HCA General Membership Meeting April 13

Heisey Collectors of America will hold its first General Membership Meeting of 2024 on Saturday, April 13 at 9 a.m., at the GMP Local 244 Union Hall, 350 Hudson Ave., Newark. This is immediately prior to the second day of the Spring Benefit Auction. All HCA members are welcome to attend.

In addition to brief remarks and announcements from HCA President Suzanne Parker, the agenda will include an announcement of the slate of candidates for the June election. Additional candidates may be nominated at the meeting.

The union hall opens at 8:30 a.m. for the auction preview. The auction begins at 9:30 a.m.

Candidates Sought for HCA Board of Directors

Members who have energy and, passion for Heisey glass, the National Heisey Glass Museum, and Heisey Collectors of America (HCA), are invited to become a candidate for a seat on the HCA Board of Directors. The Nominating Committee of Charlie Wade, chairperson, Mary Cameron, and Darlene Cochran is now seeking board candidates. Each year, three people are elected to four-year terms on the 12-member board that makes decisions for the organization and the museum. Candidates must be voting members of HCA. Serving on the board is an interesting, challenging, educational, and rewarding experience. Candidates must submit a brief biographical sketch and photo to be published in *Heisey News*. In addition, candidates are encouraged to create a brief video describing their interest in serving on the board and responding to questions submitted by HCA members. Candidate videos are posted on the museum's website.

The deadline to declare a run for the board is April 1 to allow time to publish candidate profiles in the May issue of *Heisey News*. The election will be held in June at the annual convention.

The December 2023 Budget vs Actual statement is available for review. Please see page 6.

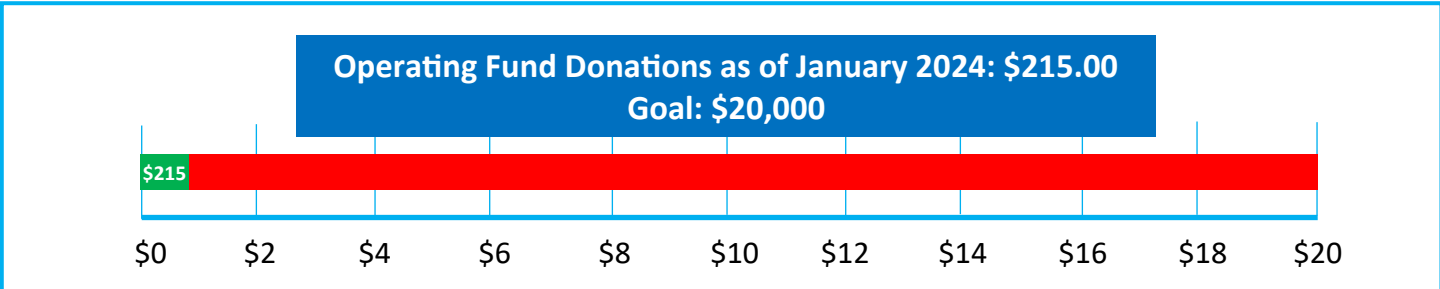
From the revenue side, total Income exceeded budget by \$8,949 on the strength of cash donations and proceeds from the fall auctions. Cash flow remained strong through the end of the year allowing withdrawal of \$30,300 less from the Endowment Fund than budgeted.

On the expenditures side, a number of the line items came in under budget including salaries and wages (\$6,921), lawn/grounds care (\$1,233), and utilities (\$3,742). Funds required was under budget by \$2,722 for the year.

The Endowment Fund rebounded from the December 2022 value of \$5.336 million to a 2023 year-end value of \$6.048 million.

Highlights of the 2024 SPRING AUCTIONS

We have finished cataloging the items for the 2024 Spring HCA Auctions. You should have received your catalog by now (it was sent to all HCA members). On Saturday, April 6 we will have our fifth semi-annual Heisey Heritage Auction, which will be an online only auction using the HiBid platform. New this year, the first session of the Spring Benefit Auction will be held on Sunday, April 7. This online only auction will be devoted to reproductions and other HCA items. On April 12 and 13, we will have the second and third sessions of our Spring Benefit Auction, which will be both in person and online (HiBid). There is something for everyone in these auctions, from the standard production to true rarities that you seldom are given a chance to buy. These auctions provide the perfect chance to start a collection, find the ideal wedding gift, or if you are a long time collector needing to add a special piece to your collection.

HEISEY HERITAGE AUCTION

This auction offers 383 lots with a wide selection of Heisey glass. This auction has 12 punch bowls in a variety of patterns including rarely seen No. 433 Greek Key cupped (Lot 248) and No. 393 Narrow Flute cupped (299). Check your catalog for other items. Our experience with online only auctions has been very positive and all those who have participated were surprised and happy about how easy it was to take part in the event.

ALL-HEISEY SPRING BENEFIT AUCTION - DAY #1 (REPRODUCTIONS)

We will have 121 lots in our new reproductions only online auction. Of special interest are No. 1 Flying Mare in Cobalt by Dalzell for HCA (Lot 13) and the same in Amber made by Imperial (21). This auction also includes 24 items (Lots 62-85) taken from HCA archives that are being sold to raise money to replace the HVAC system at the museum. Included in this grouping is No. 1 Flying Mare in Ice Blue made by Dalzell and marked "Sample" (64) and a No. 101 Tropical Fish in Yellow Mist by Dalzell (65).

ALL-HEISEY SPRING BENEFIT AUCTION - (DAYS #2 AND #3)

This is our traditional online and in person auction. Last fall, we successfully added video to the online part of this auction. I am sure you will find a treasure or two among the 870 lots being offered. The auction abounds in those old standbys of No. 1503 and 5003 Crystalite, 1540 and 5004 Lariat, 1567 and 5067 Plantation, 507 Orchid etch, 515 Heisey Rose etch, and many examples from Heisey's colonial lines. This auction, also, has an abundance of Heisey punch bowls to offer.

Every auction offers a different array of glass being offered. This year we have an abundance of No. 1170 Pleat and Panel in Flamingo (Lots

241-243, 671-687), 1401 Empress in Sahara (226-237, 266-274, 288-298) many with 448 Old Colony etch, and 1567 Plantation (41-48, 275-283, and 639-642). Lots 69 - 78 offer many unusual pieces with 458 Olympiad etch.

Among the old patterns, we have many lots of No. 1200 Cut Block (365-370) including cake salver and cake basket and 325 Pillows (376-384). Lot 371 is a No. 411 Greek Key 15" oblong tray. Certainly, one of the highlights of the auction will be the No. 1255 Pineapple and Fan cake salver in Emerald (390).

Among the many candlesticks offered in this auction is a beautiful pair of No. 7075 Egyptian (647). Others include pairs of No. 105 Pembroke 9" in Moongleam (134) and 7" crystal (829) and a single 108 Three Ring (393). Lot 135 is a dramatic three light No. 18 Classic candelabrum using a #21 cross three light arm.

Barware collectors will not be disappointed. Lot 618 is the rarely seen No. 4225 Cobel Rock and Rye bottle - this one has 462 Fox Chase etch. You seldom see pieces of No. 5044 Constellation, but we have four twelve ounce sodas (600) and three bars (601). Lot 528 is a No. 4054 Coronation ice tub and lot 404 is a set of four No. 2323 Navy 8 ounce sodas with Cobalt bases.

Special pieces in color include No. 3362 Charter Oak high footed compote in Hawthorne (97), an 1184 Yeoman bouillon in Vaseline (111), a 352 Flat Panel humidor in Moongleam (117), and a 364 Pedestal ashtray in Flamingo (700). Also, there is a nice set of No. 1404 Old Sandwich in Sahara (394-400) and 3312 Gayoso in Flamingo (130-132) including 14 finger bowls.

Other interesting pieces include an unusual No. 1485 Saturn footed vase with crimped top (100), a 3802 blown mushroom cover (260), the 1519 Waverly lion trinket box (624), and a 1401 Empress 15" round plate with 5008 Castle Harbor carving (625). Among the many cordials there is a No. 3389 Duquesne with 449 Pompeii etch (120). Lot 833 is a V-1180 Verlys Autumn-Spring Seasons vase.

There are many large lots with a variety of items in them. These are perfect for the beginning collector. But if there is something in the lot you really want, the rest of the items will make good gifts or you can consider donating them back to the museum for our fundraising efforts.

Space limitations prevent me from going on, but as you can see there is plenty for offer in the auction. I hope you will be able to join me and all of your Heisey friends for this great event. I look forward to seeing you April 12 and April 13, as well as online on April 6 and April 7.



A LOOK BACK at HEISEY HISTORY

No. 1776 Kalonyal Pattern

Production of the No. 1776 Kalonyal pattern started in about 1905. This is one of the few early patterns that A. H. Heisey & Company named. This pattern was shown as a new pattern in January 1906. However, an application for a design patent for this pattern was filed on Sept. 24, 1904. It was granted on Nov. 1, 1904 and given design patent no. 37,203. Was the name and pattern number used to commemorate the freedom for the 13 colonies? That is hard to determine. We know that 1906 was only the 130th year since July 4, 1776. That is not one of the big anniversaries that are usually noted. Anyway, the pattern had a very short life as it appeared in only one company price list, Price List #120 circa 1906. Production appears to have been from 1905 to 1907, a span of about three years.

The pattern design is a simple colonial design with its scallops, arches and panels. Except within each panel is a raised jewel-like panel which is the identifying feature for this pattern. It was made in crystal only and you will find most pieces signed with the Diamond H. Occasionally a piece with gold or ruby decoration will turn up.

Kalonyal was a very large pattern. There were 110 items offered in Heisey Price List #120. I have divided these items into two categories, tableware and stemware. There are 85 items in the tableware category and 25 items in the stemware category.

Most of the stemware was offered in two styles, straight or flared. In the tableware category, there was a table set, 22 nappies, 6 plates, 6 jellies, 8 bowls, 6 punch bowls, 6 oils and more. Not listed with the other pieces of 1776 Kalonyal in Price List #120 are a 9" candlestick and three candelabra. Instead, these are listed in the section with other candlesticks and candelabra.

There were not 110 separate molds to produce the items in this pattern. Instead, one mold might be used to produce several variations on the same piece. Thus, both a straight and flared goblet would come from the same mold. Also several variations of nappies might come from one mold.

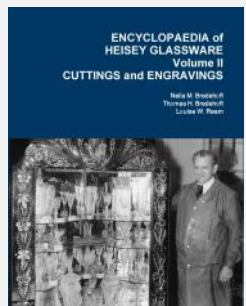

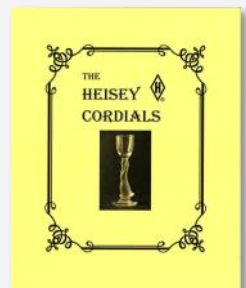

A LOOK BACK at HEISEY HISTORY

No. 427 DAISY and LEAVES PATTERNS

By Joe Lokay (an encore article from the *Heisey News*, December 2009)

The only Heisey Price List to offer pattern No. 427 was #155 (1910), and the only Heisey Catalog to picture pattern 427 was #58 (1911). Three Heisey ads in 1910 mention pattern 427. The production life is estimated as 1909 to 1912.

The pattern design is of typical colonial shapes with flowers and leaves pressed into the glass or, as some describe it, indented into the glass. The surfaces of the flowers and leaves are clear or are chemically frosted to a satin finish. The glass is heavy and of good quality. The pattern was made in crystal only and is signed with the Diamond H. The pattern was named by Vogel.

Soon after the 427 pattern was introduced, a series of vases with the pattern number 440 was also produced. These vases were swung vases and incorporate the same Daisy and Leaves motif. A total of 10 different sizes were produced with a prefix number added to the pattern number to differentiate the height of the vase. These vases only show up in Price List #175 (1913) and Catalog #58.

At a later date, the A.H. Heisey & Company produced a basket as pattern No. 480 with the same Daisy and Leaves design. The production period for the 8" center piece or fruit basket was 1917 to 1923. The basket is signed with the Diamond H. The fruit basket is often seen with the leaves over-frosted.

The A.H. Heisey & Company made other pieces with impressed designs. They are a 8003 Heisey Thistle tumbler, a 435 Juniper tumbler, a Daisy Scroll plate, a 7098 Cut Daisy plate (still a pressed pattern in spite of the name), a 7011 Daffodil bowl, and 7126 Pussy Willow vases.
