Happy New Year!

The beginning of this new year is one of celebrations for Heisey Collectors of America. I am pleased to announce the long-awaited installation of a security camera system at our museum.



During the past year, many of you have shown continued interest in the selection of security cameras for the museum. After a thorough request for proposal (RFP) process, our board of directors has awarded a contract to the highly reputable national security firm, ADT. This decision was made with careful consideration to ensure we collaborate with a partner who understands our unique needs and can provide top-tier security solutions.

Your inquiries and concerns highlight your dedication to the safety and preservation of our museum's invaluable assets and to a safe environment for museum visitors and staff. The completion of this long-anticipated project is a testament to the hard work and dedication of the Properties Committee, the Board of Directors, and Interim Director Jennifer Miller.

Other, but not inclusive, accomplishments the BOD and our member committees completed during this past year include the successful and profitable April and October auctions, replacement of the fountain in the courtyard, adoption of a proactive management plan for museum maintenance, a successful convention, the well-received acorn and pumpkin fundraising project, and selection of a new information technology (IT) support contractor.

Under the leadership of the Policies and Procedures Committee, the BOD began the task of reviewing HCA policies and procedures and found many outdated or lacking in detail. Organization policies provide a general framework for the organization.

The policies that were updated or added this year include: Advertising Policy, Special Projects Policy, Records Retention and Storage Policy, Policy for Accepting Member Glass for Consignment, Mileage Reimbursement Policy, New Arrivals Procedures, Donations Policy, and Privacy Policy. Each was published in *Heisey News* as they were adopted to ensure members' awareness.

Through active participation with local business and historical groups, the museum staff has increased our historical and commercial presence in the community. We owe them a debt of gratitude for the community outreach they do to promote HCA.

The BOD would like to thank the membership for your continued and valuable support of generous financial donations and volunteering efforts as we continue to preserve the legacy of the A.H. Heisey & Company. As we begin another year, consider how you can be effective in our organization.

I wish tremendous joy and good health for you and your family this year.

New Venue for Heisey Glass Show and Sale!

Dealers – Reserve Space Early!

Dealers! Your glass will sparkle in natural light this summer when the **2024 Heisey Glass Show and Sale** moves to a lovely new location at The Skylight - the historic Newark post office, which is now a lovely event center with marble floors and pillars and enormous windows. The glass show is the highlight of the annual HCA convention. The convention is June 13 - 15 2024 and themed *In the Heisey Garden*.

Located downtown at 85 E. Main Street, The Skylight is a bit smaller than the ice arena where the show has been held for many years, so reserve your tables early to be assured of getting a space. The deadline is March 29.

Booth sizes range from small (three 8-foot tables) to large (eight 8-foot tables). A mini booth of one 8-foot table will also be available this year; it's great for study clubs to fundraise or those wishing to downsize a collection. Fees for booth sizes remain the same as last year; there is no electricity fee this year.

Dealers new to the Heisey show and sale are welcome. While the focus is on Heisey glass, all lines of glass may be sold. All vendors must have a valid Ohio vendor's license.

Treasurer's Report by Caleb-Michael Files



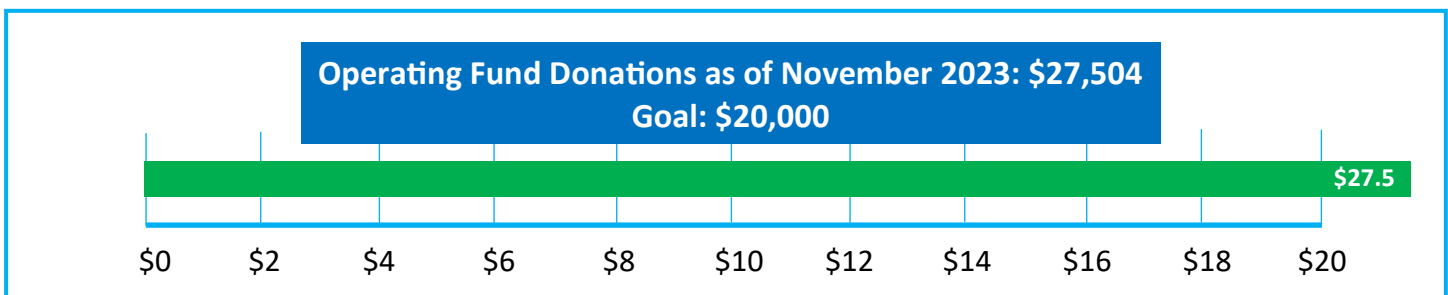
The November financials are not available at the time of this writing, but the museum had another good month for revenue. Gift shop sales remained strong. As you can see by the Operating Fund donations total, the 2023 budgeted goal has been met. Quite an accomplishment with a month still to go. A \$10,000 donation was the highlight of the month. Giving Tuesday donations added another \$1,135.

Our cash position remains good and should sustain us through the beginning of 2024. January and February are traditionally slow months for sales and overall revenue, but bills must still be paid. This includes the museum's insurance premiums, one of largest expenses of the year.

Work on the 2024 budget is underway. Look for it in next month's newsletter.

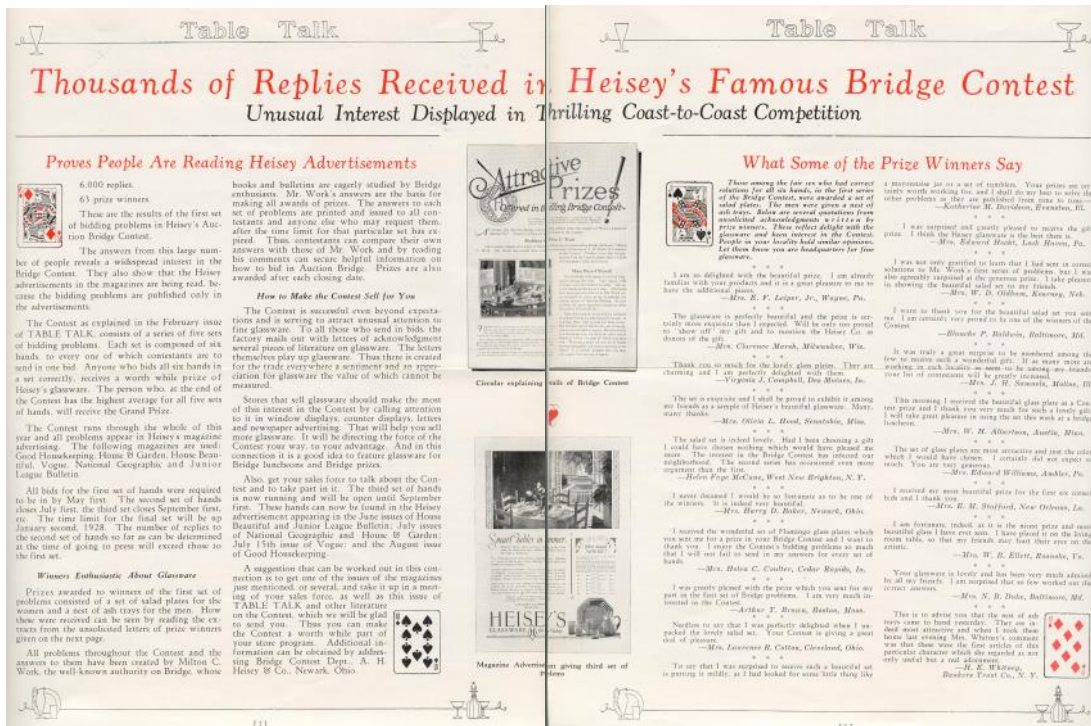


A LOOK BACK at HEISEY HISTORY

No. 353 MEDIUM FLAT PANEL ASH TRAY NEST

In the *Heisey News* of October 2010, you'll find a reprint of the June 1927 issue of *Table Talk*, the Heisey company's newsletter to its dealers. That issue touted the effectiveness of their bridge contest; big letters at the head of the article reminded dealers that the contest "Proves People Are Reading Heisey Advertisements." On the same spread were a number of quotes from prize winners, with an introduction mentioning the prizes. Men and women received different prizes, each woman getting a set of salad plates of an unstated pattern, and each man receiving a "nest of ash trays."

It isn't hard to surmise the pattern of the ash trays given away. In 1927, Heisey was possibly producing only one set of nested ash trays, and that was a three-piece set included in No. 353 Medium Flat Panel. For you users of the Vogel books, you won't find the Medium Flat Panel set there. You can, however, see an illustration of the set in Catalog 102 (ca. 1924). This seems to be the only time they were illustrated. By 1929, they no longer appeared in a price list. I've included photos of the set nested (Fig. 1), and separated (Fig. 2).

Rather than calling these additions to 353 a "nested ash tray set," Heisey labeled them as an "ash tray nest," a slightly unusual turn of phrase. The No. 1186 Yeoman ashtray set is the only other one that might be called nested and only the large ashtray shows up regularly in that set. There are other patterns where ashtrays come in more than one size, but they were not designed to nest. This set clearly was designed to fit together. They are beautifully scaled, not only in width, but also in height. In the set before me, at least, the tops of the larger two perfectly align when nested; the smallest one is slightly raised.

To our eternal frustration, Heisey sometimes threw unlikely companions together under one pattern. Few people confronted with these ash trays for the first time would immediately think, "Oh, those must be Medium Flat Panel." Seasoned collectors must just shrug and mutter, "Whatever." The strongly incurved sides are unique, not only within pattern 353, but across Heisey glass in general. Early researchers sometimes counted sides to guess pattern affinity, but that wouldn't have helped here. These are eight sided, whereas there are plenty of other 353 items with other numbers of sides, none of which resemble these ash trays. Nonetheless, Heisey assigned that number to them and illustrated them with the more usual pieces of the pattern.

These deeply scalloped pieces are not obviously ash trays. There being no rim rests, one merely propped the item being smoked as best one could on the piece. Of course, there are other Heisey ash trays that share this trait. Without the rim rest, one could just as easily think of these as candy dishes, dresser organizers, or pin trays. No doubt some owners did use them for other things.

In Catalog 102, the large tray is shown by itself; the two smaller ones appear only in the nest of trays in a separate illustration. Evidently, Heisey anticipated selling the large one singly more often than either of the smaller sizes and this seems borne out by availability now. While none of them are especially common, one does encounter the large tray by itself now and then; the sets are much harder to find. I have never seen either of the smaller ones offered singly, but that just may be me.

The glass in these ash trays is thinner than in many Heisey pressed items, about 3/16" thick. Compare the thickness of, say, the No. 434 ash tray, a generous 9/16". A nested set of such thick glass would have required much larger individual pieces. The catalog is silent on their bottom treatment. Unsurprisingly for thinner glass, some are fire-polished, such as the single large one illustrated here. However, each one in the nested set shown here is ground and polished on the bottom. Certainly, grinding helps the nested set fit solidly together. Pieces sold singly could do without grinding, and the thinner glass is an incentive to avoid it. Based on the items I've seen, my guess is that the large ones sold singly were usually fire-polished.

Some pieces were decorated by one of the anonymous decorating houses that existed at the time. The nested set illustrated here (Fig. 1, 2) is flashed with a coppery carnival coating (Editor's Note: The set we have in the museum has an amber stain that is then cut to clear with a beautiful floral cutting). The large single (Fig. 3) has a grey cutting of a schoolhouse and tree. The cutting wittily uses the Diamond H as a window of the schoolhouse (Figure 4). In our own collection, at least, this is the only time I've seen an incidental feature of a Heisey piece incorporated into decoration. This piece was found in Canada, but I don't know whether the cutting originated there.

Vital Statistics: Large tray—Width (point to point), 5"; Height, 1 1/4" **Medium tray**—Width: 4 1/4"; Height, 1 1/16"
Small tray—Width, 3 5/8"; Height, 1"

The North Carolina Heisey Study Club will send \$100 to the HCA Endowment Fund in memory of long-term North Carolina member, Sally Abrams.

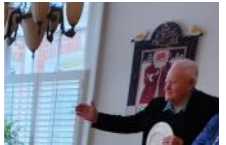
