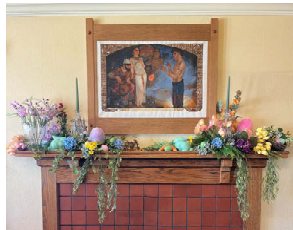

Recently the board has approved a new cabinet display to be crafted by a local cabinet maker to coordinate with our existing cabinets throughout the museum. Once the project is fully funded by cabinet sales, the cabinets will be ordered. I will have more details on this soon. It's going to be an exciting project and beautiful addition to the museum.

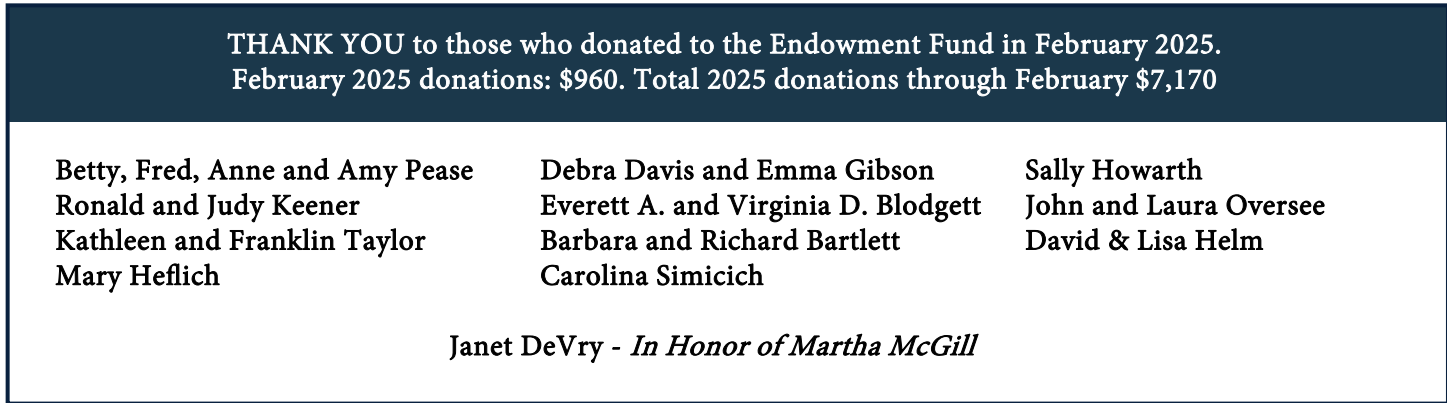
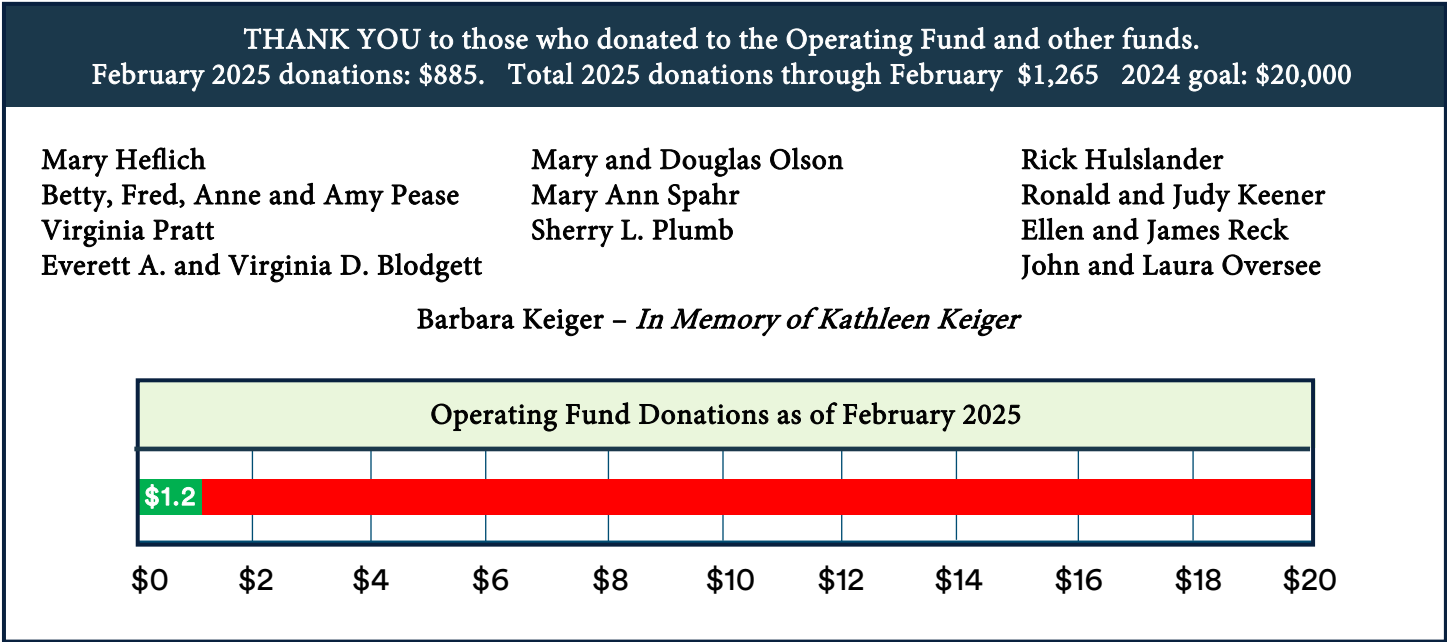
Treasurer's Report by Caleb-Michael Files

Heisey Collectors of America 2025 Election Instructions

Heisey Collectors of America 2025 Election Instructions

All HCA voting members in good standing (dues paid) are eligible to vote at the Annual Meeting, which is held during the convention on June 13. Any voting member who is not attending the Annual Meeting may vote by absentee ballot.

Am I a voting member?

A list of current HCA voting members is published below. If you believe you are a voting member and your name is not on the list, contact the museum at: 740-345-2932.

How can I become a voting member?

A one-time \$25 voting member fee entitles you to vote in HCA elections. An application is included on page 26 of *Heisey News* or you may contact the museum at: 740-345-2932. The deadline for becoming a voting member to vote in this year's election is **Friday, June 6**.

I am not attending the convention. How do I request an absentee ballot?

Absentee ballots will be available beginning Monday, May 12. You may:

- Pick up a ballot at the museum.
- Email a ballot request to Membership@HeiseyMuseum.org.
- Fax your ballot request to 740-345-9638.
- Mail your ballot request to: HCA Absentee Ballot, Heisey Glass Museum, 169 W Church St, Newark, OH 43055.
- Call Membership, 740-345-2932.

The ballot will be mailed to you along with specific instructions for voting. To be counted, **your ballot must be received at the museum by 4 p.m. ET on Friday, June 6**.

Three board seats are open each year. Members completing their four-year terms of office are Caleb-Michael Files, Andy Baldus and Frachele Scott.

Who is running for the board?

The slate of candidates will be announced during the Membership Meeting April 12, 9 a.m., at the GMP Local Union Hall, 350 Hudson Ave, Newark. Candidates may also be nominated from the floor during the meeting. Candidate information will be published in the May issue of *Heisey News* and on the website of the National Heisey Glass Museum.

Heisey Collectors of America 2025 Annual Convention



We are excited to be returning to downtown Newark, Ohio, for our convention activities this year. When planning the events this year the success of consolidating activities was taken into account. All activities are scheduled either at the Heisey Museum, The Skylight, or the convention hotel Doubletree by Hilton, which is offering a special rate of \$110 per night. **Book early as several local hotels are already filling up.**

THURSDAY, JUNE 12, 4-7 p.m. OPENING NIGHT PREMIERE

(4 p.m. - 5 p.m. Convention Registrants only)

The opening convention evening will begin with the premiere glass show at The Skylight followed by **Night at the Museum** at the Heisey Glass Museum. The Skylight was originally the Newark Post Office built in 1916, which later became the Newark City School Administration Offices. It is now a wonderful example of the adaptive reuse of a historic downtown building. The name of the facility originates from the front entrance area of the building, the breathtaking skylight, giving a unique historical elegance to the space.

After visiting the fabulous **Glass Show and Sale**, spend the rest of your evening visiting with friends, perusing the gift shop, and **Meeting the Candidates for the Board of Directors**, while enjoying wonderful hors d'oeuvres and desserts as you stroll through the museum. An Introduction to Heisey's Advertising to the Public—Appendix

The following article is an appendix to the four-part series entitled *An Introduction to Heisey's Advertising to the Public*. It is appearing in the April issue of *Heisey News* in place of the final installment due to space constraints. Part IV concludes the series and will appear in the May issue. This appendix covers Heisey's outdoor advertising. The bulk of Heisey advertising was in the form of printed materials. However, Heisey did employ radio and outdoor advertising in a limited manner.

Radio ads ranging from the late 1920s to the 1940s are discussed in articles written by Micki Wareham in the March 2010 issue of *Heisey News* and by Michael Maher in the August 2015 and January 2016 issues. You can hear some of these radio ads, recreated from surviving scripts, playing in the Heisey Museum thanks to the efforts of Michael and others. Past issues of *Heisey News* are available on the Heisey Museum website.

Heisey contracted with R.C. Maxwell Company of Trenton, New Jersey, the earliest outdoor advertising company in the United States, for its outdoor advertising needs. As mentioned in an article in the November 1995 issue of *Heisey News*, two contracts from 1921 and 1923 survive in the archives. Each contract specified sites for 100 billboards along railroad lines between Buffalo, New York, and Boston, Massachusetts, down through Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, to Atlantic City, New Jersey, to be maintained for \$81 per year each. This large commitment to railroad advertising must have begun earlier since it was mentioned in the October 23, 1913, issue of *Printer's Ink*. In discussing Heisey print advertising that drew the attention of the reader to the Diamond H hallmark on the glass, it is stated that the ad "links up well with the new Heisey painted signs along the railroads of the country."

The other well known Heisey outdoor advertising sign by R.C. Maxwell Company is the one on the Atlantic City Boardwalk dating from the early 1920s. An article by Vicki Meehan that appeared in the June 2002 issue of *Heisey News*, states:

...the archives contain letters and a contract between the Heisey Company and the R. C. Maxwell Company, dated 1927 and 1928. Heisey was still advertising in Atlantic City. At the time, they were using a 30' x 42" sign lit with "15 watt blue daylight type" lamps in the lettering and trademark. The contract states that the signs would be illuminated every night from dusk until midnight and would continue until March 30, 1929. The agreed price for one "Heisey Glassware Spectacular Flashing Electric Sign" facing east, at the corner of Mississippi Avenue and Boardwalk, was \$7,250.00.♦

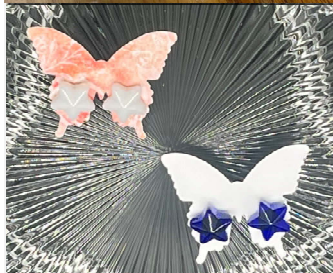
