To achieve this goal, the Newsletter Committee agreed to follow the latest Associated Press (AP) Stylebook as their guide for HCA news writing. I would like to recognize Jay Goltz and Bari Fauss for their service to HCA as their four-year Board of Director terms end. Their commitment to run for another term will provide continuity to the board as HCA moves forward. David Malick completes the slate of board nominees. The three candidates will be running unopposed.

During the annual membership meeting June 14 voting will be conducted on two amendment proposals: 1) the elimination of the voting membership category, which would allow all HCA members the opportunity to vote and 2) the modification of personnel management practices by allocating responsibilities between the board and the director in a manner more reflective of modern business practices.

All voting members are eligible to vote in the June election during the annual meeting. If you are not able to attend the meeting in person, absentee voting is an option. Contact the museum by calling 740-345-2932 or email membership@heiseymuseum.org to request an absentee ballot. Remember to request your ballot in time for the mail service to get it back to the museum by 4 p.m. ET on Friday, June 7. Late ballots will not be counted.

The Convention and Glass Show Committee is looking forward to seeing you in Newark this month. Check the convention schedule and if you have an extra hour or so, there are always small tasks that need volunteers. Julie Goletz, volunteer coordinator, will gladly match you with a task of your choice.

While visiting the museum please note several maintenance projects recently completed – interior painting, exterior power washing including the awning, and desperately needed carpet cleaning.

The gift shop's debut of the latest items will be an extra incentive for convention attendees. Sale of the new line of floral jewelry, witches' balls ornaments, and the updated *Heisey Candlesticks Candelabra & Lamps* will begin at the start of convention. An exhibit displaying many of the items shown in this revised publication is now open in Gallery Three. Members are offered the opportunity to pre-order this book. Contact the gift shop to place your order.

HCA and Museum Updates



HCA Board of Directors - April 2024 Meeting Highlights

In an effort to improve communication with members, the HCA Board of Directors is sharing brief highlights from board meetings via *Heisey News*.

New book on Heisey candlesticks approved

The board approved the Education and Programs Committee's request to reprint a revised, expanded edition of *Heisey Candlesticks Candelabra & Lamps*, which includes a number of items that have not been published before. The book is now available for pre-order at a cost of \$35 and is expected to be available at the museum by June 15.

Treasurer's Report

The Endowment Fund balance is \$6,299,460.33 as of April 11.

Highlights of Interim Director Jennifer Miller's report to the board

- In an effort to speed production and mailing of *Heisey News*, the board authorized Jennifer to send the newsletter out for printing to Sundance Press. After a two-month trial it will be re-evaluated for cost effectiveness. Sundance Press quoted a price of \$2.40 per copy for printing, addressing and mailing, which is less than the cost of printing at the museum. In addition to cost savings, this would save significant staff time and free staff for other priorities.
- HCA's accountants, Wells and Priest, are scaling back their work in preparation for retirement. They will work with the museum until we find a replacement.

Convention 2024

- Eleven glass dealers have submitted contracts to participate in the Glass Show and Sale.
- Since the glass show will be in downtown Newark this year, a directory of restaurants within easy walking distance of the venue is being created and will be distributed with welcome bags.
- Samples of newly designed jewelry made from real Heisey glass will be available for display and ordering during the convention.

Fundraising

The auction of 24 Heisey reproductions in the April Heisey Heritage Auction earned \$8,442.50 toward a fund for replacing the museum's heating-ventilating-air conditioning (HVAC) systems. In addition, an HCA member sent in a donation specifically for the HVAC system.

Policies

The board approved a new Payments Policy and updates of both the Privacy Policy and Social Media Policy. In addition, the Policies and Procedures Committee shared a draft of the new Employee Handbook that is nearing completion.

Website

With input from HCA members, the Website Committee is developing a new brand identity for the museum, including creation of a new logo and establishment of specific fonts and colors for use not only on the website but also in *Heisey News*, advertisements, signage, and more. It expects to complete this work by the end of May so development of the new website can begin in June.

2024 ALL HEISEY SPRING BENEFIT AUCTION WRAP-UP

The 50th Annual All-Heisey Spring Benefit Auction was a wonderful event for HCA! We held the auction online and in-person. The in-person portion of our two-day auction returned to the GMP Local #244 Union Hall on Friday and Saturday, April 12 and 13. Our auction was well attended with 51 in-person registrants and 108 online registrants. We also had one absentee bidder. We auctioned 870 lots of glass from 38 consignors.

How did we do financially? We grossed \$48,557.56 (glass sales and buyer's premium) and after consignors and expenses are paid, we will net approximately \$10,000. Our average price per lot this year was \$54.92, compared to 2023's average of \$51.30.

On behalf of the HCA board of directors and staff, I would like to thank all the volunteers who worked, starting in January 2024, unpacking, identifying, photographing, cataloging, and repacking the glass and then working three straight days until the auction was concluded. You made this event a success and HCA's largest fundraiser.

Special thanks to Walter Ludwig who graciously lent his time and Heisey expertise whenever asked; to the museum staff, who helped coordinate events in Newark; to Mary Ann Spahr, Lisa Baldus and Karen Taylo, whose work made the event possible; to Jesse Harmon, who set-up and tested the AV equipment; and to Caleb-Michael Files, Eric Tankesley-Clarke, Doug Olson, and Paul Delphia who handled the online portion of the auction.

A big thank you goes to Craig Connelly, Auctioneer, and his cohorts. They not only sell the glass; they keep us entertained while doing so! And to GMP Local #244's own Jimmy Gill who worked to assure the hall was in tip-top shape for the auction.

Thank you to all the consignors who consigned glass to HCA and to all the auction attendees and absentee/online bidders who purchased that wonderful Heisey glass.

Hope to see all of you at the Dave Spahr Fall Select Auction in October.

2024 ONLINE AUCTIONS WRAP-UP

The Spring edition of our Heisey Heritage Auction (HHA) was a success! We held the online only auction on Saturday, April 6. The auction was "well attended" with 92 online registrants. We had 383 lots of glass from six consignors.

The auction grossed \$9,522.90 (glass sales and buyer's premium) and after consignors and expenses are paid, we hope to net approximately \$3,000. Our average price per lot for this auction was \$23.02.

New this year, the Spring Benefit Heisey Reproductions auction was held online on Sunday, April 7. The auction featured 121 lots from 11 consignors. With 87 online bidders, the auction grossed \$16,067.70 (glass sales and buyer's premium).

The HCA Fundraising Committee chose 24 items from the Museum holdback area to kick-start fundraising for the HVAC Fund. The items were "hot," bringing in a "cool" \$8,442.50.

In addition to the HVAC Fund monies, the Spring Benefit Heisey Reproductions auction will net approximately \$2,500.

The cataloging for both of these auctions coincided with that for the Spring Benefit Auction. Many thanks to all the volunteers from the January sessions, and to the April volunteers who arrived in Newark early to help pack the winning bidders' glass. You are the key to the success of our auctions!

Thanks also to the consignors who consigned to the HHA and SBA and to all online bidders who helped make these events successful fundraisers for HCA.

A LOOK BACK at HEISEY HISTORY

No. 360 Winston Ashtray & Match Stand: Handsome In Simplicity

By Eric Tankesley-Clarke (an encore article from the *Heisey News*, April 2012)

Since I started writing about ash trays for *Heisey News*, we have looked at four in the series that starts with 356. Nothing holds them together other than that they are stand-alone items, consecutively numbered, and they were in production at the same time. So, why should No. 360 Winston be any different? Lay out this one along with its predecessors, remove the numbers, and show them off to your non-Heisey friends. (We'll assume they are appreciative friends, not heathens that roll their eyes at your enthusiasm.) Hardly any of your visitors would exclaim, "Ah, there's a set!" No, they would wonder why you picked such a random group. Style certainly isn't the link. Winston's style is so simple that one can hardly put a term to it. It isn't Deco, it isn't Colonial, it isn't Nouveau, it just...is. I suppose if we must pigeon-hole it, Arts & Crafts would be the place to stash this utilitarian piece. Which isn't to say No. 360 Winston isn't handsome. The simplicity *is* its handsomeness.



After several small ash trays, we now have one of some size. Winston is one of the two largest in this series from No. 356 to No. 366, if diameter is the way to measure that. No. 356 White Owl has more glass and No. 361

Irwin is taller, but none in this series take up quite as much real estate on the smoker's table as Winston or its stylistic relative, No. 366 Salem. We'll get to Irwin and Salem in later articles.

Even though it wasn't labeled as such, No. 360 Winston appears to be intended for cigars. It has four large, shallow rests (just like White Owl) that are much too large for a typical cigarette. At first, I quarreled over that name with whoever put it on this ash tray. (It was all in my head, of course. It takes much less energy that way.) Why couldn't this one have been named after a cigar brand instead of a cigarette trade name? Then I considered that maybe someone was thinking of Churchill. Can you picture him without a cigar? I didn't think so. (We didn't usually see the gin that was always near at hand.) I don't really think the researcher had the wartime leader in mind, but it's an easy way out, and now my head is empty. I'll stop here while you write your own joke.

Winston is a basic, functional ash tray. Heisey took such a pragmatic, matter-of-fact approach to this one that style seems to have been a secondary consideration. We have just a simple, shallow bowl, the flanged edge forming a ledge in which to place the four cigar rests, and a box match stand rising up in the center. That's it. No pretensions to sleekness, but no unnecessary frills, either. Kind of like that other Winston. Although he was given to the occasional rhetorical flourish, and he did like those polka-dot bow ties.

There were only two catalog illustrations of this ash tray, one in that early edition of Catalog 109 we rely on for this period of ash trays, and the other in Catalog 211. You can find these pages reproduced in the Bredehoft color era book and in Vogel III. By the time Catalog 212 came out, the illustration had been dropped, and production had probably stopped by then, too. The Catalog 211 illustration, which you can see in the Bredehoft book, page

261, is peculiar in that captions are partially switched. The pattern number is correct, but the description has been reversed with that of the No. 1201 Philip Morris ash tray pictured next to it.

Speaking of reverses, there was a shift in terms between Catalog 109 and Catalog 211. In the earlier catalog, Winston, along with all its relevant compatriots, was called "ash tray and match stand." By the later catalog, they always said "match stand ash tray," switching the order and completely omitting the "and." I'm not sure whether it was a matter of taste or clarity; perhaps some customers thought the earlier phrase meant they'd get two pieces.

When the Bredehoft color era book was published, No. 360 Winston was reported only in crystal, Moongleam, and Flamingo. We now know that it also came in Sahara, not too surprising given Winston's production years of about 1928-1937. It was probably too late for Hawthorne, but Marigold might exist. Other colors are theoretically possible, but not very likely.

I have never seen this ash tray decorated. Anything is possible, of course, but it does seem that most of the ash trays were left alone. We'll see some exceptions shortly, however.

The examples of No. 360 Winston that I have seen (not that I have seen that many) are always marked on top of the match stand, although sometimes obscurely. The bottom of the ash tray is deeply concave beneath the match stand. This leaves a bottom rim that is ground and polished.

All this talk of Winston doesn't make me want a cigar. But it does make me crave a bracing oration with a well-turned phrase. And maybe a tot of that gin.

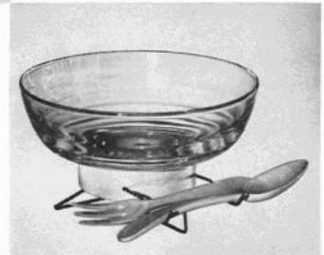

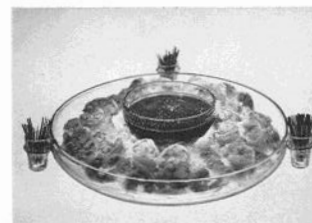

My First Heisey



Our First Heisey *by Doug and Mary Olson*

On a frigid winter evening in December 1975, we stopped into a quaint antique shop just down the hill from our home in St. Paul, Minnesota. We were on the never-ending quest for green tiles to match those missing from our fireplace. We had just stepped inside when we were struck by the beauty of a dozen sparkling stems displayed on a table right inside the front door.



We decided to buy our first Heisey because its Orchid etching reminded us of the pink and white lady's slipper, Minnesota's state flower.

We liked them instantly. The delicate orchids etched on the bowls looked very much like our state flower, the pink and white lady's slipper, and they were somewhat similar in style to the Fostoria water goblets we had received for wedding gifts earlier that year.

Should we buy them or not? What a decision. We certainly didn't need them. We had just begun restoring a large 1883 house that had been converted into seven small apartments. We needed

hammers, prybars, scrapers and screwdrivers much more than we needed a dozen wine glasses. We didn't even drink wine at the time. Every surface on the first floor was littered with scraps of old wallpaper or falling plaster so we had no place to put them.

As we looked around the shop, we were drawn back time and again to those stems. After months of doing nothing in our spare time but the dirty work of taking down badly cracked plaster and poorly constructed partitions, and stripping

layers of paint from kitchen wainscoting, we decided we needed a special treat. We deserved these lovely stems.

For years we knew nothing about them. Then about 30 years after their purchase, Doug's sister told us she thought our stems were Heisey Orchid and we could probably find more Heisey Orchid if we went to the Elegant

Glass Show at the armory in Bloomington that weekend. She was right! The first thing we saw when we walked in the door was a booth with Heisey Orchid. We learned that Heisey made a lot more than stemware. We also had the good fortune of meeting Bob and Bev Heisey, who had a booth at the show to share information about Heisey glass and the Northwoods Heisey Study Club. They invited us to a meeting. We were so impressed with the friendliness of the members and their knowledge of Heisey glass that we joined the club and have been learning ever since. For example, we learned that our stems were actually cocktail glasses - No. 5022 Graceful with No. 507 Orchid etching.

In our first few years of collecting, we bought mostly pieces with Orchid etching, but before long we branched out. We especially like stems with cuttings, candlesticks, mustards, and jugs. We like many of the early patterns of intricate pressed glass, but we also like the streamlined look of Coleport.

We enjoy using our Heisey glass every day, but especially when we entertain. And we enjoy sharing it with others as bridal shower, wedding and anniversary gifts, hostess gifts, and more.

Heisey Collectors Club of Michigan

Seven members gathered for our first meeting of 2024 on April 20 at Tavern 109 in Williamston. Following a treasurer's report and updates to our member roster, we discussed the recent Spring Benefit Auction. Four of our members attended in person and volunteered for both days. We discussed issues with larger lot sizes, lower prices and a shrinking pool of volunteers. Some suggestions for improvements included:

- Moving the heritage online-only auctions to different dates throughout the year to decrease the amount of glass sold at one time.
- Limiting the online-only auctions to smaller items/lots that can be easily shipped to encourage absentee buyers.
- Splitting the Spring auction into two one-day auctions with no more than 400 lots each and moving one of them to the time of convention to make them more manageable and lessen the strain on volunteers.
- Increasing the minimum bid per lot to \$10 which is still a bargain for most lots.
- Eliminating very large lots and lots of very common disparate glass items that could be better sold in the gift shop
- Asking auctioneers to do a better job of describing the lots when they come up for sale. If that is too much to ask of the auctioneers, then perhaps an HCA person can announce the lots before bids are taken.

The benefit auctions are the largest fundraisers for HCA and it is not in the interest of consignors or HCA to flood the market only to realize record low prices.

We also discussed the practice of informing new HCA members about local study clubs. We feel that the question on the HCA membership form about being contacted by the local study club should be eliminated. HCA should inform local study clubs of new members in their area and the study club should be free to contact the new members to see if they are interested in participating in the local study club.

We voted on our annual contribution to HCA which is traditionally made in conjunction with convention. We decided to dedicate \$500 from our study club funds towards the purchase of archival portfolios and labeling equipment for the reorganization of Heisey advertisements in the Archives. This donation is made in memory of our late member, John Deming.

Following lunch we discussed our show-and-tell items which included a Locket on Chain cake saver, oh I mean cake salver; a 3 lb. Recessed Panel candy jar with unknown cutting, a Flamingo oval Old Sandwich floral bowl, a No. 602 light amber tumbler, and two small Beehive plates in Zircon and Sahara.

NEW! Heisey Candlesticks, Candelabra and Lamps

Revised and Expanded Edition

AVAILABLE FOR PREORDERING - MUSEUM DELIVERY EXPECTED BY JUNE

Heisey Candlesticks, Candelabra, and Lamps comes out soon in a brand-new, revised and expanded third edition; a pre-order form is available at the bottom of this page. More than just a reprint, the third edition has the same look and feel of the previous editions, and most of the excellent content from them remains intact. Now I hear you asking, "If that's the case, what's *really* new about this edition?"

The third edition adds around 30 items, most of them never before published anywhere. This includes not only the titular candlesticks, candelabra and lamps, but also bobeches, prisms, epergnettes and other parts. In addition, variations of well-known pieces make their first appearances in the book. Certain other items that were mentioned previously only in passing are now included with their own full-scale entries. This is especially true for several lamps. Nearly 50 new images are included in the new book, including drawings from the archives never published until now.

What about revisions? It was 1984 when Tom Felt, Bob O'Grady, and Jack Metcalf concluded their stellar work on the first edition. The result, with its scholarship and clarity, set a high standard among glass reference books. Forty years have passed, however, and new information has been uncovered. Most significantly, Imperial closed during that time. Original Heisey factory documentation came to the museum archives that was not available to Tom Felt when he did his

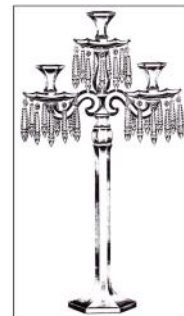
initial research. The upside to that is my own research led to the thrill of discovery with gratifying frequency—a fancy way of saying I was excited to find a lot of new things. In the meantime, longtime Heisey admirers came forward with tantalizing tips and stories that yielded book-worthy finds. Even Tom Felt himself offered a trove of images, several of which found their way into the new edition.

With all that in hand, over the past year I reviewed the entire candlestick book from front to back, page by page, line by line, updating and adding information as I went. Time constraints and technical hurdles, those twin beasts of nearly every project, menaced progress, but they were overcome in the end, thanks to the support of the Education Committee and the museum. There are many individuals who should be acknowledged, and I have mentioned them in the foreword to the third edition. I guess if you want to know who they are, you'll just have to buy the book.

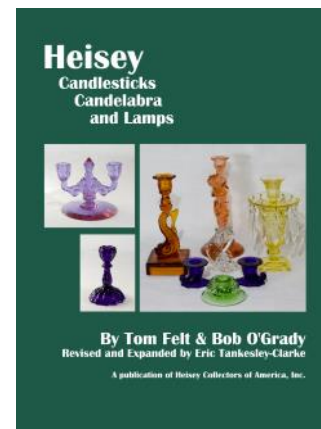
