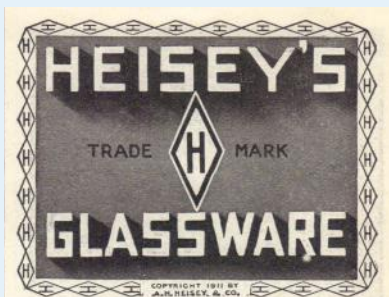

While Olivia Claggett performed on the harp during the evening, our guests nibbled holiday cookies and sipped punch from Heisey punch cups. Younger visitors took advantage of making their own holiday decorations during the punch cup workshop in the museum's multipurpose room. Many of our guests shared that they anticipate and appreciate HCA's hospitality for this event year after year. Thank you to the Buckeye Club, volunteers, and staff for many hours of preparation, donations of cookies and candies, and being present to welcome guests. I hope Santa treats you well.

Have you finished your holiday shopping? Did you purchase this year's tree ornament? Only a few are left, so you need to let Santa's helpers know. Remember, time is running short to order from the gift shop for that last minute gift of Heisey. ## Fundraising Committee Update

This year, a new committee was formed to spearhead raising funds for HCA and the museum. The committee comprises James Warren (Chair) and Mary Cameron. The committee has been meeting bi-weekly, and we are very excited to move our goals forward.

We have worked with the Properties Committee to assess the museum's needs and concluded that the first order of business is to work on HVAC replacement.

The Museum runs seven HVAC systems; the oldest unit is from 1994, and several others are close in age. As these units approach the 30-year mark, the change-outs will be beneficial in many ways, most importantly, energy efficiency and consumption. We are working to get quotes on the replacements, so we have a firm goal to report to you soon.

We understand this is a big project, and we will roll out several fundraising campaigns over the next year, but our first campaign will be selling 20 to 25 curated items from the "hold back" and "feasibility" items the museum has.

Many are one-of-a-kind items you won't see every day. The highlight is a Flying Mare made for HCA by Dalzell Glass in Ice Blue.

We are working in tandem with the Auction Committee to facilitate the sale, and we will be working with them to announce this in the near future.

If you would like to contribute to the HVAC funds, your donation can be made at or mailed to the museum. Please earmark the donation for the "HVAC Fund."

### October Meeting Highlights

In an effort to improve communication with members, the HCA Board of Directors is sharing brief highlights from board meetings via *Heisey News*. Official minutes of meetings will be available in the Members Only section of the website **after** they have been approved by the board at the next meeting.

#### Newsletter:

- The board is considering outsourcing printing of *Heisey News* for several reasons. Acting Director Jennifer Miller provided a quote from one Newark area printer. The board asked her to secure additional quotes and a full cost analysis including paper, labor, and the terms of the existing copier lease.
- Due to constantly increasing costs for postage and envelopes, the fee for members who request first class mail delivery of *Heisey News* will increase to \$50 per year beginning with 2024 membership renewals.

#### Museum issues:

- **Security cameras:** The Properties Committee will review five quotes for security cameras and develop recommendations and a comparison table for the board. **Update:** During a special board meeting Nov. 7, the board eliminated three vendors from consideration and developed a list of additional questions to ask of the remaining vendors. The board plans to meet Dec. 6 to discuss the additional information.
- **Air conditioning:** Following a discussion of concerns with air conditioning systems, the board approved expenditures to replace bearings and coolant as needed.
- **Drinking fountains:** The board asked Jennifer to bring in a plumber to do the work necessary to turn on the drinking fountains, which were turned off due to COVID-19.
- **Remembering Susan Bruah:** The board approved naming the reception desk after the late Susan Bruah, longtime membership and study club associate who died in June. A plaque and photo of Susan will be placed at the desk.
- **Technology support:** After considering three proposals for technology support, the board accepted a proposal from Ahelio Tech to provide 24-hour tech support. Expertise is needed to implement new technology and provide greater data security.

#### Convention 2024 – “In the Heisey Garden”

- The committee reviewed survey data from the 2022 and 2023 conventions before developing plans for 2024.
- All events will be held in the downtown Newark area: the banquet at the Doubletree Hotel, the glass show at The Skylight event center in the old post office, and meetings and seminars returning the museum.

#### Study Club opportunities

- The board approved access for chartered study clubs to the museum’s TEAMS virtual meeting platform.
- The board approved a new advertising policy that provides each chartered study club with a free half-page advertisement each year.

#### Education Committee – Heisey resource books

- Eric Tankesley-Clarke is working on a new edition of the *Heisey Candlesticks, Candelabra and Lamps* book, which will include many updates, additions, and a number of new photos. He is also updating the *Index of Heisey Glassware*.
- The committee is working on details necessary to reprint *Heisey Glass 1896-1957* by Tom and Neila Bredehoft.

#### Fundraising Committee – special auction

- The board approved the committee’s proposal to auction a number of Heisey reproductions known as “hold back” items, which have been in storage at the museum, as part of an already planned auction of Heisey animal reproductions made by Imperial and others. It will be held online April 7, 2024.
- Funds will be earmarked for replacing aging components of the museum’s heating-ventilating-air conditioning (HVAC) systems as needed.

# Treasurer's Report

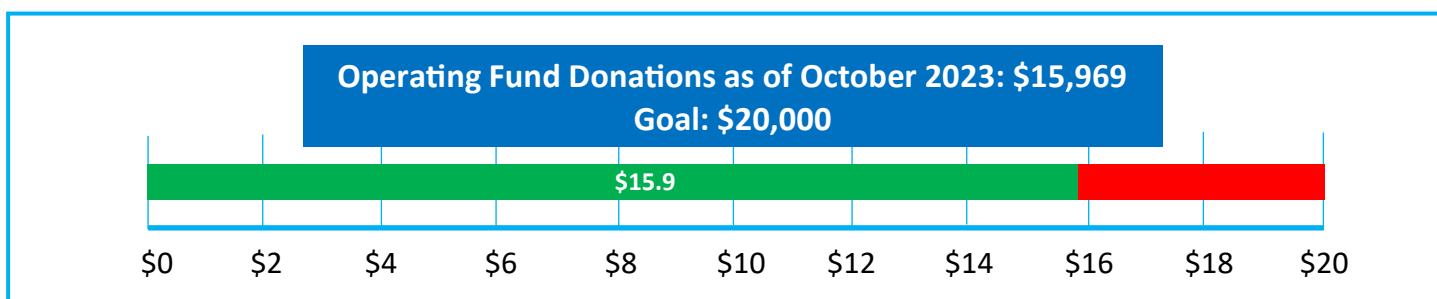


October was a great month for revenue at the museum. The fall auctions (HHA and DSFSA) were a tremendous success this year. On the strength of donated items and excellent glass consignments, the auctions will net over \$22,000. Gift shop sales remained strong for the month.

Cash donations added another \$2,600, inching us closer to our goal of \$20,000 for the year. Endowment donations totaled \$1,685. Please add the museum to your holiday gift list with a donation to support the Operating or Endowment Fund.

Expenses remain under budget mainly due to lower salary and utility costs.

As 2023 comes to an end, we thank our members for their support throughout the year. We look forward to a successful 2024....with your continued support!

## A Christmas Letter from T. Clarence Heisey

Dear Rod:

Every season about this time for the past three years we have looked forward to the passing of the old year with much rejoicing, like one would discard a husky set of red flannel underwear that we had been sewed up in all winter, and which had been giving us the itch for many moons. In other words, the New Year looms up to us as a haven of hope, prosperity, comfort and general well-being. But every one for the past several New Years has been worse than the last, and we have all wished many times that we could have 1930 or 1931 back with us again. Maybe you are more fortunate than we are, but I know we have wished it many times, and yet we have all fared much better than a lot of people.

We all still have our heads above water, and most of us have our health, which is something for which to be thankful. The best of it all is that things really look like they are on the up and up, and we have really made some encouraging progress since last October. If we could have twelve months like our last November, we wouldn't care how long 1934 lasted. We think that these twelve months will be big ones if we all do our part---the factory and those of you who represent it. We believe business is there if we will fight for it, and certainly glass is in the limelight if it ever was in its history.

We find ourselves wandering from what we started to say when we began the preceding paragraph. What we really started to say was that it is a grand and glorious feeling to again sense the pulse of progress, and we know it is stimulating to you to find your business quickening. However, we feel that we would be derelict in our appreciation if we did not sincerely thank you for your loyal support, courage and earnest endeavor in assisting the factory to keep the fires going in the old


furnace(an achievement that has been the hardest in the entire forty years of the factory's existence).

While none of us are returning home to the old Yule log staggering under a roll, still we all are looking forward to a very jolly Merry Christmas, and to a year full of promises, progress and prosperity.

Clarence Heisey as the company looks to turn the corner during the Great Depression. This Christmas message was surely an inspiration to the salesman that received it and reflects beautifully the character of Mr. Heisey and his support and appreciation of the company's employees and sales representatives.

*Working in the Heisey Museum archives can have its dry moments, but that is never the case when reading the correspondence of T. Clarence Heisey. Through his letters you can quickly get the sense of a man with great wit and charm, who had a legion of friends from his college days at Amherst and through business, politics and the world of show horses. Not least of these were the factory workers who considered him one of their friends. The late Helen Pallagi, former Heisey factory worker and HCA member, remembered "Mr. Heisey" visiting the factory floor every day, greeting by name everyone he saw. He was always dressed immaculately with a white carnation in his lapel.*

*On pages 8 and 9 is a copy of Rod Irwin's 1933 Christmas greetings from T. Clarence Heisey, who annually wrote such letters to the salesmen. In this holiday missive, his traditional themes of love of home, family, factory and country are expressed.*

*The National Recovery Administration (NRA) was one of several federal agencies created by Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal. It was established in 1933 to encourage economic recovery by bringing together business, workers, and the government to establish fair practices in wages, working conditions, prices, and competition.*

Proper documentation may be required. Membership in HCA must be maintained until all glass is sold.

2) Auction Dates: April 7, 12, & 13, 2024 Glass delivery by December 30, 2023

3) Auction Location: GMP Local #244 Union Hall, 350 Hudson Avenue, Newark OH 43055

4) Terms & Conditions of Auction: *see page 3*

5) **Commission:** The Member providing glass to HCA for sale under this contract will be charged the following sliding scale commission per lot: \$5.00-\$50.00 = 40%; \$50.01-\$200.00 = 30%; \$200.01-\$400.00 = 20%; \$400.01-\$750.00 = 15%; \$750.01 and over = 10%.

6) **Settlement:** Payment (settlement) to the Member for glass sold will be made in full from the HCA Auction Trust account no later than fifteen days after the auction. The Member and HCA agree no payments will be required in less than fifteen days.

The HCA Auction Trust account is set up and operated consistent with ORC Section 4707.024. HCA is responsible for the collection of funds. HCA will pay expenses associated with the auction, including but not limited to, auction site rental and advertising fees, with money from the Trust account.

7) **Bad Checks/Unpaid Items:** HCA is responsible for bad checks, debts, and unpaid items.

8) **Auction and Bidding:** This auction is an **Absolute Auction**.

*"Absolute Auction" means an auction of real or personal property to which all of the following apply: (1) The property is sold to the highest bidder without reserve; (2) The auction does not require a minimum bid; (3) The auction does not require competing bids of any type by the seller or an agent of the seller; (4) The seller of the property cannot withdraw the property from auction after the auction is opened and there is public solicitation or calling for bids unless no bid is made within a reasonable time.*

*"Reserve Auction" means an auction in which the seller or an agent of the seller reserves the right to establish a stated minimum bid, the right to reject or accept any or all bids, or the right to withdraw the real or personal property at any time prior to the completion of the auction by the auctioneer.*

The Member or a person on behalf of the Member may make a bid on a lot the Member consigns or donates if the auction is a reserve auction, and the auctioneer provides full disclosure before bidding that the Member retains the right to bid. Absent this disclosure, Members cannot bid or have others bid on their behalf on their own consigned or donated items and said bidding would constitute bid rigging and be in violation of ORC 4707.023.

**9) Absentee Bidding:** The Member and HCA both agree that absentee bids will be accepted by HCA. The minimum absentee bid on a lot will be \$15.00 with a minimum opening floor bid of \$5.00. Absentee bids are bids left by buyers prior to the auction and executed in a competitive manner. HCA does not use the full bid amount as a starting bid. Bidding is initiated from the floor then offered on behalf of the absentee bidder at the next increment continuously until bidding has stopped. (Example: Absentee bidder leaves a bid with a maximum amount of \$500.00. After item is sold through competitive bidding, the absentee bidder is successful for \$325.00.) HCA reserves the right to accept or reject any and all absentee bids. HCA is not responsible for misfiled bids that are not executed.

**10) Consignments:** Items consigned or donated for sale must have been made by the A.H. Heisey and Company. Reproductions will not be accepted, except those made from original Heisey moulds or as commissioned by HCA. The Member agrees to accept responsibility for providing merchantable title for glass sold.

The Member may consign no more than 40 lots. There is no limit to the number of items in each lot, but HCA retains the right to determine the size and/or make-up of each lot. The Member's glass list is attached and is an integral part of this contract.

The Member may donate an unlimited number of lots to HCA for sale at auction. HCA, however, at its discretion, will consign donated items for auction, add donated items to the museum collection, and/or sell donated items in the museum shop.

Once received, and in preparation for sale, the HCA Auction Committee will examine the glass, make corrections to accurately describe the glass, and reject glass deemed not acceptable for this auction. If the Member wishes, rejected items will be returned at Member expense. Otherwise, the items become the property of HCA.

**11) Responsibility:** It is the responsibility of the Member to deliver the glassware to the National Heisey Glass Museum by December 30, 2023. HCA accepts responsibility for the glass once received at the Museum and until it is sold. Glass damaged in shipment to the Museum will be referred to the shipper and Member. Glass damaged or lost while in the possession of HCA prior to sale will be valued by qualified appraiser(s) and the Member will be paid, less commission.

**12) HCA and the Member agree that:**

- a) A signed copy of this contract **MUST** accompany glass consignments;
- b) The items will be sold to the highest bidder without reserve;
- c) HCA and/or its auctioneer, has the right to accept or reject any or all bids;
- d) HCA has the right to establish a minimum opening bid;
- e) The Member may not withdraw the lot(s) at any time prior to the completion of the auction;
- f) In the event no bids are received on a lot, the lot becomes the property of HCA;
- g) The auction will take place in person, on-line or both;
- h) The Member affirms he/she has a bona fide intention to transfer ownership of the property to the highest bidder.

# A LOOK BACK at HEISEY HISTORY

## No. 365 Queen Anne

By Joe Lokay (an encore article from the *Heisey News*, March 2009)

The No. 365 Queen Anne pattern was introduced at the Pittsburgh, PA, glass manufacturer's show in January 1907. On July 9, 1906, A. H. Heisey & Company applied for a design patent for the Queen Anne pattern. The spoon holder from the four-piece table set was pictured to illustrate the pattern design. The patent was granted August 28, 1907, and given patent number 38,200. The first and only Heisey price list to offer the 365 Queen Anne pattern was #142, circa 1908. The production list with this article is from that price list.

Many pictures of 365 Queen Anne items were shown in Heisey Catalog #56, circa 1909. No pieces of the pattern were shown in Heisey Catalog #75, circa 1913. Nor was the pattern offered in Heisey Price List #155, circa 1910. It appears that Queen Anne was discontinued in about 1910. Thus, the life of the pattern was for about three years.

A total of 78 items in the 365 pattern were offered in Price List #142. There were 23 various nappies, five sizes of plates, four bon bons, six punch bowls, four jugs and four pieces of stemware. There is a toothpick and punch cup for the collectors, as well as oil bottles and salt and pepper shakers.

The design of 365 Queen Anne is very distinctive. A shield-shaped ornamentation on each panel encircles the body of the item. The panels are separated by a vertical cut or, as some may call it, a concave flute.



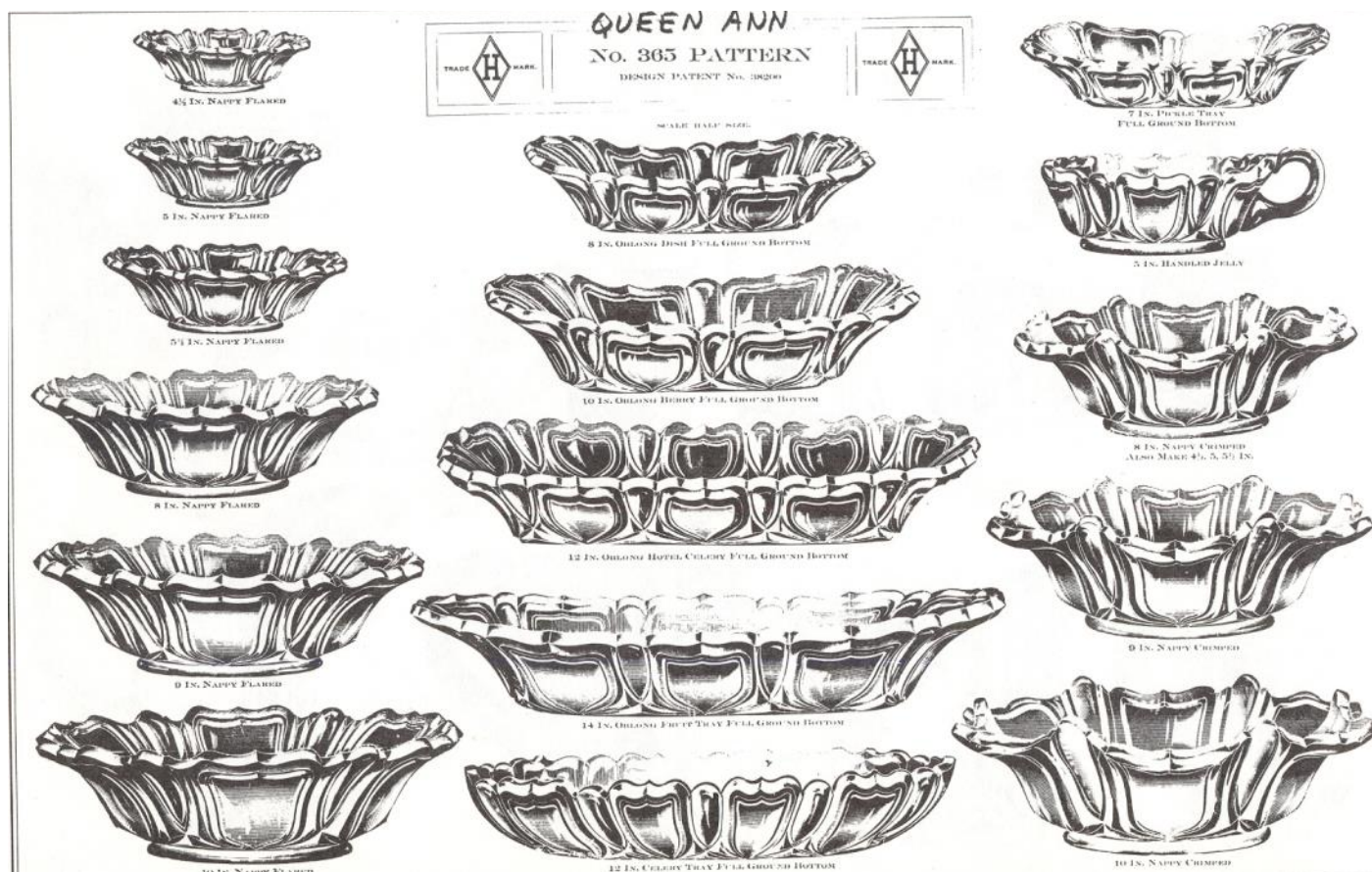

some pieces, the shields appear inverted. The pattern was made in Crystal only, and pieces are usually signed with the Diamond H. Pieces are known with the shields decorated with gold, ruby stain, or ruby stain trimmed with gold. Pieces with ruby stain are especially nice and bring an added premium to the price.

The name Queen Anne is actually a company appellation for the pattern, going against the standard company policy of the time of only having a pattern number representing the pattern. This, of course, leads to some confusion since the company resurrected the name in the 1930s when the No. 1401 Empress pattern was redesigned with the addition of an optic. The No. 1509/5009 Queen Ann pattern bears little resemblance to its older ancestor, the 365 Queen Anne pattern. The two names are distinguished with the addition of an “e” on the name of the earlier pattern. Collectors often will call 365 “Early Queen Anne,” while calling 1509 “Late Queen Ann.”

The 365 Queen Anne pattern is avidly sought out by collectors today, and its short production life means that there are not enough pieces around to fulfill demand. Pieces in the pattern do command a premium when they reach today’s market. It truly is one of Heisey’s best designs of the period; no other company produced anything comparable. **(More illustrations of No. 365 Queen Anne on pages on pages 18 and 19.)**

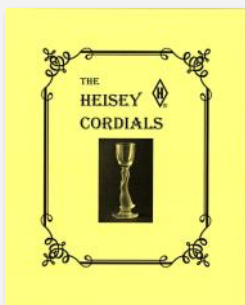

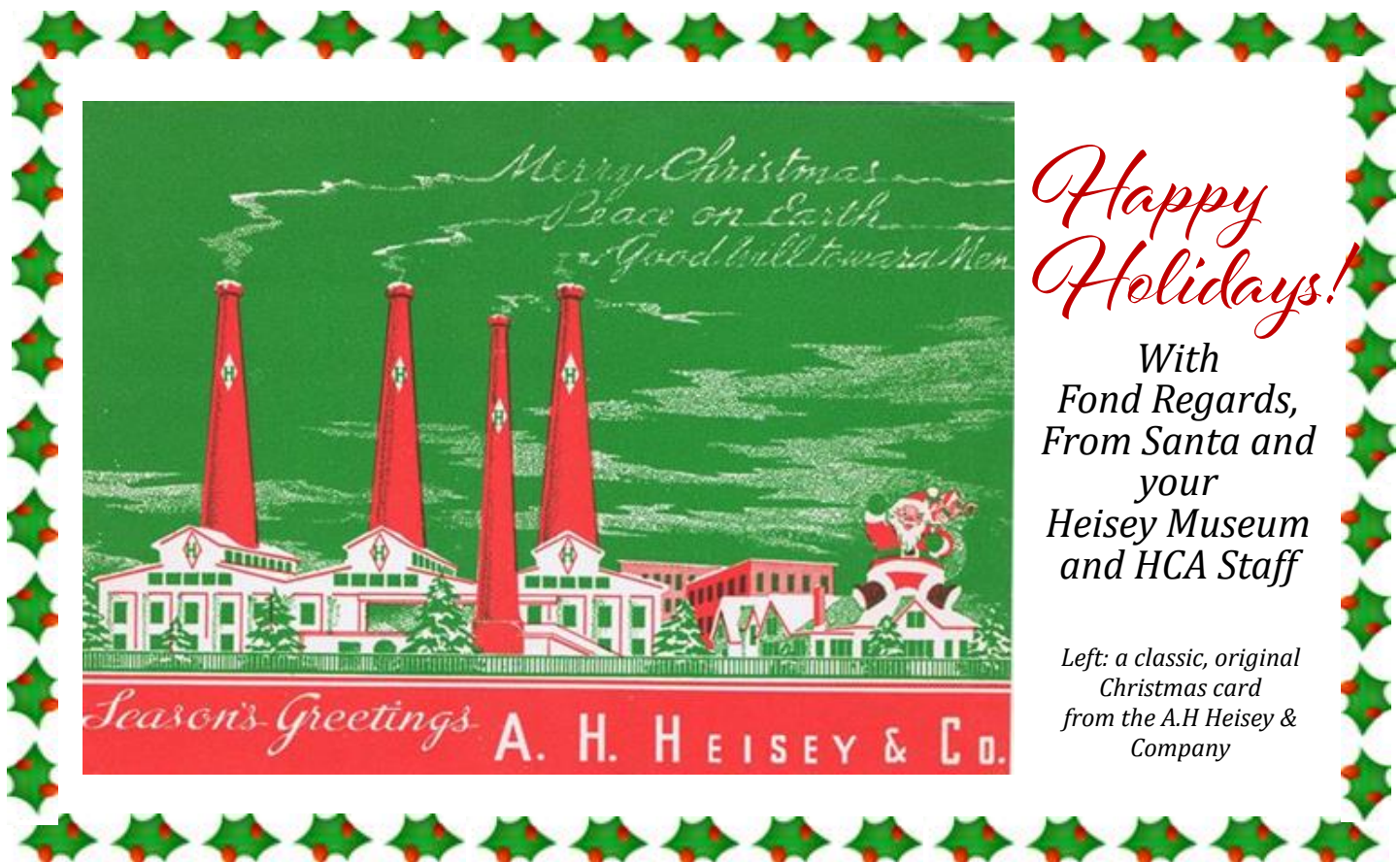
