, Emerald (47); 1121 Octagon individual salt with the Diamond H (78); 10 Muddler in Moongleam (80); 8025 Diamond Band footed salt (124); 1183 Revere cologne (127); 8042 jelly jar marked (133); a set of six 4044 New Era cocktails with 825 Sea Glade cut (206); three 1469 Ridgeleigh colognes in metal tantalus (214); six 2516 Circle Pair footed sodas, Flamingo (237); and a dozen 1401 Empress Flamingo goblets (241). Interesting etched pieces include a pitcher and two juices with No. 499 Good Morning etch (258), a 4163 Whaley mug with 466 Athletic Scenes in Border etch (265), a 1567 Plantation candy box with 516 Plantation Ivy etch (267), a 4205 Valli vase with 507 Orchid etch (284), and a 1429 Pristine floral bowl with 477 Japanese Scene etch

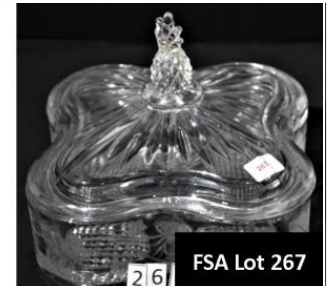

Other interesting items in color include: three favor vases - No. 4232 Sahara (73), 4230 Cobalt (74), and 4231 Tangerine (75); two animals in Amber - 1540 Plug Horse (107) and 1522 Standing Colt (108); 1637A Town and Country Limelight two-piece salad set (293) and two 8" plates (294); and 134 Trident floral bowl in Alexandrite (311).

Space limitations prevent me from going on, but as you can see there is plenty to offer in these auctions. I hope you will be able to join me and all of your Heisey friends for these great events. I look forward to seeing you either online October 7 or in person or online October 14.

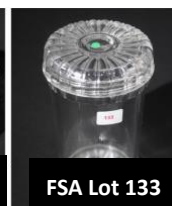

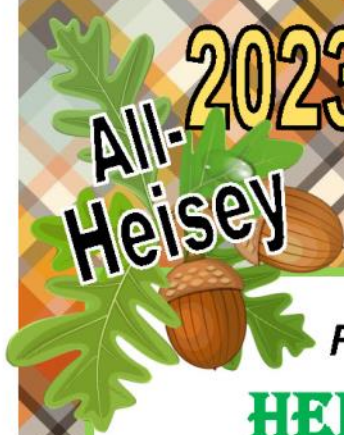

# DICK MARSH MEMORIAL

## AUTO SHOW REVIEW

### Heisey Glass and Classic Cars

Most collectors don't associate Heisey glass with classic cars but once a year the two come together to celebrate. The 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Dick Marsh Memorial Car Show was held at the National Heisey Glass Museum in Newark Sunday, July 30<sup>th</sup>. Once again hosted by the Buckeye Heisey Collectors Club under the direction of Linda Greenwood and Michael Maher, the show saw the largest gathering of cars and motorcycles in its history. A total of 125 vehicles of all makes and models registered to vie for over 40 door prizes. All of the the door prizes had been generously donated by individuals and businesses from the Newark area.

In addition to the door prizes, local sponsors also donated \$560 in support of the car show. And the ever-popular 50/50 raffle raised \$285.

Hot cars and hot weather made the sale of Velvet ice cream, served in real Heisey glass, a big hit again this year. Ice cream sales netted \$508. Many thanks to the Velvet ice cream company and Dick and Marilyn Smith for their donations of the ice cream and Heisey glass.

One of the goals of the car show each year is to bring awareness of the Museum to members of the local community. Cheryl Varrasso and Tina Wells welcomed the car show participants and patrons into the Museum to recover from the heat, eat some ice cream, view the glass collection, and visit the gift shop. At the end of the day, they had signed up 4 new HCA members and sold gift shop items totaling over \$1,400.

# A LOOK BACK at HEISEY HISTORY

## Nos. 462 and 462 ½ NAIL, 449 and 450 NAIL

By Joe Lokay (an encore article from the *Heisey News* June, 2009)

The No. 462 Nail pattern was a very small line consisting of only four nappies, two round and two square. The pattern was not offered in any of the Heisey Price Lists that we know about. It was first pictured in Heisey Catalog #76, circa 1915. Catalog #76 is a small supplement to Heisey's big Catalog #75, circa 1913.

Heisey filed for two design patents in this pattern, one for the square nappy and the second one for the round nappy. The two applications were filed on Oct. 8, 1913, and both were granted on Nov. 25, 1913. The square nappy is design patent #44,938 and the round nappy is design patent #44,939. The square nappies were given pattern number 462, while the round nappies assigned number 462 ½. Both styles may be seen on display in the museum.

Given the patent information, it is estimated that production of the Nail pattern started in 1914. Nail was not in Heisey Price List #179, circa Jan. 1, 1917. So it is estimated that production ended in 1916. Thus, the pattern life was about two to three years.

The overall design is plain as there are no colonial features such as panels or scallops. The design elements around the body are raised areas that look like nails or ice cream cones. There is no other design except for the typical Heisey star in the bottom. They were made in crystal only, and are signed with the Diamond H. Clarence Vogel named the pattern Nail.

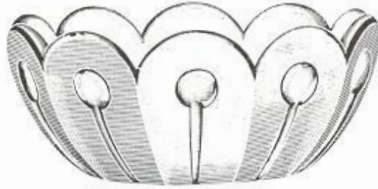
There are two vases that have the same nail design, but Heisey gave them different catalog numbers. They are also pictured in Heisey Catalog #76. The production life of the two vases was also for two to three years.

Heisey also used number 462 for the Plain Hexagon 8" basket. The basket body is 6-sided, and there are no nail designs. This basket was not part of the Nail pattern. Production of the basket started in 1916 and ended in 1932. It was made in crystal only and is signed with the Diamond H. It is unusual for Heisey to recycle a pattern number so quickly, but this may be the exception to the rule.

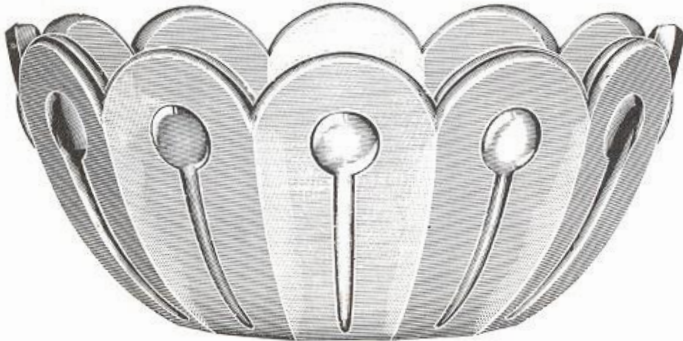
