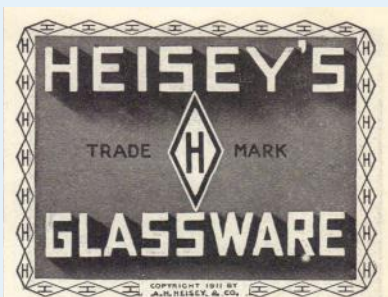

The beautiful Heisey glass sold at the Dave Spahr auction rivaled the autumn colors outside. The auction volunteers unselfishly gave their time for bidders to experience another exciting glass auction. The highlight of the auction was the sale of New Era No. 4044 Alexandrite Candlesticks for \$16,000. Thank you to the consignor and to the winning bidder.



Members who were in Newark for the weekend experienced our gift shop filled to the brim. Staff kept busy restocking shelves as members continued to purchase all things Heisey. Sales for the weekend exceeded the staff's expectations. It is no secret that Heisey collectors love to shop! Fresh Ohio cider and homemade apple doughnuts were served in the library for members and visitors, offering a time for visiting or quiet reflection. We are grateful for the members who donated these special treats.

There seems to be some confusion regarding the postings on the Members Only section of the HCA website. Minutes of membership, board of directors, and executive committee meetings are not posted until those minutes have been approved. The *Heisey News* postings in our Members Only section is current as a service to our members; *Heisey News* postings under the Education tab are a year in arrears. Also, comments that are posted on various social media sites are the personal opinions of the person posting them, not official opinions of the HCA Board of Directors or the organization. HCA has one official Facebook page – the National Heisey Glass Museum page – and strictly follows the Social Media policy adopted in 2021.

We are excited that all convention activities are returning to downtown Newark.

HCA MEMBERSHIP NEWS: Membership Meeting Provided Update on HCA Activities

HCA members got a quick update on activities of the organization when they joined the board for the fall Membership Meeting Oct. 14 at the historic Buckingham House in Veterans' Park.

President Suzanne Parker called the meeting to order, welcomed members and introduced board members, who were able to attend.

Board member David Blair, who chairs the Special Projects and the Grounds Maintenance/Landscaping Committees, reported that the museum reception desk will be named after the late Susan Bruah, membership and study club associate, who passed away June 12. "Susan loved greeting members from that desk, so it seems very appropriate to honor her memory in that manner," he said. He is working on a getting a plaque and photo of Susan to hang at the desk.

Board member Martha McGill, chair of the Bylaws Committee and member of the Policies and Procedures Committee, reported that several policies have been created or updated since last year. The Special Projects Policy has been updated and a new Records Retention and Storage Policy and a new Privacy Policy have been developed. The Privacy Policy is available now on the HCA website and Martha will provide copies of other policies to anyone who requests them.

President Parker summarized progress on planning next year's convention with the theme, "In the Heisey Garden." All events will take place in the downtown Newark area. "We are excited to have a new location for the convention glass show – The Skylight, which is the old post office building, built in 1911. The lighting is great; the windows are floor to ceiling so the glass should really sparkle," she said. There is a dedicated parking lot for the facility, which is used as a venue for weddings and other large events. It is located across the corner from the back side of the Hilton Doubletree Hotel. The convention banquet will be held at the Doubletree, which will reserve a block of rooms for \$105 per night. The Canal Market District, which is within walking distance of the Doubletree, has already been reserved for the glass flea market.

As a member of the Newsletter Committee, Martha encouraged members to share their collections with others by writing articles about them for *Heisey News*. If they need photos of specific pieces of glass to accompany their stories, she and Eric Tankesley-Clarke, also a board member, have many to share. Their contact information is always on Page 2 of *Heisey News*.

Representing the Education and Programs Committee, Eric announced an upcoming reprint of the *Heisey Candlesticks, Candelabra and Lamps* book, which has been printed twice but is now out of print. He has gone through the book line by line, page by page, and made updates and many additions. "There is a lot of new information and a lot of new pictures," he said.

Martha reminded members of the Heisey Club of California's raffle fundraiser in celebration of their 50th anniversary as a chartered club of HCA. The drawing was Oct. 22.

Dick Smith, chair of the Warehouse Committee and member of the Properties Committee, provided an update on selection of security cameras for museum buildings. Original bids were rejected, a new request for proposal (RFP) was written, and vendors were asked to bid. As of this past week, five sealed bids have been submitted. The committee will meet next week to review them and prepare a recommendation for the board.

Our thanks go out to the Licking County Historical Society, which most-graciously allowed HCA to use their space at no cost.

Treasurer's Report

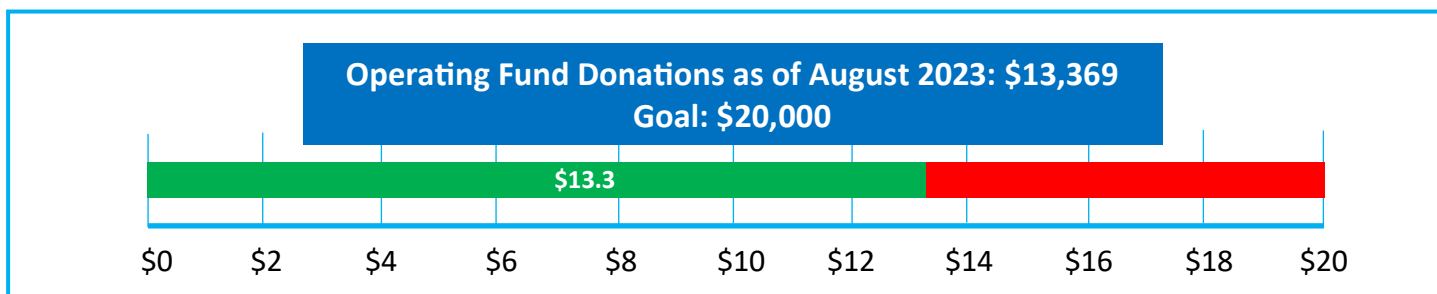


Overall, revenues are just shy of budgeted amounts as Convention and the Spring Benefit Auction came in under budgeted revenues. With strong performances during the Heisey Heritage Auction and Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction, I expect this shortfall to be made up soon.

We expect to have a readout on the Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction in the November Financials.

Our expenses year to date continue to be lower than budgeted month over month due solely to our gap in hiring a membership coordinator. This isn't to say that we aren't over budget on a number of line items. Legal fees as expected are 102% to total budget, advertising is sitting at 161% to total budget and dues/membership expenses are sitting at 205% to budget. These overages will all be taken into account when planning for 2024.

As throughout the entire year, our sales continue to be in a good position to beat our budgeted amount. With holidays fast approaching and Gift Shop Manager Cheryl Varrasso's focus on membership, I think we should be in good shape in these two line items.

2023 DAVE SPAHR FALL SELECT AUCTION WRAP-UP

We held our annual Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction on Oct. 14 at the GMP Local 244 Union Hall on Hudson Avenue. We, again, conducted a hybrid auction where we not only had in-person bidding but online bidding as well.

Our volunteers boxed up the auction glass Friday. We met at the Union Hall at 8:30 a.m. Saturday to “unfurl” the 322 lots of glass from our 24 consignors/donors. We finished in plenty of time for the preview from 11 a.m. to noon. We had another wonderful selection of glass this year!

The always entertaining Craig Connelly and cohort, Kevin Burchett, were our auctioneers.

Our auction began promptly at noon. The turnout for the auction was good - we had a crowd of approximately 75 with 42 individuals picking up bid cards, one absentee bidder and 104 online bidders. Bidding was robust with heavy competition for many of the special pieces in the auction. Some interesting online stats: the lots were viewed over 12,000 times and there were over 2,000 bids!

We had total revenues of \$62,026.60 with glass sales of \$61,100.00 for the 322 lots. Our payments to consignors and other expenses are still being calculated so we don't have a net figure yet but we fully expect to exceed our 2023 budgeted amount for the fall auctions.

Donated glass can have such a positive impact as 100% of the proceeds go to support the museum. This auction featured 65 donated lots which brought \$11,165.00!! We hope you will consider donating glass in the future.

Putting on an auction is a team effort and HCA has some great volunteers! I want to thank the volunteers who helped to make this a successful venture. They are listed in this newsletter- sorry if I missed anyone. I also want to recognize several individuals. Special thanks to Walter Ludwig and Eric Tankesley-Clarke who graciously lent their time and Heisey expertise whenever asked; to the museum staff, who helped coordinate events in Newark; to Mary Ann Spahr, Lisa Baldus and Karen Taylo, whose work made the event possible; and to Caleb-Michael Files and Doug Olson, who handled the online portion of the auction.

This was truly a team effort and could not have been done otherwise. When this team comes together, things happen. It is my profound pleasure to work with everyone on the Auction Committee.

Thank you to all who consigned and donated glass for the auction and to those who purchased this wonderful Heisey glass. If you are interested in consigning glass for the 2024 Spring Benefit Auction in April, the contract and glass list are located on pages 12 through 15. Hope to see you all in April 2024!

2023 HEISEY HERITAGE AUCTION WRAP-UP

The fall edition of our Heisey Heritage Auction (HHA) was a great success! We held the online only auction Saturday, Oct. 7. The auction was “well attended” with 101 online registrants. We had 407 lots of glass from seven consignors. Online pre-bidding for the auction started Saturday, Sept. 30th with live bidding starting at noon ET on Oct. 7.

Interested in some online stats? Of the 101 registrants, 85 placed bids. There were a total of 2,565 bids during the auction. The most viewed item was lot #362, the Yeoman platter in Marigold with 91 views. The most watched item was lot #9, the Prism Band decanter in Moongleam with the Crystal stopper with 18 “watchers.” The item with the most bids was lot #41, the Hoffman House goblet with narrow optic with 37 bids.

By the end of bidding, we had over 18,000 views of the lots in the auction.

We grossed \$12,501 from glass sales and buyer’s premium charges. Our average price per lot for this auction was \$28.44.

The cataloging of the HHA glass coincided with that of the Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction. Many thanks to all the volunteers from the August sessions, and to the October volunteers who arrived in Newark early to help pack the winning bidders’ glass. You are the key to the success of our auctions!

Thanks also to the consignors who consigned to the HHA and to all online bidders who helped make this event a successful fundraiser for HCA.



Putting an auction together is a huge undertaking and would not be possible without extraordinary teamwork. Please see page 8 for the full list of our dedicated volunteers.

hereafter referred to as **Member** and **Heisey Collectors of America, Inc.**, hereafter referred to as **HCA**, for glassware or glass related items consigned or donated for sale for the benefit of HCA in support of the National Heisey Glass Museum. Member, for the purpose of this contract, means HCA Member, Member’s representative, Administrator of Member’s estate, or other person legally responsible to make decisions on behalf of Member. Proper documentation may be required. Membership in HCA must be maintained until all glass is sold.

2) Auction Dates: April 7, 12, & 13, 2024 Glass delivery by December 30, 2023

3) Auction Location: GMP Local #244 Union Hall, 350 Hudson Avenue, Newark OH 43055

4) Terms & Conditions of Auction: *see page 3*

5) **Commission:** The Member providing glass to HCA for sale under this contract will be charged the following sliding scale commission per lot: \$5.00-\$50.00 = 40%; \$50.01-\$200.00 = 30%; \$200.01-\$400.00 = 20%; \$400.01-\$750.00 = 15%; \$750.01 and over = 10%.

6) **Settlement:** Payment (settlement) to the Member for glass sold will be made in full from the HCA Auction Trust account no later than fifteen days after the auction. The Member and HCA agree no payments will be required in less than fifteen days.

The HCA Auction Trust account is set up and operated consistent with ORC Section 4707.024. HCA is responsible for the collection of funds. HCA will pay expenses associated with the auction, including but not limited to, auction site rental and advertising fees, with money from the Trust account.

7) **Bad Checks/Unpaid Items:** HCA is responsible for bad checks, debts, and unpaid items.

8) **Auction and Bidding:** This auction is an **Absolute Auction**.

"Absolute Auction" means an auction of real or personal property to which all of the following apply: (1) The property is sold to the highest bidder without reserve; (2) The auction does not require a minimum bid; (3) The auction does not require competing bids of any type by the seller or an agent of the seller; (4) The seller of the property cannot withdraw the property from auction after the auction is opened and there is public solicitation or calling for bids unless no bid is made within a reasonable time.

"Reserve Auction" means an auction in which the seller or an agent of the seller reserves the right to establish a stated minimum bid, the right to reject or accept any or all bids, or the right to withdraw the real or personal property at any time prior to the completion of the auction by the auctioneer.

Absentee bids are bids left by buyers prior to the auction and executed in a competitive manner. HCA does not use the full bid amount as a starting bid. Bidding is initiated from the floor then offered on behalf of the absentee bidder at the next increment continuously until bidding has stopped. (Example: Absentee bidder leaves a bid with a maximum amount of \$500.00. After item is sold through competitive bidding, the absentee bidder is successful for \$325.00.) The Member may donate an unlimited number of lots to HCA for sale at auction. HCA, however, at its discretion, will consign donated items for auction, add donated items to the museum collection, and/or sell donated items in the museum shop.

Once received, and in preparation for sale, the HCA Auction Committee will examine the glass, make corrections to accurately describe the glass, and reject glass deemed not acceptable for this auction. If the Member wishes, rejected items will be returned at Member expense. Otherwise, the items become the property of HCA.

11) Responsibility: It is the responsibility of the Member to deliver the glassware to the National Heisey Glass Museum by December 30, 2023. HCA accepts responsibility for the glass once received at the Museum and until it is sold. Glass damaged in shipment to the Museum will be referred to the shipper and Member. Glass damaged or lost while in the possession of HCA prior to sale will be valued by qualified appraiser(s) and the Member will be paid, less commission.

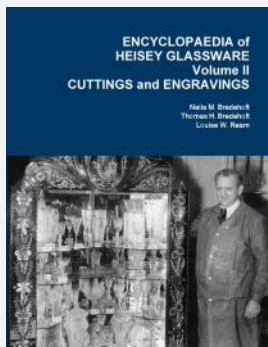
